RESOLUTION NO. 4816

**A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE NOMINATION OF AN FMATS
TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM PROJECT FOR THE
RECONSTRUCTION OF 5TH AVENUE BETWEEN BARNETTE AND
NOBLE STREET**

WHEREAS, 5th Avenue is a part of the City's downtown core and provides access to numerous businesses and public facilities, including the bus transit center and school district administrative center; and

WHEREAS, 5th Avenue is a prime corridor for residents and tourists accessing the Central Business District by vehicle, bicycle, and on foot; and

WHEREAS, the pavement and sidewalks on 5th Avenue have severely deteriorated over the years, the sidewalks are obstructed with utility poles, curb ramps are not ADA-compliant, and the roadway experiences frequent ponding during rain and snowmelt events; and

WHEREAS, reconstruction of 5th Avenue would provide drainage improvements, new ADA-compliant pedestrian facilities, new pavement, shoulders for bicyclists and snow storage, new signage and striping, and possibly utility relocations and/or upgrades; and

WHEREAS, reconstruction of 5th Avenue can be nominated to the FMATS Transportation Improvement Program for consideration of funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council that it supports the nomination of an FMATS Transportation Improvement Program project for the reconstruction of 5th Avenue between Barnette and Noble Streets.




