

## **NOTICE OF CITY COUNCIL ACTION**

PLEASE BE ADVISED that the following action was taken at the Regular City Council Meeting of October 24, 2016:

The following were ***APPROVED/ADOPTED***:

Resolution No. 4764 – A Resolution Supporting Ballot Measure 1 – An Act Allowing Qualified Individuals to Register to Vote When Applying for a Permanent Fund Dividend. Introduced by Council Member Huntington and Mayor Eberhart.

Resolution No. 4765 – A Resolution Approving a Change Order to the Rickert Subdivision Roadway Improvements Project in the Amount of \$296,309 for Partial Remediation of the 30th Avenue Fire Training Center Contamination. Introduced by Mayor Eberhart.

Resolution No. 4766 – A Resolution Supporting Sergeant Allen Brandt and His Family Following the Shooting on October 16, 2016. Introduced by Council Member Cleworth.

The following were ***ADVANCED*** to Regular City Council Meeting of November 7, 2016:

Ordinance No. 6032 – An Ordinance Amending the 2016 Operating and Capital Budgets for the Third Time. Introduced by Mayor Eberhart.

Ordinance No. 6033 – An Ordinance Authorizing a Lease to the Chinook Montessori Charter School to Build a Ski Trail on City Property Adjoining the City Fire Training Center. Introduced by Mayor Eberhart.

The following 2016 Municipal Election Returns were ***CERTIFIED***:

That Jim Matherly was elected to the office of City Mayor for a three-year term ending October 2019; and

That June Rogers was elected to City Council Seat B for a two-year term ending October 2018; and

That Valerie Therrien was elected to City Council Seat C for a three-year term ending October 2019; and

That Jerry Norum was elected to City Council Seat D for a three-year term ending October 2019; and

That Proposition A on the question of whether to amend Home Rule Charter Section 11.3 to change the filing period for declarations of candidacy to “**not more than 90 days and not less than 45 days prior to the election**” to allow the City Council to adopt dates for filing declarations of candidacy that coincide with the Fairbanks North Star Borough’s filing period passed by a vote of **2,701** “yes” votes to **526** “no” votes; and

That Proposition B on the question of whether to amend Home Rule Charter Sections 2.2 and 11.3 to correct the unconstitutional residency requirement from three years to one year and update the language of those sections to make them gender neutral passed by a vote of **2,454** “yes” votes to **795** “no” votes; and

That Proposition C on the question of whether to amend Home Rule Charter Section 8.7 to amend the current 180-day deadline for completion of the annual audit by adding the language, “**The City Council may by resolution extend the deadline for completion of the annual independent audit if the audit cannot be completed within 180 days due to regulatory changes beyond the City’s control**” passed by a vote of **2,615** “yes” votes to **569** “no” votes; and

That Proposition D on the question of allowing the City Council to raise the sales tax rate on marijuana from 5% to 6% to maintain consistency if the Borough Assembly raises its tax rate by the same amount passed by a vote of **2,555** “yes” votes to **720** “no” votes.
