The bikes are valued at around \$8,000 and will be a huge boon to our newest Community Policing effort in downtown Fairbanks. FPD had been looking at the purchase of a gas powered bicycle for use by Community Policing Officer Nathan Werner, who has recently been assigned the core area as the newest community policing district.

The Dentons, who are newly retired, are travelling across the United States and have a son who is an auxiliary police officer in Birmingham, Michigan. The couple decided that the the bikes should go to support law enforcement and they stopped in to make this wonderful donation. The bikes can travel up to 25 mph and can go for substantial distances on just one charge.
