The City Council convened at 7:00 p.m. on the above date, following a 6:00 p.m. Work Session on Public Safety Employee Life Insurance, to conduct a Regular Meeting of the Fairbanks City Council at the City Council Chambers, 800 Cushman Street, Fairbanks, Alaska, with Mayor Jim Matherly presiding and with the following Council Members in attendance:

City Clerk Danyielle Snider read the Mission Statement of the City of Fairbanks.

INVOCATION

The Invocation was given by City Clerk Danyielle Snider.

FLAG SALUTATION

Mayor Matherly asked Ms. Therrien to lead the Flag Salutation.

CITIZENS' COMMENTS ON CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

Mayor Matherly called for Public Testimony and, hearing none, declared Public Testimony closed.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA AND CONSENT AGENDA

Ms. Therrien, seconded by **Mr. Cleworth**, moved to APPROVE the Agenda and Consent Agenda.

Mr. Cleworth pulled Resolution No. 4839 and Ordinance No. 6079 from the Consent Agenda.

Mayor Matherly called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

City Clerk Snider read the Consent Agenda, as Amended, into the record.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS AND REPORT

Mayor Matherly complimented everyone that helped with the Third Thursday events and the Midnight Sun Festival. He stated the festival brought thousands of people to the downtown area. He stated he received notification that Deputy Fire Marshal Kyle Green would be resigning, and his departure would leave a hole in the Fire Department. **Mayor Matherly** asked Chief of Staff Mike Meeks to report on the Firefighters Union (FFU) labor contract ordinance.

Mr. Meeks spoke to the thanked the FFU negotiating team for their professionalism. He listed the wants of the City and the FFU during the negotiating process and discussed how an agreement was reached. He spoke in support of the Council funding the FFU ordinance and stated that it contains an escape clause. He thanked the FFU for working hard to reach an agreement with the City.

Mayor Matherly closed his comments by announcing that his grandmother would soon be turning 100 years old and wished her a happy birthday.

a) Special Reports

<u>Brittany Smart, 907 Terminal Street, Fairbanks</u> – Ms. Smart stated there are two upcoming zoning ordinances that will be before the Borough Assembly relating to brewpubs and urban and agricultural zoning. She invited Council Members to attend the next Assembly meeting.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

a) Ordinance No. 6076 – An Ordinance Amending Fairbanks General Code Section 2-119 Order of Business, to Change the Time Limits for Citizens' Comments. Introduced by Mayor Matherly and Council Members Pruhs, Bagwill, Therrien, Rogers, and Huntington. SECOND READING AND PUBLIC HEARING.

Mr. Pruhs, seconded by Ms. Huntington, moved to ADOPT Ordinance No. 6076.

<u>Frank Turney, 329 6th Avenue, Fairbanks</u> – Mr. Turney stated he did not like that public testimony has been reduced to three minutes. He stated the Mayor plays favorites in giving people extra minutes to speak.

<u>Victor Buberge, P.O. Box 58192, Fairbanks</u> – Mr. Buberge stated if the Council is going to limit public comment they should also limit Council Members' comments. He suggested that the Council open Executive Sessions to the public and have it broadcast on the radio for all to hear.

<u>Darlene Herbert, 906 Woodlawn Road, Fairbanks</u> – Ms. Herbert stated she did not agree with the Council cutting public comment time to three minutes. She stated she thinks the Council will eventually try to get rid of citizens' comments completely, and she does not support that.

<u>Mike Farrell, P.O. Box 72822, Fairbanks</u> – Mr. Farrell stated he did not support reducing the public comment time limit, because sometimes it is not enough time for people to say what they need to say. He stated he thinks the Council is targeting a few citizens who talk all the time, but it has caused them to attack all members of the public by shortening the comment time. He stated the Council should come up with a compromise.

<u>Sandra Nelson, 1209 Warren Street, Fairbanks</u> – Ms. Nelson stated she is a long-time resident who loves Alaska. She questioned why there is so much road work being done in the City when there is such a need for staffing at the police department.

Mayor Matherly informed Ms. Nelson that the current hearing is for comments relevant to Ordinance No. 6076. He stated that she could come up to speak a little later in the meeting.

Hearing no more requests for public comment, **Mayor Matherly** declared Public Testimony closed.

Mr. Cleworth stated he takes time every day at his store to listen to citizens speak about issues that are important to them. He encouraged the Council to consider moving the public comment period back to the beginning of the meeting so citizens would not have to guess what time general citizens' comments will be. He stated three minutes may not be enough time and that citizens should not have to wait until City business is finished to address the Council.

Ms. Huntington stated that while she was serving on the Planning Commission she witnessed the effectiveness of a three-minute time limit. She stated she did not think that everyone needed a five-minute limit because if a person needs more than three minutes, the Council is good at giving extra time.

Mr. Pruhs stated the Council never stifles the free speech of citizens; he stated that they allow plenty of time for citizens to deliver their comments. He stated he would be interested in having citizens' comments earlier in the meeting.

Ms. Rogers agreed that citizens should have a designated time to speak so they can plan their evenings. She stated that at every other hearing/public testimony she participates in around the State, they allow only three minutes no matter the issue. She stated she supports the three-minute time limit because the Council is always willing to allow for more time if needed.

Ms. Therrien stated that she supports the ordinance and that she does not think that it limits free speech. She believes three minutes of public testimony is sufficient.

Mayor Matherly stated the reasons he supports Ordinance No. 6076 and that the ordinance is not aimed at certain speakers. He stated he has been at public meetings when not everyone had an opportunity to speak because of time restrictions; he pointed out that the Council has historically given speakers extra time when they need it.

Mr. Cleworth stated that not everyone gets extra time to speak; he stated it can depend on the Council and Mayor. He stated he is glad others are showing interest in making a specific time for public comment.

Mr. Bagwill stated that he likes the direction the Council is taking on the public comment issue and that he would not mind revisiting public comment in the future.

b) Ordinance No. 6077 – An Ordinance Amending Fairbanks General Code Chapter 22, Elections. Introduced by Council Member Cleworth. SECOND READING AND PUBLIC HEARING.

Mr. Pruhs, seconded by Ms. Huntington, moved to ADOPT Ordinance No. 6077.

Mayor Matherly called for Public Testimony and, hearing none, declared Public Testimony closed.

Mr. Cleworth asked City Clerk Danyielle Snider to speak to the purpose of the ordinance. Ms. Snider explained that the Borough recently made some changes to their election code, and the Cities of Fairbanks and North Pole try to remain consistent with one another on election procedures and codes. She stated that the ordinance incorporates some of the Borough's recent changes. She added that much of the chapter had not been updated in more than two decades and that the ordinance also cleans up some grammar throughout.

NEW BUSINESS

a) Resolution No. 4839 – A Resolution to Extend the Deadline for the December 31, 2017 Audit. Introduced by Mayor Matherly.

Mr. Cleworth, seconded by **Ms. Rogers**, moved to POSTPONE INDEFINITELY Resolution No. 4839.

A ROLL CALL VOTE WAS TAKEN ON THE MOTION TO POSTPONE INDEFINITELY RESOLUTION NO. 4839 AS FOLLOWS:

Mayor Matherly declared the MOTION CARRIED.

b) Ordinance No. 6078 – An Ordinance Amending the 2018 Operating and Capital Budgets for the Second Time. Introduced by Mayor Matherly.

ADVANCED on the CONSENT AGENDA.

c) Ordinance No. 6079 – An Ordinance Ratifying a Labor Agreement Between the City of Fairbanks and the Fairbanks Firefighters Union, IAFF Local 1324. Introduced by Mayor Matherly.

Ms. Therrien, seconded by Ms. Huntington, moved to ADVANCE Ordinance No. 6079.

Mr. Cleworth stated he had a conversation with Mr. Meeks about the FFU contract and that he was stunned that an ordinance was already being introduced. Mr. Cleworth stated the contract was never brought to the Finance Committee where it could be thoroughly discussed. He stated the Council should have been able to discuss the contract in Executive Session before its ratification was introduced in an ordinance. He thanked the Finance Department for all the backup they provided to further understand the impact of the contract. Mr. Cleworth stated he did not support increasing minimum manning from nine to eleven because of the increased cost in overtime. He commented that, from a management point of view, significantly increasing overtime is the least effective way to spend money. He stated a Fire Department Captain spoke to the Council about the amount of overtime being paid at the department and reported that one staff member earned \$33,000 in overtime in 2017. Mr. Cleworth stated that the proposed contract spends every dime of new revenue, with nothing going to the General Fund. He stated the cost of funding the second year of the contract is \$407,933, which is four times the 2019 cost of the AFL-CIO contract; he spoke to the importance of treating all bargaining units the same. Mr. Cleworth stated it is not consistent to have one contract so much richer than the others. He spoke against bonus leave and explained that it became a nightmare for management because there were too many people on leave, and work was not getting done. He stated the proposed contract is not logical, and he is shocked it is already being introduced to the Council. He stated he would not be voting in favor of advancement.

Mr. Pruhs stated he agrees that the contract should have been discussed in Executive Session because of the way it affects the finances of the City. He stated he would like to take the time to study the financial documents that have been presented before making a decision on the contract. **Mr. Pruhs** stated he would like to hold an Executive Session on the contract so he could ask questions about the fiscal impact of the contract. He stated he would like to postpone the ordinance so that all Council Members' questions could be answered before bringing it to a vote.

Ms. Rogers stated that the issue is so important that the Council should be given the time to make an informed decision.

Mr. Bagwill stated he does not want to postpone the contract for too long but that he is okay with having more time to review it.

Ms. Therrien stated she would like to discuss the item at the next Finance Committee meeting.

Ms. Huntington asked if the contract could be discussed in an Executive Session since the ratification ordinance had already been introduced. City Attorney Paul Ewers stated it could not be discussed in Executive Session while an ordinance is pending. **Ms. Huntington** stated she feels that the negotiation teams did a good job working together, but she would accept that other Council Members may not feel the same.

Ms. Therrien stated the ordinance is only up for advancement, so the Council could still discuss it at the next Finance Committee meeting. Mr. Ewers confirmed that it could be discussed at a Finance committee meeting.

Mr. Cleworth again spoke against the contract and indicated that it was unaffordable. He expressed frustration that the ordinance had been introduced.

Ms. Therrien stated it is important to advance the ordinance and reminded the Council that it could be further discussed at the next Finance Committee meeting.

Mayor Matherly reminded the Council that the contract includes an escape clause, so if it becomes unaffordable the Council could choose to non-fund.

CITIZENS' COMMENTS

<u>Sandra Nelson</u> – Ms. Nelson asked whether it is the Council's job to protect the community. She stated that the police are so understaffed that there is no possibility of a safe community. She stated she witnessed her neighbor being beaten, and the police did not come to protect him.

Mayor Matherly asked if a police report was filed on the case she spoke about; Ms. Nelson stated that she hopes it was reported. She stated the Fairbanks Daily News Miner is not transparent and is not reporting crimes.

<u>Frank Turney</u> – Mr. Turney inquired whether the beer garden at the Midnight Sun Festival was regulated by the ABC Board. He stated the marijuana industry is not being treated equally. He stated he would like to see someone on the City Council that does not own a small business. He asked if Mr. Bagwill received a stipend from the City for serving as the Chaplin for the police department; **Mayor Matherly** replied that he does not. Mr. Turney stated the Midnight Sun Festival was well-attended and had lots of vendors. He stated he read an interesting news article about a person being cited for a DUI after leaving the Taphouse.

<u>Victor Buberge</u> – Mr. Buberge stated he was walking around downtown at the Third Thursday event, and he noticed that the Taphouse appears to be a thriving business. He stated he counted 85-95 people in the bar and wondered if that was a fire safety concern. He stated he is thankful that one of the Council Members really cares about the City at heart; he added that other Council Members should get on board. He stated he is happy that the firefighters may start getting drug tested, but he wants the Police Department to do the same. He claimed that he has witnessed a police officer taking drugs.

<u>Darlene Herbert</u> – Ms. Herbert shared a picture of her granddaughter. She explained that her granddaughter had to take an ambulance to the hospital because she was assaulted. Ms. Herbert

reported the police never came to talk to her, and the offender is still walking the streets. She claimed that the same man tried to run over her mom's boyfriend and that the police are protecting him by not doing anything to stop him. Ms. Herbert stated she has never spewed hate toward the police because she is not a cop hater and she does not need retaliation from them. She stated the police contract should not be written by the department because the City cannot afford to pay them what they want. She stated she knows nothing will be done about her granddaughter because of what she just had to say.

Mayor Matherly asked Ms. Herbert where the incident occurred; Ms. Herbert replied that it occurred at Weeks Field. **Mayor Matherly** stated he would look into the incident.

Ms. Rogers thanked Ms. Herbert for sharing her stories and encouraged her to continue to do so.

<u>Mike Farrell</u> – Mr. Farrell stated he agrees with Mr. Cleworth on his views of public comment. He stated he has concerns about the FFU contract because of Mr. Cleworth's comment that he has never seen a contract move forward the way this one did. Mr. Farrell stated his belief that the Mayor should not be on social media as much as he is and that he should focus on the FFU contract. He agreed with Mr. Buberge that what is going on behind closed doors in Executive Sessions is obviously not getting resolved.

CITY CLERK'S REPORT

City Clerk Snider reported that there will be a candidate forum at the Fairbanks North Star Borough Assembly Chambers on Saturday, July 7 starting at 10:00 a.m.

COUNCIL MEMBERS' COMMENTS

Mr. Bagwill thanked everyone for coming to the meeting and for being involved.

Mayor Matherly stated he would be calling Police Chief Eric Jewkes forward for a Staff Report following Council Members' Comments regarding the case Ms. Herbert spoke about.

Ms. Huntington thanked the Council for their understanding with her missing the last Council meeting due to an unexpected death in her family. She requested to be excused from the Regular Council Meeting of July 9, 2018.

Mayor Matherly called for objection to Ms. Huntington's request to be excused on July 9, 2018 and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

Ms. Huntington stated she has loved being a Council Member, but her business has tripled in growth over the past couple years; she shared that she will not be running for office when her term ends. She stated her work takes her out of town so often that it has become difficult to balance family, work, and City Council.

Ms. Rogers thanked everyone for the comments that were made during the meeting both by the Council and the citizens. She stated she looks forward to hearing from Chief Jewkes about the circumstances that Ms. Herbert spoke about.

Ms. Therrien stated she was happy to attend the Juneteenth celebration, a great event with wonderful food. She commented that she is going to miss serving with Ms. Huntington.

Mr. Pruhs stated he already misses Ms. Huntington because they have served together in different capacities for a decade. He stated the City's representative to the Interior Gas Utility (IGU) was not in attendance at the IGU meeting when the vote was taken to purchase Pentex. He stated he attended the Third Thursday street fair, and it was a fun, successful event; he thanked the Mayor for his involvement in making it happen.

Mr. Cleworth thanked City Attorney Paul Ewers for all the work he has done on the Public Safety Employees Association (PSEA) court case. He stated it is not easy having a small business because you are subject to the economic conditions. He commended Ms. Huntington for her business success.

Mayor Matherly called Chief Jewkes forward for a Staff Report regarding the incident reported by Ms. Herbert. Chief Jewkes stated it is not standard operating procedure to speak about cases involving domestic violence allegations but that some of the insinuations were incorrect. He stated the police department responded to the residence with emergency medical services (EMS) personnel, and they accompanied the victim to the hospital.

Ms. Huntington asked if the case was closed. Chief Jewkes replied that the department has done everything they can to move the case forward, but since the victim is not raising the issue he did not want to comment on it much more.

Mr. Cleworth asked if moving the case forward means sending it to the District Attorney's Office; Chief Jewkes replied affirmatively.

CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT

City Attorney Ewers advised that he has not yet received the deed for the Polaris Building from the Borough. He thanked Mr. Cleworth for acknowledging the four years of legal work on the PSEA case.

Ms. Therrien, seconded by **Ms. Huntington**, moved to go into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing PSEA and IBEW Labor Negotiations.

Mayor Matherly called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

Mayor Matherly called for a brief recess.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The City Council met in Executive Session to discuss PSEA and IBEW Labor Negotiations. Direction was given to the negotiating teams, and no action was taken.

Mayor Matherly called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

a) Memo Regarding Change Order Increase to the Fairbanks Water Main Extensions & Service Connections Project (ITB 17-09).

Information: This change order consists of additional water services due to contaminate concentrations over the EPA Health Advisory Level and pursuant to City Ordinance No. 6060, as Amended.

Mayor Matherly stated that the Special Meeting was called because time is of the essence. Chief of Staff Mike Meeks explained that by approving the change order right away, it would save the City \$50,000.

City Engineer Bob Pristash explained that the change order relates to the new water main extension project, and the project completion date has been extended. He stated that since the contract began, there have been six additional properties that have exceeded the health advisory level in the water supply. He stated that of those six properties, one structure is abandoned and one is a business that will require a water main extension. Mr. Pristash explained that the change order would cover the cost for the four remaining connections. He stated that the original change order came in at \$277,150, but he negotiated with the contractor to get the cost reduced to \$229,750. He stated that

the price is only good for a limited period of time, and it should not wait until the next Regular City Council meeting. He spoke to the work to be done so late in the season and indicated that time is of the essence.

Mr. Pruhs, seconded by **Ms. Rogers**, moved to APPROVE the Change Order Increase to the Fairbanks Water Main Extensions & Service Connections Project (ITB 17-09) in the amount of \$229,750.

Ms. Therrien asked about the average cost of each connection. Mr. Pristash replied that the average cost is \$60,000.

Mayor Matherly commented that the City has been very proactive in regard to the water contamination issue.

If the Marijuana Control Board decides to act against your license, under the provisions of AS 44.62.330 - AS 44.62.630 (Administrative Procedures Act) you will receive an Accusation and Notice of your right to an Administrative Hearing.

Note: This is not an accusation or a criminal complaint.

On 7-31-18 during a walk-through of the cultivation facility several areas of inadequate camera coverage were discovered. Primarily, a wooded frame style structure was installed after initial license inspection was blocking the view of one of the main cameras in the vegetative room. Several areas were no longer under unobstructed camera coverage. In the flowering room, the cameras were not enough to cover the entire area due to the height of the flowering plants. Another camera not mounted was pointing in a wrong direction also limiting the coverage. Licensee was requested to install more cameras and contact Enforcement for another walk-through.

This is a violation of: 3 AAC 306.720 (c) Video Surveillance

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING FAIRBANKS GENERAL CODE SECTIONS 2-260 AND 2-261 BY ADDING REAL ASSET INFRASTRUCTURE CLASSIFICATIONS, A HEDGE FUND BETA INVESTMENT TOOL, AND CONSISTENCY IN INDEX LANGUAGE IN THE CITY PERMANENT FUND INVESTMENT POLICY

WHEREAS, the City Council established the investment policy of the City Permanent Fund by terms codified in Fairbanks General Code (FGC) Sections 2-260 and 2-261; and

WHEREAS, the City's Permanent Fund Investment Manager, Alaska Permanent Capital Management (APCM), recommends that Sections 2-260(b) and 2-261(c) be amended to include real asset Infrastructure and benchmarks to soften sensitivities in economic down turns and to stabilize cash flow; and

WHEREAS, APCM recommends that Sections 2-260(b) and 2-261(c) be amended to allow the Investment Manager to use Alternative Betas to help dampen portfolio volatility and/or generate a consistent level of return regardless of market results; and

WHEREAS, the Permanent Fund Review Board supports and recommends these changes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

SECTION 1. Fairbanks General Code Sections 2-260 and 2-261 are hereby amended as follows [new text in **underline bold** font; deleted text in **strikethrough** font]:

Sec. 2-260. - Permanent fund investment policy, procedure and governance.

- (a) *Purpose of fund*. The purpose of the permanent fund is to maximize income for capital and operating expenses of the city and preserve in trust assets of the city for present and future generations of city residents. The principal goal shall be to preserve principal and maintain purchasing power.
- (b) *Investment policy*. The investment policy of the city is to allow only the following investment vehicles.
 - (1) Obligations of or obligations insured or guaranteed by the United States or agencies or instrumentalities of the United States;
 - (2) Bonds or other taxable yield U.S. dollar denominated debt instruments of this state, its agencies, municipalities, any other state, or corporation which at the time of investment have an investment grade rating of a nationally recognized rating agency; if the rating

- of a bond becomes less than investment grade and has a maturity greater than one year, it must be sold in an orderly manner within 90 days of down grading;
- (3) Bank certificates of deposit which are insured or secured as to the payment of principal and interest;
- (4) Corporate obligations of investment grade quality as recognized by a nationally recognized rating organization. If, after purchase, these obligations are downgraded below investment grade, they shall be sold in an orderly manner within 90 days of down grading. In no circumstance shall any bond be purchased after January 1, 2009 with a yield to maturity that exceeds 600 basis points above a comparable duration treasury note/bond at the date of purchase:
- (5) Short term investment funds (STIF) which are limited to investments set forth in subsections (b)(1)-(4) of this section or the Alaska Municipal League Investment Pool as set forth in state statute; and
- (6) Domestic equities, which taken as a whole, attempt to replicate the Standard & Poor's 500 Index, or a substantially similar index, including both mutual funds and exchange traded funds (ETFs):
- (7) International equities, which taken as a whole, attempt to replicate the FTSE Developed ex North America Index or Morgan Stanley Capital International Europe, Australasia and Far East (MSCI EAFE) or a substantially similar index, including both mutual funds and exchange traded funds (ETFs):
- (8) Equities, which taken as a whole, attempt to replicate the universe of domestic realestate investment trusts or a substantially similar index, including both mutual funds and exchange traded funds (ETFs):
- (9) Domestic equities, which taken as a whole, attempt to replicate the S&P 400 MidCap Index, or a substantially similar index, including both mutual funds and exchange traded funds (ETFs):
- (10) Commodities, which taken as a whole, attempt to replicate a broadbased commodity index, such as the Bloomberg Commodity Index <u>or a substantially similar index</u>, including mutual funds, exchange traded funds (ETFs) and exchange traded notes (ETNs);
- (11) Emerging markets equity index funds, which taken as a whole, attempt to replicate the FTSE Emerging Market Index or Morgan Stanley Capital International Emerging Markets Index (MSCI EMERGING) or a substantially similar index, including both mutual funds and (ETFs):

- (12) International Bond index funds, which taken as a whole, attempt to replicate **Bloomberg** Barclays Global Aggregate ex-USD Float Adjusted RIC Capped Index, or a substantially similar index, including both mutual funds and ETFs:
- (13) U.S. Treasury Inflation Protected Securities (TIPS), and/or mutual funds or ETFs which attempt to replicate the **Bloomberg** Barclays Capital U.S. Treasury Inflation Protected Securities Index, or a substantially similar index;
- (14) Domestic equities, which taken as a whole, attempt to replicate the Standard & Poor's SmallCap 600 Index, or a substantially similar index, including both mutual funds and exchange traded funds (ETFs):
- (15) Global infrastructure equities, which taken as a whole, attempt to replicate the STOXX Global Broad Infrastructure Index, or a substantially similar index, including both mutual funds and exchange traded funds (ETFs); and
- (16) Diversifying alternative beta funds, which taken as a whole, attempt to provide systematic exposure to trading strategies that emphasize return sources not found in traditional stock and bond portfolios.
- (c) *Limitations*. The following investment practices are prohibited and shall constitute limitations to fund investments:
 - Options and futures may not be purchased or sold; complex derivatives and complex structured notes which provide for uncertain payment dates and amounts are prohibited without the express, written consent of the city council, as are practices which involve the use of leveraging through reverse repurchase agreements; The City will take a conservative posture on derivative securities in order to maintain a risk averse nature. Since it is anticipated that new derivative products will be created each year, it is not the intention of this document to list specific derivatives that are prohibited from investment, rather it will form a general policy on derivatives. The Fund is prohibited from engaging in short sales and margin transactions or investing in complex derivatives and complex structured notes which provide for uncertain payment dates and amounts are prohibited at the Fund level without the express, written consent of the city council, as are practices which involve the use of leveraging through reverse repurchase agreements. However, the City recognizes that derivatives may be used within products as a portfolio management tool. Derivative use within a product is permissible when used for the purpose of creating or enhancing exposure to an asset class or implementation strategy. Due to the inherent characteristics of derivatives, embedded leverage is permissible when fully collateralized. Direct leverage or borrowing for the purpose of magnifying returns is prohibited. Exposure must be net long at all times;
 - (2) Investments in U.S. dollar denominated obligations of corporations shall be limited to a percentage level as provided for by the city council from time to time. Investment

- grade to be defined by at least one nationally recognized rating service. The investment in the lowest level of investment grade securities is to be limited to no more than 15 percent of the marketable debt securities;
- (3) No investment shall be made in any one individual security or issuer in excess of five percent of the total investment portfolio, measured by market value, except for obligations of the U.S. government and its agencies:
- (4) No investments, cumulatively, shall be made in any one industry in excess of 25 percent of the total investment portfolio except for obligations of the U.S. and its agencies without quarterly disclosure to the Review Board for consideration; and-
- (5) Effective January 1, 2009, no commercial residential mortgaged backed securities (MBS, etc. but not to exclude securities issued by a U.S. government agency) and no further commercial mortgage backed securities (CMBS, etc.) may be purchased.
- (d) *Transactional records*. The board shall maintain on file within the offices of the city, monthly reports which indicate the following:
 - (1) All transactions affecting the investment account, to include purchases and sales of securities, transfers of cash into and out of the account, interest or dividends received by the account; and
 - (2) A listing of all assets held in the investment account, including identification of the security, original purchase price, and current market price.
- (e) Fund performance evaluation. The city council and the board may have an objective performance evaluation of the investment program every year. The board may retain a performance measurement consultant whose contractual purpose will be to provide objective measurement of the performance of investment managers and the portfolio against appropriate indices, universes and/or benchmarks as recommended by the consultant and adopted by the city council and the board. Portfolio performance may be reviewed by the consultant at least semiannually with the city council and the board. Such consultant may not manage in any capacity any portion of the portfolio.
- (f) *Custodian bank*. The city council and the board shall retain a bank custodian to hold all investment cash and securities in the name of the city's permanent fund. The custodian shall render monthly reports to the city council and the board regarding assets held at both book and market values, and individual transactions which have taken place. The bank shall have adequate fidelity insurance. A written contract will be entered into between the city and the custodian bank.
- (g) *Investment managers*. The city council and the board shall retain one or more professional investment managers to design portfolios and invest funds in accordance with the written investment policies adopted by the city council. The investment managers must be registered financial advisers with both the United States Securities and Exchange Commission and the

state and may not serve in any multiple role as investment manager or securities broker custodian. They must agree to serve as a fiduciary to the fund and carry professional liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$5,000,000.00. A written contract must be entered into between the fund and the investment managers.

- (h) *Fiduciary status; conflict of interest*. The board shall be considered to have the responsibility of a fiduciary to the fund and shall be indemnified by the city in any action brought against them collectively or individually while acting in this capacity. No board member may act on behalf of the board in any manner involving the investments of the portfolio or its management pursuant to this policy, except as specifically authorized by the city council in writing.
- (i) *Prudent investor rule*. The city council, the board, the staff, the investment managers and the bank custodians shall exercise the judgment and care under the circumstances then prevailing which an investor of ordinary prudence, discretion and intelligence exercises in the management of large investments entrusted to it, not in regard to speculation, but in regard to the long-term investment of funds considering the probable safety of capital as well as probable income.
- (j) Balance available for appropriation. The city council may only appropriate from the permanent fund as follows: In any fiscal year, an amount not to exceed four percent of the five-year average fund market value, to be computed using the five prior years' year end audited market value, for the city operations, and an additional 0.5 percent solely for capital needs.

Sec. 2-261. - Permanent fund asset allocation plan and performance measurement targets.

- (a) The target for equities is 60 54 percent of the portfolio with an allowable range of 45 40 percent to 75 70 percent. The target for alternatives is 6 percent of the portfolio with an allowable range of 0 percent to 20 percent. The target for fixed income is 40 percent of the portfolio with an allowable range of 25 percent to 55 percent.
- (b) Within the overall guidelines for equities, <u>alternatives</u>, and fixed income investments, the asset allocation targets and ranges are as follows:

- (c) The performance of the investment advisors for the overall portfolio will be measured against the weighted blended target allocation plus 50 basis points (0.5%). Components of the portfolio will be measured as follows:
 - (1) Performance measurement of the Domestic Equity allocation will be measured against the Target Weighting, using the Standard & Poor's 500 or a substantially similar index as the benchmark.
 - (2) Performance measurement for the Mid/Small Cap Equity allocation will be measured against the Target Weighting, using the Standard & Poor's 400 MidCap Index or a substantially similar index as the benchmark.
 - (3) Performance measurement for the International Equity allocation will be measured against the target weighting using the FTSE Developed ex North America Index or Morgan Stanley Capital International Europe, Australasia and Far East (MSCI EAFE) or a substantially similar index for the benchmark.
 - (4) Performance measurement for the real estate allocation will be measured against the target weighting using the Standard & Poor's REIT Index <u>or a substantially similar index</u> for the benchmark.
 - (5) Performance measurement for the U.S. Bond allocation will be measured against the target weighting using the **Bloomberg** Barclays Capital U.S. Aggregate Bond Index or a substantially similar index for the benchmark. Duration should be maintained between 80 percent and 120 percent of the duration of the benchmark.
 - (6) Performance measurement of the commodity allocation will be measured against the target weighting, using a broad based index such as the Bloomberg Commodity Index or a substantially similar index, selected by the permanent fund review board.

- (7) Performance measurement for the emerging markets equity allocation will be measured against the target weighting using the FTSE Emerging Market Index or Morgan Stanley Capital International Emerging Markets Index (MSCI EMERGING) or a substantially similar index for the benchmark.
- (8) Performance measurement for the international bond allocation will be measured against the target weighting using the **Bloomberg** Barclays Global Aggregate ex-USD Float Adjusted RIC Capped Index or a substantially similar index.
- (9) Performance measurement for the U.S. Treasury Inflation Protected Securities (TIPS) allocation will be measured against the target weighting using the **Bloomberg** Barclays Capital U.S. Treasury Inflation Protected Securities Index or a substantially similar index.
- (10) Performance measurement for the small cap equity allocation will be measured against the target weighting, using the Standard & Poor's SmallCap 600 Index or a substantially similar index as the benchmark.
- (11) Performance measurement for the cash/1—3 month treasuries will be measured against the target weighting, using the Citigroup 3-Month Treasury Bill Index <u>or a substantially similar index</u> as the benchmark.
- (12) Performance measurement for the infrastructure allocation will be measured against the target weighting, using the STOXX Global Broad Infrastructure Index or a substantially similar index as the benchmark.
- (13) Performance measurement for the alternative beta allocation will be measured against a commonly accepted performance benchmark that adequately measures the alternative strategy and is unambiguous, measurable, and specified in advance.

Amendment to the Existing PSEA Contract

City of Fairbanks (City)

And

Public Safety Employees Association (PSEA)

The City and PSEA entered into a collective bargaining agreement (CBA), effective 2011-2013. The City and PSEA have agreed to amend the current contract <u>Section 9.2 Health</u> Benefits:

Section 9.2 Health Benefits, will amend the following:

Section 9.2 Health Benefits.

- A. For each member, the City shall contribute \$1,000 per month to PSEA's Health and Welfare Trust Plan effective 1/1/2011. Effective 1/1/2012, this contribution shall increase to \$1,050 per month and effective 1/1/2013 this contribution shall increase to \$1,100 per month. Effective 8/16/12, this contribution shall increase to \$1,040 per month. (*Updated 12/23/11*)
- B. The City agrees to maintain a pre-tax deduction account at the election of each employee as allowed under federal law for the purpose of setting aside monies for the purpose of subsidizing uncovered costs of medical insurance. The City will contribute \$1200.00 per year per employee, pro-rated monthly, to a pre-tax IRS section 125 plan to be used for qualified expenses (un-reimbursed health care, employee premium costs, child care, etc.).

Changes outside contract language:

In January 2017 the amount of \$1,040.00 was increased 4% to \$1,081.60 which is reflected in the current budget.

To:

Section 9.2 Health Benefits

A. Beginning 11/01/2018 the City shall contribute \$1,332.00 per month for each member, to the Association's applicable insurance plan.

Beginning 01/01/2019 the City shall contribute \$1432.00 per month for each member, to the Association's applicable insurance plan.

B. The City will offer an employee-funded IRS Section 125 plan.

The City's current \$100.00 contribution to the 125 plan, as outlined in section 9.2.B, will be discontinued December 31st 2018.
