FAIRBANKS CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING MINUTES, FEBRUARY 10, 2020 FAIRBANKS CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS 800 CUSHMAN STREET, FAIRBANKS, ALASKA

The City Council convened at 6:30 p.m. on the above date, following a 5:00 p.m. Work Session for Strategic Planning on City Services & Revenues, to conduct a Regular Meeting of the Fairbanks City Council at the City Council Chambers, 800 Cushman Street, Fairbanks, Alaska, with Mayor Jim Matherly presiding and with the following Council Members in attendance:

City Clerk Snider read the Mission Statement of the City of Fairbanks.

INVOCATION

The Invocation was given by City Clerk Snider.

FLAG SALUTATION

Mayor Matherly asked everyone to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance.

CITIZENS' COMMENTS

<u>Sue Sprinkle</u>, 211 5th Avenue, Fairbanks – Ms. Sprinkle provided the Council with an update on a couple of properties in her neighborhood. She stated that a local business was robbed, and it is likely related to the property in her neighborhood. She shared that there was another break-in at the abandoned house near her property. She asked what would happen to the dilapidated house that recently burned down and expressed concern that it may become a problem property if it remains until the following summer. She stated she is excited about the idea of a nuisance property committee, and she would like to hear from the Council about what they would like to see happen.

Mr. Cleworth asked when the property Ms. Sprinkle referred to burned. Ms. Sprinkle stated that she believes the house burned down in January.

Max Plichta, 1763 Iniakuk Road, Fairbanks – Mr. Plichta addressed the Council about the issue of climate change. He urged the City Council to study the effects of global warming on Earth's climate and gave suggestions as to how to go about addressing issues.

<u>Julie Jones, 1442 Luke Street, Fairbanks</u> – Ms. Jones stated she is speaking on behalf of the non-profit organization, Festival Fairbanks, and she spoke about Festival Fairbanks' shared interest in nuisance properties. She expressed support for the renewal of the Mecca Bar liquor license. She stated that the Golden Heart Plaza has had many police calls recently, and it is not simply one particular area of downtown that is the problem. She stated it is up to all citizens to put their heads together to come up with a solution to these kinds of chronic problems.

<u>Victor Buberge, P.O. Box 58192, Fairbanks</u> – Mr. Buberge stated he is sad about the recent deaths in the downtown area due to exposure; he shared that one of the men was a friend of his. He asked the Council to address what is really going on with the Polaris Building and how they intend to profit off the property. He suggested that the City is in with Explore Fairbanks and that it is a backdoor deal to acquire the building. Mr. Buberge stated he read that a \$200 million project was under consideration to put a performing arts center in that location; he commented that a certain Council member would be happy to chair that committee. He stated the City levies alcohol and bed tax but is keeping a secret as to what is going on with the Polaris project. He stated the building has been there for years and insinuated that Explore Fairbanks has something to hide. He stated that someone is going to make a lot of money.

<u>David van den Berg, 332 Slater Drive, Fairbanks</u> – Mr. van den Berg stated he is attending as the Director of the Downtown Association (DTA). He stated that the Borough has stalled completely in what could be done to help the downtown core area. He stated the City has the power to regulate on- and off-street parking, and he spoke to the importance of parking services. He stated Ordinance No. 5723 gave the authority over parking services to the Parking Authority and asked what kind of authority they actually have.

Michael Farrell, P.O. Box 61004, Fairbanks – Mr. Farrell stated he listened to the last meeting, and he thought it was inappropriate for the Mayor to tell citizens at a Council Meeting what is or is not appropriate be discussed; he stated that he would like a list of items that are not allowed to be spoken about. He stated the Mayor met someone with hostility at the last Council Meeting, and it was not appropriate. Mr. Farrell explained to the Mayor that if he intends to move up in politics he has to allow people to speak. He stated citizens should be allowed to ask any questions they wish about a huge project like the Polaris Building. He stated the public is asking about the plan, and they should be heard. He stated he saw a 300-page document relating to the project; he stated if that much has been invested in planning, there is likely something going on behind the scenes.

<u>David Hayden, 147 3rd Avenue, Fairbanks</u> – Mr. Hayden stated he lives in the neighborhood near American Tire and Auto and the Clay Street Cemetery; he expressed support for rewriting the local nuisance ordinance. He stated he has read Anchorage's ordinance, and the City could adopt something similar. Mr. Hayden stated there is a house that was a nuisance all summer, but it never came up on the City's radar until it recently burned down. He stated it should not take a crisis in

order for the City to pay attention to the area, and he mentioned the local business that was recently robbed. He stated he calls the police, makes reports, and has been talking about the problems since October, but nothing has been done to fix the problem.

Mr. Cleworth asked Mr. Hayden if he read the whole Anchorage ordinance and whether their ordinance is codified or just a policy. Mr. Hayden stated that the Anchorage ordinance is codified.

Hearing no more requests for comment, **Mayor Matherly** declared Citizens' Comments closed.

Ms. Kun, seconded by **Mr. Gibson**, moved to consider the Mecca Bar Liquor License Application for Renewal separately from other renewal applications.

Mayor Matherly called for objection to considering the Mecca Bar Liquor License Application for renewal separately from other renewal applications, and hearing none, so ORDERED.

Mr. Pruhs, seconded by **Ms. Kun**, moved to consider The Antler Room Liquor License Application for renewal separately from other renewal applications.

Mr. Pruhs declared a conflict of interest as a member of the Elk's Lodge and stated he would like to abstain from voting on The Antler Room liquor license renewal application. **Ms. Therrien** stated she is also an Elks Lodge member and may have a conflict.

City Attorney Paul Ewers advised that if Council Members are only general members of the Elks Lodge, it would not preclude them from voting on the liquor license renewal.

Mr. Pruhs stated he would be abstaining from the vote. **Mayor Matherly** advised Mr. Pruhs that there was no conflict and that he could vote. **Mr. Gibson** stated that he is also an Elks member.

Mayor Matherly stated that Attorney Ewers' advice stands, and if Council Members are only general members of the organization and are not benefiting monetarily, there is no conflict.

Mayor Matherly called for objection to considering The Antler Room Liquor License Application for renewal separately from other renewal applications, and hearing none, so ORDERED.

Mr. Pruhs, seconded by **Ms. Therrien**, moved to WAIVE PROTEST on the HooDoo Brewing Company, Food Factory, Brewster's, and Red Lantern Steak & Spirits Liquor License Applications for Renewal.

Mayor Matherly called for public comment and, hearing none, declared Public Testimony closed.

Mayor Matherly declared the MOTION CARRIED.

Ms. Kun, seconded by **Mr. Pruhs**, moved to WAIVE PROTEST on The Antler Room Liquor License Application for Renewal.

Mayor Matherly called for public comment and, hearing none, declared Public Testimony closed.

A ROLL CALL VOTE WAS TAKEN ON THE MOTION TO WAIVE PROTEST ON THE ANTLER ROOM LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL AS FOLLOWS:

Mayor Matherly declared the MOTION CARRIED.

Ms. Therrien, seconded by **Mr. Pruhs**, moved to WAIVE PROTEST on the Mecca Bar Liquor License Application for Renewal.

Serena McCormick, P.O. Box 753171, Fairbanks – Ms. McCormick stated she is a bartender at the Mecca Bar; she stated she attends college classes during the day and works mostly at night. She stated she attended a Council Meeting two years ago for the liquor license renewal, and she invited Council Members to visit the bar for a tour; she stated that only two members have come in. She stated there is a problem in Fairbanks, but it is a community issue – not a license issue. Ms. McCormick stated there are times when a person is drunk and instead of leaving them lying half naked outside in subzero temperatures waiting for the service patrol to arrive, she allows them to warm up inside until help arrives. She stated two people have recently frozen to death, and she does not want that to continue to happen. She stated the Mecca Bar is the oldest bar in Fairbanks, and it has been at its original location for 74 years. She stated she is happy to be part of Fairbanks history.

<u>Julie Jones</u> – Ms. Jones stated the Mecca Bar is a great, downtown historic place to visit and is also a gaming location for Festival Fairbanks. She stated the Mecca Bar generates nearly \$70,000 for Festival Fairbanks, and they are hoping to use those funds to purchase cameras with recording capability at the Golden Heart Plaza. She stated that cameras should help the Fairbanks Police Department (FPD) and Public Works identify who is doing the damage at the Golden Heart Plaza. She stated they used to have webcams downtown that the police had access to, and it would be nice to have tools like that to combat the community problem that is only getting worse.

Tiffany Ayers, 2576 Linda Lane, Fairbanks – Ms. Ayers stated she is the owner of River City Café in the Co-op Plaza and shared that, including the Mecca Bar, there are nine establishments that serve alcohol on 2nd Avenue. She stated people who stumble out of the Mecca Bar come to her shop and disrupt her patrons, and she caters to tourists. She stated she employs young people who are still in high school, and her employees should not have to deal with drunk patrons from the Mecca Bar. Ms. Ayers stated a 17-year-old employee had to deal with a drunk individual who came into her establishment and took off all his clothes before passing out in the middle of the restaurant. She stated it is worse for people whose businesses within close proximity to the Mecca Bar, and she feels badly for them. She stated it was not as bad when her shop was just a little further down the street at 523 2nd Avenue. Ms. Ayers stated her boyfriend will not even come down to visit at her business because the people outside the Mecca Bar ask for rides, and when he has refused, they have told him they would steal his car. She stated she deals with the problems, but she is tired of dealing with the harassment of Mecca Bar patrons.

<u>Larry Hackenmiller</u>, 518 Farmers Loop Road, Fairbanks – Mr. Hackenmiller stated he sees people getting kicked out of the Mecca Bar and stated it is illegal to serve alcohol to an intoxicated person. He stated the employees at the Mecca Bar are diligent about kicking out people who come into the establishment already intoxicated. He stated Jodi has worked tirelessly and in harmony with the FPD to keep her business on the up-and-up. Mr. Hackenmiller stated that when the City came up with the alcohol tax it was intended to help deal with the community problem, but the revenue is not being used for that purpose. He spoke in support of the Mecca Bar liquor license.

<u>Aly Rasley, 1161 Shypoke Drive, Fairbanks</u> – Ms. Rasley stated she was a magistrate for 28 years. She stated she is familiar with the alcohol problem in the community because she was the

arraignment officer for many cases involving alcohol. She stated that cameras in the downtown core area will help combat the issue better than shutting down the Mecca Bar. She stated cameras would aid a short-staffed police department. Ms. Rasley stated the problem is with people buying alcohol at liquor stores and drinking it in the GHP, the Catholic parking lot, and other areas. She stated this is a community issue that is not caused by the Mecca Bar liquor license.

Ms. Therrien asked about a task force that Ms. Rasley was a part of. Ms. Rasley stated that when the City and mental health professionals work together, a lot can be done. She stated the program was successful because there was a lot of cooperation between entities; she indicated that is not how things are working anymore.

<u>Kelly Locker</u>, 129 1st Avenue, Fairbanks – Ms. Locker spoke in support of the Mecca Bar. She stated it has been a great place to work for 15 years, and she has never felt unsafe there. She stated people who get kicked out are intoxicated upon arrival, but when it is -40 degrees, it is wrong to put an intoxicated person who cannot stand onto the street. She questioned what they are supposed to do when the Emergency Service Patrol (ESP) will not take them and 9-1-1 will not respond.

Robert Fox, 843 5th Avenue, Fairbanks – Mr. Fox stated he works on 2nd Avenue, and he will not blame the Mecca Bar for the problems; he stated, however, that the business is a magnet for problems downtown. He stated often times he escorts people down the street who do not feel comfortable walking past the establishment alone. Mr. Fox stated there is often vomit and urine along the street that is not cleaned up. He stated that his business takes care of their little area, but they do not clean up other areas down the street. He stated the police will not respond because there is no money in it for the City. He stated he has had to get face-to-face with patrons from the Mecca Bar. He commented that the City should either shut the bar down or do what is needed to deal with the problems. He stated that patrons sometimes scare tourists, and the problem should be addressed by having a police presence downtown.

Kemp Lankford, 929 Cranberry Ridge, Fairbanks – Mr. Lankford stated he owns Aurora Apothecary next to the Mecca Bar. He stated alcoholism is a real problem, and it would be wrong for him to blame one bar for all of the problems. He reaffirmed that it is a community issue and that the City of Fairbanks is too good for this. He commented that revoking the liquor license will not solve the problem. He stated he does not believe the camera project is ever going to come to fruition and suggested that a mental health court might be a better way to combat the problem.

<u>Rina Kowalski, Fairbanks</u> – Ms. Kowalski stated the Mecca Bar has a terrible reputation for overserving people and a terrible staff. She spoke to a situation that occurred at the Mecca Bar when Ms. Locker was working that made her and her partner so uncomfortable they had to leave. She stated she has seen Ms. Locker overserve patrons to the point that they cannot walk, and that is wrong. She stated that the business is a nuisance to the community and asked the Council not to support renewal of the liquor license.

<u>Victor Buberge</u> – Mr. Buberge stated people confront him outside the Mecca Bar and in front of the Co-op Plaza, but in the old days there were always officers on patrol. He stated there used to be better control, and it is wrong to fault business owners for a problem much bigger that themselves.

<u>Jodi Blakley, 2000 Patricia Court. Fairbanks</u> – Ms. Blakley stated she has worked very hard to follow rules and make the Mecca Bar a welcoming place. She stated they do not allow intoxicated individuals in, and the only exception is when it is freezing outside, and a person is passing out on the street. She stated they had a customer who died from exposure. She stated the cameras are paid for and will be installed in the near future.

Mr. Gibson asked Ms. Blakley how long she had owned the bar; Ms. Blakley stated 13 years.

Ms. Therrien asked Ms. Blakley for her thoughts about the accusation that her bartenders overserve patrons. Ms. Blakley stated that it if happens, it happens rarely. She stated her staff takes care of Mecca Bar customers. **Ms. Therrien** asked whether the list of those who are not allowed in the bar grows each year. Ms. Blakely stated that once a person is on the list, their name does not come off. She stated, however, that once a year they go through the list and cross off names of those who have passed away.

Ms. Kun asked Ms. Blakley if she could hire a security guard. Ms. Blakley stated that a security guard would not be able to enforce anything outside, so their only function would be to do ID checks; she stated that would be redundant because the bartenders already do that.

Ms. Rogers asked Ms. Blakley what she meant when she said police officers do not come to 2nd Avenue anymore. Ms. Blakley stated that the police used to do regular walk-throughs at the bar, but they have gotten away from that. She stated she would be happy to have officers park in front of her bar while they do paperwork, just to establish a presence.

<u>Travis Davis, P.O. Box 58265, Fairbanks</u> – Mr. Davis stated that in all his years in Fairbanks he has never heard of a major shooting or stabbing at the Mecca Bar. He spoke in support of the liquor license renewal.

<u>David van den Berg</u> – Mr. van den Berg stated the Mecca Bar puts the DTA in an awkward spot because there is definitely a social problem, but there are also problems with the establishment. He stated it negatively affects the businesses downtown.

<u>Debra Babcock</u>, P.O. Box 55764, North Pole – Ms. Babcock stated her son was a chronically inebriated person who was a Mecca Bar customer; she shared that he passed away. She stated the Mecca is giving money to the DTA, and it is helping increase alcohol abuse. She stated it hurt to hear Ms. Blakley say that they go through their list and cross off those who have died.

Hearing no more requests for comment, Mayor Matherly declared Public Testimony closed.

Mayor Matherly pointed out that there were no department-recommended protests for the license.

Mr. Cleworth stated he owns the building next to the Mecca Bar, and he has a conflict of interest. He stated he would abstain from discussion and the vote on the Mecca Bar liquor license renewal.

Ms. Rogers asked Police Chief Reeder to provide a staff report on callouts. Chief Reeder stated a lot of calls on the list are not related to the license, but the address was used to direct police to the incident location. She stated that sometimes incidents are on the street or in parking lots.

Mayor Matherly spoke to the limited resources at the City – especially at FPD. Chief Reeder stated there are now eight vacancies in her department, and five officers intend to retire soon. She stated they have been trying to hire officers, but it is difficult to find qualified applicants. She stated FPD officers are call-driven and have no unobligated time.

Mr. Gibson asked about the 16 calls for service referenced by Chief Reeder. Chief Reeder stated she went through the entire list for the Mecca Bar, but only 14 of the calls were cause for concern. She stated the location is often used as a reference point for calls for service, but calls may not be related to the license.

Ms. Therrien asked if it would be possible to have a bigger police presence downtown. Chief Reeder stated there are a lot of neighborhoods that would like to have more police presence, but it is not feasible at this time. She stated that she would like to have a couple officers on bicycle patrol downtown in the summer, but with staffing levels as they are now, it is not feasible.

Ms. Rogers stated it is going to take everyone working together to find solution to the problems facing the community. She stated a lot of light has been shone on community issues throughout the meeting, and they are problems that are not easily fixed. She stated she was encouraged to hear people agree that it is a community issue; she stated she will be voting to support the liquor license renewal, and she thanked all those who attended and spoke about the issue.

Ms. Therrien stated that the chronic inebriate issue needs to be addressed in the goals of the City and that taking away the Mecca Bar is not going to solve the problem. She stated that the problem would just shift to another establishment. She stated she would like to see more of a police presence in the downtown area during the summer, but the bigger topic that needs to be addressed is the issue of chronic inebriates.

Mayor Matherly stated he has been working with the Chief of Staff on public inebriation and loitering issues because he does not want the problem to deter tourism. He stated his heart goes out to Ms. Babcock; he stated it is a sad statistic that Alaskans are not proud of. He stated alcohol is a major problem in Alaska, and he is working on a few different solutions at the ground level. He stated he will work with Chief Reeder on regulation and enforcement.

Ms. Kun stated she is a substance abuse counselor, and there is a need for the City to admit there is a problem. She stated she used to patronize the Mecca Bar when she was a care worker because one of her clients liked to go to the bar. She stated overserving is a very real issue, and she has received calls from citizens who want the Mecca Bar to be shut down. She stated that when she was running for office, a gentleman asked her to have the bar shut down. She stated that the man said he is a relapsing drug addict, and he can go to the Mecca Bar anytime and pick up any drug of his choice. She stated she would not vote in support of the liquor license renewal.

Mr. Pruhs stated there were some disparaging comments made about a fine person who works at the Mecca Bar, and he does not appreciate hearing such things about a good person.

Mr. Gibson stated he understands the downtown has issues, but it is the Council's job to address those issues – not the license holder's job.

A ROLL CALL VOTE WAS TAKEN ON THE MOTION TO WAIVE PROTEST ON THE MECCA BAR LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL AS FOLLOWS:

Mayor Matherly declared the MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Matherly called for a brief recess. The meeting resumed following the short recess.

Mayor Matherly called for public comment and, hearing none, declared Public Testimony closed.

Mayor Matherly declared the MOTION CARRIED.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS AND REPORT

Mayor Matherly stated that Jo Scott has been in his thoughts because her husband Dick passed away recently. He spoke to the events he attended since the last City Council Meeting.

COUNCIL MEMBERS' COMMENTS

Ms. Therrien stated she looks forward to working on the nuisance property ordinance and shared that it is time for the Council to find a resolution to that issue.

Mr. Gibson thanked Mr. Plichta for attending and speaking to the Council about climate change, and he encouraged him to continue his work. He shared some things the City is doing to reduce its carbon footprint and energy usage.

Mr. Pruhs encouraged Mr. Buberge and Mr. Farrell to stay so he could address their comments later on in the meeting when he provides an update on the Polaris Work Group.

Ms. Rogers echoed Mr. Gibson's comments and stated the City could put climate change information on the City website.

Mr. Cleworth stated that LED lighting has saved the City 50% on their light bill; he stated the City does its best to use as few resources as possible. He addressed Mr. Buberge's earlier comments and shared that the Council approved a resolution within the past six months addressing what might happen with the Polaris Building property.

Ms. Rogers applauded Mr. Cleworth his efforts in the historical restoration of City Hall.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

a) The Fairbanks City Council addressed the following Liquor License Application for Renewal. POSTPONED from the Regular Meeting of January 27, 2020; public hearing was held at that time.

At the Regular Meeting of January 27, 2020, Ms. Kun, seconded by Mr. Gibson, moved to PROTEST the Thrifty Liquors liquor license application for renewal. The motion to protest remained on the floor.

The Council requested to hear from the liquor license applicant.

Rudy Gavora, P.O. Box 70021, Fairbanks – Mr. Gavora stated he has never had to come before the Council for an existing liquor license – only when there was a new license or the transfer of a license. He stated he is somewhat offended. He stated the City has no problem taking millions of dollars in tax revenue from the location. He stated that they have been operating in Alaska for 60 years, and they have had package store and beverage dispensary licenses throughout the state. He stated they have always been a responsible retailer and have never lost the ability to sell at any of their stores, putting their record above any other chain in the State of Alaska. Mr. Gavora stated they have never gone through these kinds of proceedings with any other municipality. He stated his employees are trained through the Training for Alcohol Professionals (TAPS) Program. He stated that the Council is asking \$15-an-hour clerks to do law enforcement work. He explained that their job is to control liquor sales at the point of sale under the regulations of the State of Alaska Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) Board. He stated his employees do a great job, but they cannot control consumptions once a person leaves the business. He stated they sell to mostly sober people, and they have internal incident reports and "no-sell" lists. Mr. Gavora stated the 95 calls reported to the Council cannot be quantified as having direct correlation with the liquor store; he stated he spoke with City Dispatch. He explained that the majority of the calls were during summer months. He spoke about his service on former Mayor Strle's Chronic Inebriate Task Force

and to how things were done at that time. He stated that people are trying to blame everything on alcohol, but there are much bigger problems. He stated the City is happy to embrace its new revenue partner "with the leaves". He asked whether anyone has looked at the "zombie culture" at night when liquor establishments are closed; he stated they are the ones out at night causing trouble.

Mr. Pruhs asked for confirmation that the Gavora family had been in the liquor business since the 1960's; Mr. Gavora confirmed. Mr. Pruhs asked whether they ever had a license pulled, and Mr. Gavora replied that they have not. Mr. Pruhs stated that there are many less liquor stores and bars in Fairbanks than there used to be, so there is a condensed group of people patronizing a smaller number of locations. Mr. Gavora stated the DTA has done a great job of pushing it out to other locations; he mentioned that Bentley Mall, Gavora Mall, and Fred Meyer East are affected by the same issues. Mr. Pruhs asked Mr. Gavora about the stores he currently owns and operates. Mr. Gavora stated they six stores in the Borough, three of which are in the City.

Ms. Therrien stated that when she drives near the location, she sees people loitering and drinking in the parking lot. She asked Mr. Gavora if he could offer any solutions. Mr. Gavora stated that he disagrees with Ms. Therrien and that he is there sometimes three times in one day. He stated that security guards and employees chase people off the property and that it is not necessarily his property where the people are congregating. Mr. Gavora stated that people also hang out on property near Stacia Street and that the liquor store is in close proximity to chronic inebriate housing. He stated the liquor store was there long before the facility. He indicated that alcohol problems are less now than they used to be and that there are about 60 chronically inebriated people causing the problem. He stated that his business pays millions of dollars to the City in alcohol and property taxes, and he asked what the funds were being spent on.

Mr. Gibson asked Mr. Gavora if he knew his liquor license renewal would be considered by the Council at the last meeting. Mr. Gavora stated that he was not aware and that he has never had to deal with an issue like this before.

Ms. Kun asked whether the TV at the location is ever turned off; she stated it is very bright. Mr. Gavora stated that he was unsure how that was pertinent to the liquor license. **Mayor Matherly** asked Council Members to stay on topic. **Ms. Kun** asked about theft procedures at the location. Mr. Gavora stated they try to stop theft unless it may cause harm to employees and that chronic inebriates are chronic thieves. He stated they try to prevent risk to employees as much as possible.

Hearing no more Council Member questions for Mr. Gavora, **Mayor Matherly** stated it was time for Council discussion.

Mr. Pruhs stated he has been told that the problem is not Thrifty Liquors – it is "First Housing". He stated the subdivision has deteriorated because of the facility. He commented that Mr. Gavora should not be crucified because of that.

Mr. Cleworth corrected Mr. Pruhs; he stated that it is called "Housing First". He stated that the problems near Stacia Street were there long before Housing First. He stated that area was a big problem area when he was Mayor. He stated that he agrees with Ms. Therrien that there are folks loitering outside the liquor store before it opens early in the morning, and he knows the individuals

by name because he has to deal with them at his business downtown. **Mr. Cleworth** stated he was asked recently by Borough officials if the Council would protest the Thrifty Liquors license; he stated the Borough is having problems at the transit station. He stated there is no legal tool to deal with the chronic inebriate issue, and he does not expect police to deal with those issues all the time. He acknowledged the bigger community problem. He spoke to his own experiences in dealing with the alcohol problem at his downtown business, and he stated he is tired of it.

Ms. Therrien disagreed with Mr. Pruhs' statement that the Council was crucifying Mr. Gavora; she stated they were only asking questions. She pointed out that the Council postponed the issue from the last meeting to give Mr. Gavora the courtesy of being able to speak about the license. She stated she is unsure what to do about the problem, and she suggested that perhaps the City should buy out some liquor licenses.

Mayor Matherly stated that it was not the intent to insult Mr. Gavora; he stated that the Council wanted to have more information before acting. He stated it is the Council's right to ask questions.

Mr. Gibson stated he did not want a repeat of the situation that occurred with The Spur's liquor license, so that is why he supported postponing the item.

Ms. Therrien stated the Council postponed the issue also because they wanted more information on police calls. **Mayor Matherly** asked FECC Manager Kristi Merideth for a staff report.

Ms. Merideth stated that there were 169 calls to Thrifty Liquors from January 1 – December 31, 2019. She explained that the calls include incidents near the store. She explained the process by which FECC stacks call location.

Clerk Snider was asked to call the roll on the motion. She clarified that the motion was on the floor from the last Council Meeting, but no details were provided in the motion to protest. She asked the maker of the motion if they wished to provide additional information.

Ms. Kun indicated that it would be great if Thrifty Liquors could post someone at the door to help with theft problems.

Mr. Pruhs moved to AMEND the motion to PROTEST by changing it to a motion to WAIVE PROTEST.

Clerk Snider stated that if the motion to protest fails, the Council essentially waives protest.

Ms. Kun stated she would like to stipulate that the Council protests until a theft safety plan is implemented. She stated she is not sure that the Council could do that.

Mayor Matherly stated he is not sure how the Council could quantify such a stipulation.

Ms. Kun, with the concurrence of the second, moved to WITHDRAW the motion to protest.

Mr. Pruhs, seconded by **Ms. Rogers**, moved to WAIVE PROTEST on the Thrifty Liquors Liquor License Application for Renewal.

Mr. Cleworth stated that he recalls that the Council has placed restrictions and stipulations on liquor licenses in the past. He asked Attorney Ewers whether the Council has the authority to do that. Attorney Ewers stated that the Council may place conditions on the waiver of a protest.

A ROLL CALL VOTE WAS TAKEN ON THE MOTION TO WAIVE PROTEST ON THE THRIFTY LIQUORS LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL AS FOLLOWS:

YEAS: Pruhs, Rogers

NAYS: Cleworth, Kun, Gibson, Therrien **Mayor Matherly** declared the MOTION FAILED.

Mayor Matherly asked Clerk Snider what a failed motion to waive protest means. Clerk Snider stated that the failed motion to waive protest means that the Council protests the license renewal.

Mr. Pruhs stated he hopes everyone realizes what just happened.

Clerk Snider asked Attorney Ewers to confirm the effect of the failed motion to waive protest. Attorney Ewers confirmed that the failed motion to waive protest means that the Council protests.

Mayor Matherly asked Attorney Ewers whether the ABC Board makes the ultimate decision on the license renewal. Attorney Ewers explained that the ABC Board is the authority on liquor license renewals, but they are to give weight to the Council's protest.

Ms. Therrien suggested that some findings be included with the protest; she stated that one of the findings should be the number of incidents and ESP calls to the location.

Attorney Ewers stated it would be helpful to the Clerk in forwarding the protest if reasons were provided for the protest. He stated the Council would need to agree on findings.

Mr. Cleworth stated that there were a number of comments made during deliberations. He stated that, normally, the City Attorney would take all the comments to create findings of fact.

Attorney Ewers explained that when findings are needed, the Attorney prepares them and brings them back to the Council at the next meeting for approval. He stated that he could do that in this case, but, depending on the deadline for the City's response on the liquor license renewal, the protest may need to be sent to the state before findings are approved. Clerk Snider stated that the 60-day deadline is before the next Regular City Council Meeting. Attorney Ewers stated the response could go forward before the findings.

Attorney Ewers was directed to prepare findings of fact based on the Council's discussion to be presented for approval at the next meeting.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

a) Committee Reports

Explore Fairbanks – Ms. Kun shared that the new Board of Directors just took effect.

<u>Polaris Work Group</u> – **Mr. Pruhs** stated he was not in attendance at the last Work Group meeting. He stated that the group has discussed many options for future property development and that the City currently owns the property. He stated there is a great need in the community for senior housing. He spoke to the many different ideas that are on the table and clarified that none of them have been approved or are being funded by the City.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATIONS TO COUNCIL

a) Permanent Fund Review Board Meeting Minutes of October 30, 2019

ACCEPTED on the CONSENT AGENDA.

COUNCIL MEMBERS' COMMENTS

Mr. Gibson stated the Fairbanks Children's Museum is a wonderful facility. He spoke to the recent retirement of Dr. Bergeson, a well-respected pediatrician in Fairbanks. **Mr. Gibson** commented on the amount of time Chief Reeder spent researching the call reports for liquor establishments and questioned whether the reports were doing more harm than good. He stated he is new to the Council and does not know how the reports came about, but perhaps the Council should reconsider the need for the reports. He suggested that the Chief's time may be better spent elsewhere. **Mr. Gibson** suggested that putting that kind of information on the record could be hurting a business since all of the calls may not have relevance to the business.

Mr. Cleworth asked whether staff could find a better way to prepare reports so that the Council has more clear and concise information. He thanked Attorney Ewers for taking the initiative to clarify the City's appointment of a representative to the Golden Heart Parking Service (GHPS)

Board; he stated he wished that information had been codified. He stated there is work being done to make the City Code match the agreements with the Parking Authority. **Mr. Cleworth** stated that he will bring Resolution No. 4903 to the Borough Assembly as he is the City representative for the next meeting. He expressed disappointment that the Borough does not allow the City to serve as the Board of Adjustment on appeals involving property within the City of Fairbanks. He thanked Public Works Director Jeff Jacobson for the restoration work he is doing in the downstairs hallway.

Mr. Pruhs stated he would like GHPS to provide the Council with a policy manual for the violations they have the authority to cite. He stated it is time for the City Council to look into the role it has in GHPS operations.

Ms. Therrien stated she is happy the Council has held its first goal-setting meeting. She encouraged the Council to schedule a second session so they stay on track.

Mr. Meeks asked when the Council would like to hold another session and what topics they would like to discuss. **Ms. Therrien** stated they need to continue with the earlier discussion.

Mayor Matherly stated a Work Session before the next Regular Council meeting was available.

Ms. Rogers asked Mr. Cleworth if he would like for her to attend the next Borough Assembly meeting with him; Mr. Cleworth stated that would be nice.

Ms. Kun thanked everyone for contributing to the difficult conversations about alcohol and the community. She gave a land acknowledgement and encouraged people who are struggling to reach out and ask for help.

Ms. Therrien, seconded by **Mr. Gibson**, moved to ENTER Executive Session for the purpose of discussing AFL-CIO, FFU, and IBEW Labor Negotiation Strategies.

Mayor Matherly called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

Mayor Matherly called for a brief recess. The Council reconvened in Executive Session following the brief recess.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The City Council met in Executive Session to discuss AFL-CIO, FFU, and IBEW Labor Negotiation Strategies. Direction was given to the negotiating teams, and no action was taken.

Ms. Kun, seconded by Mr. Gibson, moved to ADJOURN the meeting.

Mayor Matherly called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

Mayor Matherly declared the meeting adjourned at 11:00 p.m.

Mr. Gibson explained that he filed the request to reconsider because he felt that the Council limited the owner's testimony, and he felt that the Council did not provide a clear reason for protesting the renewal of the license.

Mayor Matherly declared the MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Matherly stated that the motion to waive protest has returned to the floor.

The motion to waive protest on the Liquor License Application for Renewal was made by Mr. Pruhs, seconded by Ms. Rogers, at the Regular Meeting of February 10, 2020.

Mr. Pruhs mentioned the communication the Council received from Mr. Gavora's attorney, Mike Kramer. He stated the Council should allow Mr. Gavora to speak.

Mayor Matherly asked the Council whether any member objected to allowing the owner of Thrifty Liquors to speak. No members objected.

Mr. Gavora requested that the Thrifty Liquors store manager be allowed to speak. **Mayor Matherly** asked the Council whether any member objected to allowing the store manager of Thrifty Liquors to speak. No members objected

<u>Susan Hamner, 1640 Willow Street, Fairbanks</u> – Ms. Hamner stated she works at the store Monday through Friday, and she feels that the store has run better since she began managing it over a year ago. She stated that employees go above and beyond what is required by law, and they do 100% ID check on customers.

Mr. Pruhs stated the information the Council received shows that, over the last 30 days, the highest liquor sales at the location between the hours of 8 and 9 a.m. was \$43. He asked whether there are people waiting outside the store at 8 a.m. to purchase liquor. Ms. Hamner stated that she does not believe that to be the case. She stated there are grocery and cigarette sales in the morning, and sometimes night workers getting off work come in the morning to purchase liquor. Mr. Pruhs stated he visited the store earlier that morning, and he noted that about 45% of the floor space was dedicated to non-alcoholic items. He asked whether most morning sales were for liquor products. Ms. Hamner stated that most morning sales are for grocery items. Mr. Pruhs stated that Thrifty Liquors is in a dangerous neighborhood; Ms. Hamner disagreed. She stated that there are a lot of mentally challenged people in the area, and when employees see someone passed out on the street, they call the authorities.

Ms. Therrien asked who does security checks in and around the building. Ms. Hamner stated she and her employees check around the building to make sure no one is loitering and to make sure none of their customers feel threatened or bothered. **Ms. Therrien** asked Ms. Hamner whether she considers the congregating of four or five people in the parking loitering. Ms. Hamner stated that sometimes it is loitering, but sometimes it is a meeting spot. **Ms. Therrien** asked Ms. Hamner whether she ever witnesses people drinking in the parking lot. Ms. Hamner stated she sees that occasionally, but when that happens, they are told to leave the property. **Ms. Therrien** how often that occurs; Ms. Hamner stated it does not happen often and that she has only had to call the police twice within the past 30 days.

Mayor Matherly asked Ms. Hamner how long she has worked at Thrifty Liquors. Ms. Hamner stated she has worked for the Gavoras for six years and at Thrifty Liquors for over a year.

Ms. Therrien asked Ms. Hamner how often employees have to turn away intoxicated people from the store. Ms. Hamner stated that occurs about every other day, and it is often the same individuals.

Mr. Gibson asked whether Thrifty Liquors has ever been cited by the State; Ms. Hamner replied that to her knowledge it has not. **Mr. Gibson** asked Ms. Hamner whether she has ever been cited for selling to someone who is legally not allowed to purchase alcohol. Ms. Hamner replied that she has not.

Mr. Pruhs asked Ms. Hamner about her history in working for the Gavoras. Ms. Hamner stated she began working in 2014 at Gavoras on Third Street. She stated she was moved to Gavora's Liquor and Fine Wine at the Shopper's Forum, then she was promoted to manager. She stated that shortly before that store closed, she was asked to manage Thrifty Liquors.

Mayor Matherly asked how long Thrifty Liquors had been on located at the corner of Airport Way. Mr. Gavora stated it opened around 1984 for the Gavoras, but it has probably been there since the early 1970s.

Ms. Rogers thanked Thrifty Liquors representatives for coming and for giving an overview. She stated it is a community issue, and there is a community responsibility to uplift businesses that are trying to work under difficult circumstances. She stated she will support the license renewal.

Mr. Pruhs stated that in the Findings of Fact, there is no mention that there were no members of the public who testified against the Thrifty Liquors license. He stated the Council protested a liquor license one time when there was a shooting at the Greyhound Lounge.

A ROLL CALL VOTE WAS TAKEN ON THE MOTION TO WAIVE PROTEST ON THE THRIFTY LIQUORS LIQUOR LICENSE APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL AS FOLLOWS:

Mayor Matherly declared the MOTION CARRIED.

Clerk Snider stated that Item (b) would not be addressed because the motion to waive protest passed.

Mr. Pruhs, seconded by **Ms. Therrien**, moved to ENTER Executive Session for the purpose of discussing AFL-CIO, FFU, and IBEW Labor Negotiations Strategies.

Mayor Matherly called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

Mayor Matherly called for a brief recess. The Council reconvened in Executive Session following the brief recess.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

- a) AFL-CIO Labor Negotiation Strategy
- b) FFU Labor Negotiation Strategy
- c) IBEW Labor Negotiation Strategy

The City Council met in Executive Session to discuss AFL-CIO, FFU, and IBEW Labor Negotiations Strategies. Direction was given to the negotiating teams, and no action was taken.

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Pruhs, seconded by Ms. Therrien, moved to ADJOURN the meeting.

Mayor Matherly called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

Mayor Matherly declared the meeting adjourned at 6:54 p.m.





Our secure waste storage is secured and monitored in compliance with 3 AAC 306.715 and 3 AAC 306.720, utilizing commercial steel doors with key code locking mechanisms and high def surveillance cameras. Upon aproval, any marijuana waste, including expired marijuana products will be ground and mixed with organic material consisting of household waste, paper, food, coffee grounds, leaves, grass clipings etc. to produce a final waste product that is no more than 50% marijuana product. Once marijuana product is reconciled to be unusable for any and all intended purposes, we will transfer the waste to our onsite secured dumpster to await final disposal. Upon final disposal, we will record the final destination of the waste, pursuant to 3 AAC 306.740(c) (2) and store these records in our secure office in compliane with 3 AAc 306.755

2.1 RESPONSE CONT'D

Each time a bulk package is opened or repackaged, weights will be taken at the beginning and end of the process. Internal logs will be kept and variance(s) due to moisture loss will be kept in the log; adjusted, noted, and accounted for in METRC. Any waste will be noted in waste logs as well, and reported to AMCO via email three days before destroying and disposing of the waste material. Unpackaged quantities of bulk marijuana or mj product will remain locked in secure storage, consistent with our plan and our published policy + procedure (s), METRC package tags will remain physically attached to the vessel containing bulk marijuana associated with each tag. Incoming marijuana or mj product which has been prepackaged prior to it's arrival at our facility will have the labeling double checked for compliance before being made available for retail sale. Product will then be added to inventory within the point of sale system, and may have additional, POS specific labeling/sku added. Upon entering the establishment, a customer will immediately be asked to produce ID. Once their ID has been verified the customer will be "buzzed" into the retail area and they will select product from our menu, be given an opportunity to view the product before purchasing (staff will remain in control of product until it is paid for thru POS system). Product(s) will be placed in AMCO compliant exit packaging before leaving the facility. All sales will be entered through our point of sale (POS) system, and will be reported through METRC daily. Each drawer will be closed at the end of each shift and the proceeds from each shift and day will be verified against accountability reports generated by our POS system. At the end of each day, that day will be closed out within the POS system. Within 24 hours of closure of a business day, our sales data will be uploaded to METRC. Routine internal audits will be conducted by licensee or manager; verifying accuracy between METRC, our POS and product on hand. Inventory of prepackaged products will occur each night at the close of the shift and/or each morning before opening on internal forms (shift report/turnover). Retail operations are anticipated to begin at 8:00am until as late as 1:00am Monday thru Saturday. Sunday Open 11:00am thru closing at 9:00pm.

3.1 RESPONSE CONT'D

Employees will look for signs of Impairment to include but not limited to:

- watery eyes, - slurred speach, - blood shot or red eyes, - glassy eyes which may have trouble staying open, - their gait and - coordination (lack of). This list is not exhaustive. If any of the above signs or any others are identified the individual will be asked to leave the premisis and no sale will occur. This facility implements and enforces a zero tolerance policy for non-compliant behavior on our licensed premisis (including our parking area). Our policy requires that all personnel be trained on how to identify a person who is under the influence of an alcoholic beverage, inhalant, or controlled substance as set forth above. Any person(s) who are suspected of being in violation of 3 AAC 306.310(a)(2) will be asked (professionaly) to vacate the premisis, they will be advised that non compliance will result in possible trespassing charges and if neccesary local law enforcement will be contacted.



The shipment will be reconciled with the transport manifest, shipment labels and packaging labels to ensure consistency. All product will be weighed and reconciled with the weight listed on the manifest and labels. Any shipments with discrepancies will be rejected. Shipments that pass initial inspection will be accepted into the facility, entered into METRC and the point of sale software and added to the store's inventory storage or display cases. At the end of each business day, the management team will reconcile the sale's transactions from the point of sale software with the inventory on hand and with METRC to ensure consistency. Any discrepancies will be immediately addressed. When customers enter the retail store, they will immediately be asked for ID. Once ID has been verified, customers can then browse the retail store. After customers completes their transaction, they will exit the licensed premises. Loitering will not be tolerated.

All marijuana and marijuana products will be displayed in locked and secured display cases and cabinets behind the POS counters which require employee assistance to access. Only smell sample jars will be reachable to the customers. "Smell jars" will be covered with a plastic, metal or other type of mesh tamper-evident cover. Product displays will always be in full view of a working video surveillance camera. Marijuana and marijuana products will be placed in the secured displays at opening and will only be on display during business hours. Only marijuana that is packaged and labeled in accordance with all state and municipal laws and regulations, and in accordance with Good Titrations policies, will be placed in product displays and accessed for sale to the public. All product will be weighed by Good Titrations and reconciled with the weight listed on the manifest and labels. Any shipments with discrepancies will be rejected. Shipments that pass initial inspection will be accepted into the facility, immediately entered into METRC and added to the inventory log. Good Titrations anticipates the following marijuana plant and product waste at the manufacturing facility; (1) contaminated or infected marijuana or marijuana products (2) marijuana or marijuana products deemed by the licensee or a manager as unfit for sale or consumption for any reason (3) marijuana product that fails testing (4) marijuana plant waste created during the extraction process (5) marijuana or marijuana product that becomes expired (6) other marijuana or marijuana product waste as determined by the MCB or director. Once marijuana or marijuana product is deemed as waste, it will be separated from all other marijuana and marijuana products and securely stored in locked bins on the licensed premises and an email notification will be sent to AMCO Enforcement at least 3 days prior to rendering the waste unusable as well as recording the waste in METRC. All solid marijuana plant waste (plant matter waste from the extraction process such as plant matter that is pressed/squeezed to extract oil) and marijuana product waste will be ground in a grinder and then mixed with other solid compost-able or non-compostable waste such as, paper waste, plastic waste, cardboard waste, and soil until the mixture is no more than 50% marijuana waste. 

ORDINANCE NO. 6129

AN ORDINANCE RE-ESTABLISHING AN INCENTIVE BONUS PROGRAM WITHIN THE FAIRBANKS POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR RECRUITMENT AND HIRING

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 6050, as Amended, passed by the City Council in June of 2017, approved an incentive bonus program within the Fairbanks Police Department (the Department) for recruitment and hiring to address the significant shortfall in police officer staffing; and

WHEREAS, the sunset date for the bonus program, originally July 1, 2018, was extended until December 19, 2019, by Resolution No. 4832; and

WHEREAS, the reasons for providing a bonus to lateral hires were: (1) the cost to the City of sending an officer to the Police Academy (approximatley \$30,000); and (2) a one-time, sign-on bonus of \$20,000 for a lateral hire would help attract applicants and would constitute a significant cost savings to the City; and

WHEREAS, while the bonus program has helped in attracting lateral hires, the Department's staffing levels continue to be a challenge due to retirements and transfers; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that there continues to be a need for the bonus program; and

WHEREAS, the Department continues to have salary savings from unfilled positions that will fund the bonus program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

SECTION 1. An incentive bonus program for recruitment and hiring within the Fairbanks Police Department is hereby approved as follows:

(a) An applicant who is a certified police officer in the State of Alaska or is able to meet Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC) certification standards without attending a basic officer academy will be paid a \$20,000 "sign-on bonus" in their first paycheck following completion of Field Training, subject to the payback provisions specified in the attached Sign-on Bonus Agreement. (b) If an active FPD employee recruits a new officer, as defined in subsection (a), who successfully completes the hiring process, the employee will receive a recruitment bonus of \$5,000.

SECTION 2. The bonuses established in Section 1 may only be funded by salary savings from unfilled, budgeted positions, if available.

SECTION 3. The bonus program created by this ordinance will apply retroactively to January 1, 2020 and will sunset on June 30, 2021, unless extended by Resolution of the City Council.

Fairbanks Police Department Sign-On Bonus Contract

This agreement is made between the CITY OF FAIRBANKS ("City") and ______ ("Employee").

WHEREAS, this contract will apply to an Employee who begins employment for the City in the Police Department ("Department") for the first time as a POLICE OFFICER and meets the City requirements as a lateral-hire Police Officer; and

WHEREAS, the Department wishes to bestow upon the Employee a "Sign-on Bonus" as an incentive for the Employee to accept employment at the City and to remain satisfactorily employed in the Department for at least three full years;

THEREFORE, the City and the Employee agree to the following terms:

- 1. The City, acting through the Department, agrees to bestow upon the Employee the amount of \$20,000.00 as a Sign-on Bonus in return for the Employee accepting the City's offer of employment. This amount shall be paid directly to the Employee on the Employee's first paycheck following the successful completion of field training.
- 2. The City will apply all required federal and state tax deductions and will report all payments made under this Agreement as required by federal and state law. Taxes shall be withheld as bonus earnings from the Sign-on Bonus and reported to the Internal Revenue Services as income on the Employee's Form W-2. The Sign-on Bonus is not considered "salary" and shall not be included for purposes of retirement benefit calculations or salary increases.
- 3. The Department will adhere to all relevant City and Department policies during the hiring process and in making bonus payments to employees.
- 4. In return for accepting the Sign-on Bonus as provided in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, the Employee agrees to work for the Department on a regular and full-time basis for at least three years beginning "Start Date" and ending on "3 Year Date". Should the Employee resign, quit, or be terminated for cause before the above stated ending date, the Employee shall repay a prorated amount of the Signon Bonus as provided in the following paragraphs.
- 5. The Employee's failure to remain employed by the Department for three years will trigger the Employee's duty to repay, pro-rata, the amount paid by the City pursuant to paragraph 1, above. (This amount may be more than the Employee received due to tax or other withholdings.) For example, if the Employee leaves one year prior to the end date, they will repay 12/36 of such amount. To facilitate this repayment, the Employee, by signing below, expressly gives the City a lien on their salary, wages, and other sums payable to them by the City. In addition, the Employee hereby authorizes the City to withhold all amounts so due from any sum payable to the Employee by the Department or the City. The Employee also agrees that any tax consequences resulting from the repayment of the Sign-on Bonus or any portion thereof will be the sole and exclusive responsibility of the Employee.

- 6. If the Employee fails to remain employed by the Department for three years for reasons beyond their control (e.g. injury, illness or death), other than just cause termination, the Department may in its sole discretion waive all or part of the liability owed by the Employee. Any such waivers must be approved in writing by both the Chief of Police and the Mayor.
- 7. If any part of the Agreement is found to be invalid or unenforceable, the other parts shall remain valid and enforceable and Employee agrees, represents, and warrants that they will be held to any applicable repayment of the Sign-on Bonus.

BY SIGNING BELOW, the Employee certifies that they have not accepted a financial incentive for accepting employment at the City, other than as described in this Agreement.
