WHEREAS, the United States Department of Homeland Security provides funds through the SAFER Grant Program to assist fire departments in increasing the number of firefighters to meet industry minimum standards; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks Fire Department has requested an increase in staffing for several years; and

WHEREAS, the SAFER Grant Program will provide funding for new firefighters for a period of three years covering 100% of the funding for the cost of a first-year firefighter for 3 years with no retention requirement after the third year; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks received notice of the changes in the grant on May 15, 2020 and the grant is due on May 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks Fire Department wishes to increase its overall staffing by three firefighters; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks wishes to request \$1,023,669.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council that the Mayor or his designee is authorized to execute any and all documents required to apply for funds on behalf of the City for this grant.
