ORDINANCE NO. 6163

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A LEASE OF SPACE IN CITY HALL TO THE INTERIOR ALASKA CENTER FOR NON-VIOLENT LIVING TO HOUSE THE FAIRBANKS REENTRY COALITION

WHEREAS, the City owns and maintains the Patrick B. Cole City Hall, located at 800 Cushman Street (Block 104A, Fairbanks Townsite); and

WHEREAS, the Interior Alaska Center for Non-Violent Living (IACNVL) wishes to lease office space in City Hall to house the staff of the Fairbanks Reentry Coalition (FRC); and

WHEREAS, the FRC is a collection of organizations and programs working together to reduce recidivism among people returning from incarceration; and

WHEREAS, the FRC has been the premiere reentry collation in the state for quite some time, and over the years, the FRC has developed projects that help returning citizens with housing, employment, transportation, substance abuse treatment, and overcoming poverty; and

WHEREAS, the IACNVL is working with the City to stand up the Crisis Now Mobile Crisis Team, which is part of a statewide behavioral health crisis system, and because of this work has run short of space for housing the FRC staff; and

WHEREAS, recognizing the importance to the City of the work of the IACNVL on behalf of the Crisis Now Mobile Crisis Team, the City believes it is important to aid the efforts of the IACNVL by offering office space to the FRC; and

WHEREAS, under FGC Sec. 70-44, the City may lease space to not-for-profit organizations at less than market value if, in the judgment of the City Council, such lease is in the best interest of the City; and

WHEREAS, it is the finding of the Council that the proposed lease to the IACNVL for the use by the FRC is in the best interest of the City.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That a lease instrument substantially in the form shown in Exhibit A is hereby authorized by the City Council for the purposes stated herein.

SECTION 2. That the Mayor is authorized to execute the lease on behalf of the City, with the execution to take place not less than thirty days after the effective date of this ordinance, as prescribed by City Charter Sec. 8.3 and FGC Sec. 70-56.

EXHIBIT "A" TO ORDINANCE NO. 6163

1. Purpose: The Fairbanks City Council, by Ordinance No. 6163, authorized execution of this lease of City-owned property to the Interior Alaska Center for Non-Violent Living (IACNVL) in recognition of the IACNVL's work with the Crisis Now Mobile Crisis Team. This document defines the responsibilities of City of Fairbanks and the IACNVL (the "parties") in regard to the use of office space in City Hall by the Fairbanks Reentry Coalition (FRC). Because of the IACNVL's work with the Crisis Team, the City is providing the leased office space at no charge.

2. General Understanding: The parties agree that the FRC will be allowed to operate out of office space in the Patrick B. Cole City Hall, 800 Cushman St, Fairbanks, Alaska. The space is located on the second floor, in the space formerly occupied by the Victims for Justice Advocate office, consisting of approximately 334 square feet. The space also includes access to such ancillary areas as restrooms, break rooms, elevators, and hallways. FRC staff will be allowed use of available "Permit Required" spaces in the parking lot east of the Fairbanks Police Station during normal work hours.

3. City of Fairbanks (City) will:

- a. Provide the office space and related facilities maintenance;
- b. Grant access cards and office keys to two FRC personnel;
- c. Provide two computer workstations connected to the City of Fairbanks network and supported by Alasconnect;
- d. Connect one phone in the office; and
- e. Include the office in the routine cleaning schedule.

4. The IACNVL will:

- a. Maintain control over access cards and keys;
- b. Comply with City Information Technology policies;
- c. Refrain from bulk printing on City printers;
- d. Be responsible for any damages to City property outside of normal wear and tear;
- e. Abide by City Hall COVID-19 policies; and
- f. Participate in fire drills and other facility-wide events.

5. Term: This lease is effective upon the date signed and executed by the duly authorized representatives of the parties and will end June 30, 2023, unless extended by written agreement of the parties. This lease may be terminated, without cause, by either party.

6. Signatures: The parties to this Lease, through their duly authorized representatives, have executed this lease on the dates set out below, and certify that they have read, understand, and agree to the terms and conditions as set forth herein.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING CONVEYANCE OF AN EASEMENT OVER A PORTION OF THE RIGHT-OF-WAY BORDERING 410 CUSHMAN STREET

RESOLUTION NO. 4968

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING THE PROPOSED CHANGES TO TITLE 13 OF THE ALASKA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE TO ALLOW USE OF ATVS AND SNOWMOBILES ON PUBLIC ROADWAYS

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska Department of Public Safety has proposed regulation changes to allow the use of ATVs and snowmobiles on roadways; and

WHEREAS, the proposed regulation changes have raised some significant public safety and administrative concerns with the City of Fairbanks; and

WHEREAS, the City Administration sent a letter on April 5, 2021, to the Director of the Alaska Wildlife Troopers expressing concern with the proposed changes; and

WHEREAS, ATVs and similar vehicles are not equipped with sufficient safety equipment, including personal restraints and adequate directional lighting to be used on City streets; and

WHEREAS, snow removal operations use large equipment such as graders, blowers, and dump trucks, which can be hazardous to motorists who follow too closely or who try to overtake equipment, and there is a public safety concern for those travelling on smaller vehicles such as ATVs and snowmobiles on City streets; and

WHEREAS, drivers of ATVs and snowmobiles may not be accustomed to following normal traffic laws, which may increase traffic violations and accidents on City streets, and more traffic and parking enforcement will be needed; and

WHEREAS, if ATVs and snowmobiles are allowed to operate on City streets, the vehicles should be registered and insured like other vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Fairbanks is a northern city that has in recent years strongly promoted winter tourism; and

WHEREAS, snow machines are an integral part of winter in Fairbanks; and

WHEREAS, while the City has concerns regarding the State's proposed changes to Title 13 as currently written, the City supports the concept of increased use of snow machines in the winter, especially on designated routes that would encourage access to local businesses; and

WHEREAS, the same holds true for the use of off-highway vehicles during the summer on designated routes that would encourage access to local businesses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Fairbanks City Council opposes the changes currently proposed to Title 13 of the Alaska Administrative Code to allow use of ATVs and snowmobiles on public roadways and encourages the State of Alaska to allow maximum local control over any proposed rules involving the use of ATVs and snowmobiles on public roadways.

ORDINANCE NO. 6166

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AN ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION DEVICE USE POLICY DURING CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

WHEREAS, technology is a valuable resource and critical communication tool for many people, including elected and appointed city officials; and

WHEREAS, the use of electronic communication devices during public meetings raises the following concerns: actual or perceived violation of the Open Meetings Act; distraction and disruption to the conduct of the meeting; and perception of not listening to citizens, staff, and other council members; and

WHEREAS, for these reasons, the council adopts limitations on the use of electronic communication devices at city council meetings by elected city officials.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

SECTION 1. Fairbanks General Code Chapter 2, Article II, Division 4 is hereby amended by adding Sec. 2-123 as follows:

Sec. 2-123. Limitations on the use of electronic communication devices.

(a) The following limitations on the use of electronic communication devices will be in effect during all city council meetings and will apply to all elected officials:

- Cell phones must be turned off (not simply silenced) prior to the start of the meeting and remain off during the duration of the meeting;
- (2) Electronic communication devices, other than cell phones, may only be used for purposes of reading materials provided for that meeting or other materials available related to an agenda topic; and
- (3) Electronic communication devices may not be used to engage in emailing, texting, or accessing social media of any kind.

(b) As used in this section, "electronic communication" means any text, audio, static image, or video to be exchanged in real time or near real time and includes but is not limited to: email, instant messaging, chat rooms, text messaging, social media, and blogs. An "electronic communication device" means any device capable of electronic communication.

(c) The council may grant permission for a member to have their cell phone turned on, if warranted due to special circumstances such as a family emergency. The council, in coordination with the administration and the FECC, may adopt procedures to provide for emergency contact of council members during council meetings.

(d) If council members are authorized by ordinance to attend meetings virtually, a member my use an electronic communication device to the extent necessary to allow their participation.

ORDINANCE NO. 6167

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING FAIRBANKS GENERAL CODE SEC. 46-80 DRINKING IN PUBLIC TO EXEMPT CERTAIN OUTDOOR RECREATIONAL FACILITIES

WHEREAS, FGC Sec. 46-80 was amended by Ordinance No. 6150 to make the restriction on drinking in public citywide; and

WHEREAS, the definition of "public place" in Chapter 46 includes all parks and outdoor recreational facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Fairbanks North Star Borough Parks and Recreation Department has a policy (PR 20.01.06) for the designation of non-alcohol parks by the Department in consultation with the Parks and Recreation Commission; and

WHEREAS, the citywide restriction imposed by Ordinance No. 6150 included several outdoor recreational facilities that the borough had not designated as non-alcohol; and

WHEREAS, the Parks and Recreation Department's designation of non-alcohol parks is reviewed annually and address concerns underlying FGC Sec. 46-80.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

SECTION 1. Fairbanks General Code Section 46-80. Drinking in public, is hereby amended as follows [new text in **bold/underline** font; deleted text in **strikethrough** font]:

Sec. 46-80. Drinking in public.

(a) A person commits the offense of drinking in public if they drink any alcoholic beverage on or in any public place which is not covered by a license issued under the provisions of Alaska Statute Title 4, which permits the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises.

(b) The prohibition in subsection (a) only applies to borough parks and borough outdoor recreation areas if the borough has banned alcohol from those locations.

SECTION 2. That the effective date of this ordinance is the <u>day of May 2021</u>.

CALL TO ORDER & READING OF THE FDC MISSION STATEMENT

Vice Chair Thomas called the meeting to order, and Clerk Snider read the FDC Mission Statement into the record.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

FDC members cited the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Ms. Harriger, seconded by Mr. Toelle, moved to APPROVE the Agenda.

Hearing no objection, the Agenda was APPROVED.

<u>CITIZENS' COMMENTS</u> (Limited to 3 Minutes)

Clerk Snider stated that there are no citizens in the Council Chambers. An opportunity was provided for citizens to comment via Zoom, and no citizens wished to provide comments.

MAYOR & CITY STAFF REPORTS

a) Update on Police Chief Hiring Process

Ms. Foster-Snow provided an update to the FDC on the hiring process. She reported that Mayor Matherly decided to open the position externally on January 5, although there were two qualified

internal applicants. She stated the City has received multiple applications from across the country since the position opened the week prior. **Ms. Foster-Snow** reported that she and the Mayor will review applications for minimum qualifications on January 19. She stated that the Mayor has seated all the panelists for the selection committee, but the names of the nine members have not yet been released. She shared that the committee will gather for the first time the week of January 25. She stated that two content area experts, Juneau Police Chief Ed Mercer and Greg Russell with the Alaska Municipal League (AML), will help give guidance to the Mayor, but they will not serve on the committee. **Ms. Foster-Snow** stated she is excited that FDC member Andrew Aquino has agreed to be a part of the committee.

Acting Police Chief Rick Sweet provided an update on training at Fairbanks Police Department (FPD). He shared that the department completed the 3-hour de-escalation, intervention, and force mitigation training, following completion of the implicit bias training. He stated that FPD has begun the 3-hour "Duty to Intervene" class. He shared that the department has taken a step forward with a more local focus on diversity and cultural awareness by contacting Rodney Gaskins about a class on equity and inclusion. AC Sweet stated he also contacted Shirley Lee to ask for assistance in local training and partnerships. He reported that he is including other local law enforcement agencies in his efforts.

Ms. Harriger asked AC Sweet whether the efforts to create partnerships between police and the community was still in the early stages or whether there were some steps in place already. AC Sweet replied that there is a current focus on linking citizens with mental health resources by way of programs such as Crisis Now and Suicide Prevention. He stated that those efforts are in collaboration with the Fairbanks Fire Department and the Fairbanks Emergency Communications Center (FECC). He stated that some of those efforts will depend on funding and availability of resources.

APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES

a) Regular Meeting Minutes of December 8, 2020

Mr. Aquino, seconded by Mr. Toelle, moved to APPROVE the meeting minutes.

Hearing no objections or proposed changes, the minutes were APPROVED.

NEW BUSINESS

a) Open Meetings Act (OMA) Overview

City Attorney Paul Ewers gave a PowerPoint Presentation to the FDC on the OMA which covered:

- Purpose and goal of the OMA
- Who is covered under the OMA
- Requirements of the OMA
- Definition of a meeting under the OMA
- Reasonable public notice of meetings
- Serial meetings
- Social gatherings
- Social media

Ms. Rogers emphasized the importance of the OMA and suggested that a presentation on it be given to the FDC no less than once per year.

FDC MEMBERS' COMMENTS

Mr. Aquino reminded everyone that the following Monday is Martin Luther King Day, and he mentioned Alaska Civil Rights Day. He stated that there is much progress to be proud of, and efforts will continue into the future. He stated there are tough times currently, but something to celebrate is everyone at the meeting.

Mr. Toelle stated that he runs a tourist business, and he is amazed that he still has tourists during the pandemic. He stated many of them are locals exploring the community. He thanked staff for the presentations given and agreed that the OMA presentation should be given to the FDC every year.

Ms. Harriger thanked staff for the presentations and agreed that the OMA presentation should occur each year. She referenced the FDC's prior work on the Diversity Action Plan (DAP) and stated she looks forward to getting back to work on the Plan. She stated that she would like the FDC to discuss the possibility of using the City's Facebook page on occasion.
