#### **ORDINANCE NO. 5961**

# AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE 2015 OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGETS

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to City Charter Section 5.2, on October 31, 2014, Mayor Eberhart presented a recommended annual operating and capital budget estimate for 2015; and

**WHEREAS,** the proposed budget has been reviewed by the City Finance Committee (CFC) with the active participation of City Department Directors. The CFC's suggested changes to the Mayor's recommended budget are disclosed in the increase (decrease) columns;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows [amendments shown in **bold** font; deleted text or amounts in strikethrough font]:

**SECTION 1.** There is hereby appropriated to the 2015 General Fund and the Capital Fund budgets the following sources of revenue and expenditures in the amounts indicated to the departments named for the purpose of conducting the business of the City of Fairbanks, Alaska, for the fiscal year commencing on January 1, 2015 and ending December 31, 2015 (see pages 2 and 3):

### **RESOLUTION NO. 4652**

# A RESOLUTION STATING THE CITY'S CAPITAL PRIORITIES FOR THE STATE 2015-16 FISCAL YEAR

**WHEREAS**, the City is very grateful for the funding provided by the State of Alaska, which has added significantly to the City's ability to provide essential services; and

**WHEREAS,** many of the services the City provides are centered on protecting the lives and property of the citizens of Fairbanks and preparedness and infrastructure are key in that endeavor; and

**WHEREAS**, the City has identified current capital priorities and the public had the opportunity to speak to this Resolution at the December 1, 2014, City Council meeting,

# NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

The legislative priorities of the City of Fairbanks are stated on the attached list. In summary, the projects are ranked:

- 1. Fuel Storage Tank Replacements and Upgrades \$460,000
- 2. City of Fairbanks Local Road Reconstruction \$15,512,826
- 3. Emergency Service Patrol Funding \$250,000
- 4. Ambulance Replacement to Include Cardiac Emergency Equipment Upgrades \$265,000
- 5. IT Disaster Recovery Site and Police Department Evidence Facility \$2,350,000
- 6. Fire Station 3 Emergency Management Storage \$1,464,000

Project requests total: \$20,305,826

### **City of Fairbanks Proposed Projects**

### 1. Fuel Storage Tank Replacements and Upgrades - \$460,000

The City of Fairbanks requests funds to replace its aging underground fuel storage tanks with a new above ground fuel storage facility with increased capacity.

### 2. City of Fairbanks Local Road Reconstruction - \$15,512,826

The City of Fairbanks requests funds to reconstruct residential streets in six subdivisions where the aging pavement was significantly degraded by the summer 2014 record rainfall. Reconstruction would include drainage improvements. Natural gas lines would also be installed by Fairbanks Natural Gas.

### 3. Emergency Service Patrol Funding \$250,000

Funding would allow, as mandated by Title 47, for continued operation of safe transportation services for incapacitated persons and/or chronic inebriates through 2016. This service expanded city-wide in April 2014.

# **4.** Ambulance Replacement to Include Cardiac Emergency Equipment Upgrades \$265,000 Replacement Ambulance \$175,000

Replace 2003 ambulance. This is the oldest of our four ambulances and when replaced will allow us to place our 2005 third line ambulance into reserve status.

### <u>Upgrade Cardiac Monitors/Defibrillators (3) \$ 90,000</u>

Purchase three cardiac monitors with 12-lead, blood pressure, SpO2, pacing, temperature sensor, batteries, battery chargers and support equipment.

### 5. IT Disaster Recovery Site and Police Department Evidence Facility \$2,350,000

Design, build, and install technologies supporting disaster recovery and continuity of operations in new 60 by 60 foot area to also be used as the evidence locker for large vehicles and equipment.

City of Fairbanks capital budget funds: \$ 220,000

### 6. Fire Station 3 Emergency Management Storage \$1,464,000

Add warm storage area to Fire Station 3 for storage of Homeland Security and Emergency Management Equipment.





There shall be seven voting members of the Public Safety Commission, appointed by the City Mayor and confirmed by the City Council. A chairperson shall be selected from among the voting members and all voting members shall serve three-year terms. One City Council Member shall be a non-voting member of the Commission, nominated by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council. The City shall ensure the following staff are available to attend meetings: Chief of Police or his/her designee; one current police department employee; Fire Chief or his/her designee; one current fire department employee; Emergency Services Dispatch Director or his/her designee; one current dispatch employee.

#### **MEETINGS**

The Public Safety Commission is a Committee operating under the authority as described in Fairbanks General Code 2-471 through 2-474. Meetings of the Commission are held quarterly or on an "as needed" basis and all meetings are open to the public. The Commission does not have the power to meet privately in executive session.
