ORDINANCE NO. 5895

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE CONDITIONAL TRANSFER OF NATURAL GAS UTILITY POWER TO THE FAIRBANKS NORTH STAR BOROUGH

WHEREAS, the need for energy cost relief is paramount for all residents of Interior Alaska, and past efforts to solve the problem have been unsuccessful; and

WHEREAS, the construction of a natural gas pipeline from the North Slope to utilize the stranded gas is a fundamental infrastructure need for the State of Alaska that is long overdue; and

WHEREAS, constructing liquefied natural gas ("LNG") processing facilities on the North Slope and trucking gas to Fairbanks is the most promising short term solution since a gas pipeline is still years away; and

WHEREAS, Flint Hills Resources and Golden Valley Electric Association are jointly working on the construction of an LNG facility that will produce 9 billion cubic feet ("BCF") per year leaving only approximately 2 BCF/year potentially available for space heating; and

WHEREAS, Fairbanks Natural Gas is also planning a North Slope LNG facility that will produce up to 7 BCF/year for space heating needs through an expansion of its existing natural gas distribution system; and

WHEREAS, the Fairbanks North Star Borough is proposing the creation of an Interior Alaska Natural Gas Utility ("IANGU") to explore available public-private partnership options; creation of this utility would require the City of North Pole and the City of Fairbanks to transfer powers to the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough does not currently have the legal authority to create such a utility, but it may acquire that power on an areawide basis if the cities of Fairbanks and North Pole transfer their utility powers to the Borough by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks has made several requests that have been incorporated into the Borough's draft implementing ordinance, including retention of all earnings by the utility financially separating it from the Borough, a change in board member makeup which gives each municipality an appointment to the utility board, and expansion of the "purpose" definition; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks has concerns about the creation of a public utility that could potentially compete with a private sector provider and views IANGU first as a facilitator, second as an implementing corporation that contracts, partners or joint ventures with private

companies, and third as a provider/competitor if services are not currently being provided or if the private entity is unwilling to provide them or will not do so in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks has a long history of running utilities and is very much aware of the difficulties associated with them and the challenges a board faces in controlling costs over a period of time, costs which could be greatly mitigated if the utility, rather than being an operating company, accomplishes its goals by contracting, partnering, and/or joint venturing with private industry, and

WHEREAS, the IANGU could be of upmost help by providing a conduit for low interest financing and grants available to public entities,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

- **Section 1.** The City of Fairbanks transfers to the Fairbanks North Star Borough its power to own and operate a natural gas utility.
- **Section 2.** Transfer of this power is conditioned upon the adoption by the Borough Assembly of an ordinance containing the provisions regarding the management organization as set out in the attached proposed Borough Ordinance No. 2012 52, including:
- a. The City of Fairbanks and the City of North Pole shall each have the right to appoint one board member of the seven member board of directors.
- b. Direct competition in an area covered by a Certificate of Public Convenience & Necessity by the Regulatory Commission of Alaska will not be initiated without approval of the Fairbanks North Star Borough, the City of Fairbanks and the City of North Pole by separate resolutions. In the event such authority is given, IANGU is only authorized to operate via a contract with a private entity unless this option is not available.
- c. Compensation of the IANGU Board of Directors shall not exceed compensation paid to the Assembly Members of the Fairbanks North Star Borough.
 - d. IANGU shall report its activities to the public on at least a quarterly basis.
- e. To the extent the power is not exercised within three years from the date of this ordinance, the City of Fairbanks revokes the unexercised portion of this transfer of power. Any extension must be authorized by a new ordinance.

19	WHEREAS, Article X § 13 of Alaska's Constitution authorizes a city
20	located in a borough to transfer to the borough any of its powers or functions unless
21	prohibited by law or charter; and

23	WHEREAS, both the City of North Pole and the City of Fairbanks are
24	home rule cities authorized to acquire, own and operate public utilities and to exercise
25	all powers and functions necessarily or fairly implied in or incident to that purpose; and

27	WHEREAS, Alaska statutes (AS 29.35.210(d), AS 29.35.300, and AS
28	29.35.310) expressly authorize a second class borough, like the Fairbanks North Star
29	Borough, to exercise on an areawide basis a power acquired by transfer from a city; and

31	WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the citizens of the Fairbanks North
32	Star Borough to create an areawide natural gas utility empowered to ensure its citizens
33	affordable access to natural gas and/or propane; and

35	WHEREAS, an areawide natural gas utility will allow for tax exempt
36	financing, access to governmental funding, and provide transparency of operations; and

38	WHEREAS, the areawide natural gas utility, once established, can explore
39	available public-private partnership options in order to operate in a businesslike, cost-
40	effective manner.

42	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Assembly of the Fairbanks

45	Section 1. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall,

48	Section 2. Approval of Transfer by Cities. The Fairbanks North Star
49	Borough hereby accepts the transfer to the Borough by the City of Fairbanks and the
50	City of North Pole of the power to acquire, own, and operate a natural gas utility. The

11.01.030 **Management**.

- A. There is hereby created a seven member independent and non-partisan Interior Alaska Natural Gas Utility Board of Directors who shall oversee the work necessary to achieve the purpose of the Utility which specifically may include management and operation of a natural gas utility. The Board shall annually elect a chair and may elect other officers from among its members. The Board shall have the authority to adopt and amend bylaws subject to assembly approval. The Board shall report to the Assembly at least quarterly and shall provide an annual report which must include financial statements audited by independent outside auditors.
- B. The initial appointments to the Board shall be made as follows: three by the Borough Mayor, one by the assembly presiding officer, one by the City of North Pole and two by the City of Fairbanks, each confirmed by the respective governing body. Appointments shall be made for staggered terms (as determined by lottery) with two members serving for two years, two serving for three years and three serving for four years with their terms ending when their successors are elected or appointed. Upon the expiration of the first four initial appointed terms of office, their successors shall be elected at large by the voters of the Fairbanks North Star Borough. Upon expiration of the last three initial appointed terms, their successors shall be appointed, one by the Borough Mayor, one by the City of North Pole Mayor and one by the City of Fairbanks Mayor, each subject to confirmation by the respective governing body. After the expiration of their initial terms all shall thereafter serve a term of three years.
- C. The Utility shall be independently managed and operated by the Board of Directors in accordance with prevailing industry practices and general standards common to utilities providing the same utility service. The Board, not the Fairbanks North Star Borough, shall oversee the management of the Utility and shall have the powers necessary or convenient to the management and operation of the Utility. The Borough intends that the Board shall have full authority respecting the Utility unless that

authority is specifically withheld by law or ordinance. During its first year of operation
the Board may request and use, at the discretion of the Mayor, available Borough
resources such as staff and equipment. Thereafter, the Board may not utilize the
resources of the Borough except as authorized by the Assembly. The Board may
contract or act only on behalf of the Utility and not on behalf of the Fairbanks North Star
Borough. The Fairbanks North Star Borough shall not be liable for the debts or liabilities
of the Utility without specific authorization by the Fairbanks North Star Borough
Assembly. No general obligation bonds may be issued without voter approval. The
Board shall maintain a separate account for the Utility which shall be kept and classified
in accordance with uniform accounting standards generally prescribed for public utilities
providing the same utility service. The Board may acquire and dispose of capital
assets.

D. Manager. The Board of Directors may enter into contracts or other agreements to provide for the management and operation or any aspect thereof of the natural gas utility and shall have the authority to appoint a Manager which may be an individual or a private entity.

E. The Board shall have a separate capital and operating budget. Provided that total Utility annual budgeted revenues at least equal total annual budgeted expenses, no further Borough Assembly approval is required. If required, the Borough Assembly shall have approval only over the total budget amount and may not raise or lower any other line item. Earnings shall be retained by the Utility to enable the Utility to meet its purpose of providing affordable natural and/or manufactured gas to the largest number of people in the borough in the shortest amount of time.

Section 6. <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall be effective at 5:00 p.m. of the first Borough business day following its adoption.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND FGC SECTION 58-34 REGARDING LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS

WHEREAS, in 2002, the City amended Article II of Chapter 58 to provide for local improvement districts for services; and

WHEREAS, under the current provisions of FGC Sec. 58-34(a) if a Local Improvement District for services (LID) is created, the City may either provide the services or contract for the services provided; and

WHEREAS, more efficient management of the LID and increased oversight by the property owners within the district might be achieved by transferring the responsibility for management of the LID to a qualified non-government organization,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Fairbanks,

Section 1. FGC Section 58-34(a) is amended by adding a new subsection (e) as follows:

Sec. 58-34(a) Local Improvement Districts for Services.

* * * * *

(e) The City may enter into an agreement with a qualified organization wherein the City would transfer responsibility for operation of a local improvement district for services to that organization, along with the funds collected by the assessment imposed for the district.

WHEREAS, on September 10, 2007, the City of Fairbanks did enter into a Development Agreement with Northside Investors, Limited Partnership, providing for design and construction by the Developer of certain improvements to be conveyed to the public, including the streets and drainage system and street light system; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement provides for the City of Fairbanks to assume ownership, operation, and maintenance of these public improvements; and

WHEREAS, construction of these improvements is complete, and the facility has been inspected and found to meet City standards; and

Approval of the attached resolution is recommended authorizing the Mayor to execute the Warranty Bill of Sale required for accepting public improvements from the Developer in the Northside Business Park (Phase I). As part of the development, located north of the Johansen Expressway just across the intersection of the Johansen Expressway and the Old Steese Highway, certain public improvement have been designed and constructed by the Developer. These improvements include the street and drainage system and a street light system. (Utilities necessary to serve the new subdivision were designed in coordination with public improvements, yet constructed and accepted by the utility companies under separate agreements.)

In order to make these privately funded improvements available to the public, the City of Fairbanks has entered into a Developer Agreement with Northside Investors, LP., to construct these improvements to City standards, and upon completion, to convey the improvements to the City.

Construction of the improvements is now satisfactorily complete, acceptance testing is approved, and the Developer has submitted a Warranty Bill of Sale requesting conveyance. City Council acceptance is requested.

WARRANTY BILL OF SALE

BE IT KNOWN, that pursuant to Section 1.17 of the Developer Agreement for NORTHSIDE BUSINESS PARK entered into by the parties hereto dated September 10, 2007, and for good and sufficient consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, NORTHSIDE INVESTORS, LIMITED PARTNERSHIP, 1080 Woodview Dr., Fairbanks, Alaska, 99712, hereinafter referred to as Seller, does hereby sell, transfer and deliver to the City of Fairbanks, hereinafter referred to as City, a municipal corporation of the State of Alaska, with address for purposes hereof of 800 Cushman Street, Fairbanks, Alaska 99701-4615, and to its successor and assigns, the following described chattels and personal property.

Section 1. The following described public improvements are hereby conveyed to the City.

A. STREET AND DRAINAGE SYSTEM: Phase I portion of the public street system will include approximately 1,520 linear feet of paved streets according to the Replat of Tract C, Bentley Trust North Subdivision, Plat No. 2006-188, recorded as Fairbanks Plat No. 2012-38, dated June 13, 2012. The southern portion of Northside Boulevard between the Johansen Expressway and Harold Bentley Avenue is approximately 320 feet in length and shall consist of a 3-lane to 4-lane divided street with concrete median. The northern portion of Northside Boulevard is expected to be constructed as part of future phases. This phase of Harold Bentley Avenue is approximately 1,200 feet in length and is also a paved three-lane facility having 12 foot lanes with 2 foot shoulders (totaling 40 foot paved width). Its typical section contains a continuous 2% cross slope draining north to a drainage easement along the north side of Harold Bentley Avenue typically containing a flat bottom ditch.

Pedestrian facilities currently include a 6 foot wide sidewalk with curb and gutter on the west side of Northside Boulevard and a portion of Harold Bentley Avenue in front of the sewer lift station. Additional curb, gutter and sidewalk is being constructed by others in the development of their frontage within this platted area.

Associated public traffic signing (includes regulatory signs and street name signs at the intersection of Northside Boulevard and Harold Bentley Avenue) and traffic markings are also provided.

The storm drain system includes 2 each 18-inch diameter cross culverts to convey drainage from Northside Boulevard beneath Harold Bentley Avenue to a continuous flat bottom ditch along the north side of Harold Bentley Avenue. Surface water runoff collected on Harold Bentley Avenue also drains into the roadside ditch along the north side of Harold Bentley Avenue.

NORTHSIDE BUSINESS PARK

B. STREET LIGHT SYSTEMS: The public street lighting system includes four 250 watt high pressure sodium roadway type luminaires mounted on metal standards at the intersection of Northside Boulevard and Harold Bentley Avenue and along Northside Boulevard with associated hardware, load center, buried junction boxes, and underground circuitry.

Section 2. With the limitations hereinafter provided, the Seller warrants to the City that they are vested with good and sufficient title to said property, that they have full authority to sell and transfer said property and that said property is free and clear of all liens, encumbrances, liabilities and adverse claims of whatsoever nature except for drainage easements shown on plat number 2012-38 filed in the Fairbanks Recording District.

Section 3. The Seller further warrants to the City that it will fully defend, protect, indemnify and hold harmless the City and its successor and assigns from any adverse claims thereto.

Section 4. The warranty covenants provided in Sections 2 and 3, above, or that may otherwise be implied, are limited to conveyance of the improvements described in Section 1.

ORDINANCE NO. 5898

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A DOWNTOWN LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

WHEREAS, in 2002, the City amended Article II of Chapter 58 to provide for local improvement districts for services for the purpose of providing and financing supplemental public services which are not generally provide by the City or provided at a different level than generally provided by the City; and

WHEREAS, residents and business owners in the downtown area expressed a desire to form a local improvement district for services, specifically to fund the Clean Team and the Community Service Patrol; and

WHEREAS, a committee was formed to explore the possibility of forming a local improvement district in the downtown area; this proposed ordinance represents the recommendations of that committee; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that there is a necessity for a local improvement district for services as set out in the plan attached hereto,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Fairbanks,

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Council hereby creates a local improvement district for services according to the Local Improvement District for Services Plan (Attachment "A") which is incorporated by reference as part of this ordinance.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Mayor shall enter into a Letter of Agreement with a qualified organization for the purpose of transferring responsibility for the operation of the local improvement district, as created by this ordinance, and transferring all funds accessed under the Plan to that organization. The services as described in the Plan are not to be performed by City employees.

<u>Section 3</u>. The City Clerk is directed to publish notice and to provide written notice to all property owners within the local improvement district as specified in the Fairbanks General Code and according to the timeline outlined in the Plan.

Section 4. This ordinance is subject to City Charter Section 9.2 and FGC Sec. 58-39 and will not become effective until the period for filing objections has ended.

ATTACHMENT "A" to Ordinance No. 5898

LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT FOR SERVICES PLAN

Duration of the LID

This LID shall be created for a term of two years, subject to FGC Section 58-34(a)(b) [a local improvement district created for a definite term may be dissolved or extended beyond the end of the specified term by the property owners who would bear more than 50 percent of the estimated cost of the service].

Period for Filing Objections

FGC Sec. 58-39 provides that after publication of notice of the council's action to establish a LID, owners of property within the district may file objections to the plan. The period for filing objections may not be less than 30 days. The period for filing objections to this LID shall be extended until March 30, 2013.

Advisory Committee

An advisory committee, composed of property owners within the district and appointed by the Mayor, will be formed to monitor the provision of services and monitor the management of the LID. The committee will also advise the Mayor on the selection of the managing organization and on the terms of the agreement between the City and the managing organization.

Management and Oversight

The management of this Local Improvement District for Services (hereinafter "LID") will be performed by a qualified, non-governmental organization. The Mayor shall enter into a letter of agreement with such an organization to provide for the transfer of responsibility for the operation of the LID. The letter of agreement shall also provide for the transfer to the organization of the funds collected pursuant to the LID assessment.

The managing organization will be responsible for insuring that the LID services are provided. The managing organization shall comply with the insurance requirements set out in FGC Sec. 58-34(a)(a)(2). All LID services will be provided by private sector workers and not by employees of the City of Fairbanks. The managing organization will provide the mayor and the advisory committee with biannual reports on its budget and the provision of services.

The City will be reimbursed from the LID assessment for staff time incurred in billing and collecting LID assessments.

LID Services

The services provided for in this LID are the "Clean Team" and the "Community Service Patrol" (CSP). These services are more fully described as follows:

<u>Clean Team</u>. The Clean Team services shall include the following:

Summer season –

Litter pick-up in designated boundaries Sidewalk sweeping Sidewalk cleaning/scrubbing Litter vacuuming Weed control on sidewalks

Essential sanitary cleanup

Graffiti removal

Downtown Transportation Center deck sweeping/scrubbing

Downtown Transportation Center bird sanitary cleanup

Assistance with special event set-up/clean-up (contracted by event organizers)

Winter season –

Litter pick-up in designated boundaries

Sidewalk snow clearing

Ice and hard-pack clearing

Winter lighting maintenance (ground level)

Essential sanitary cleanup

Graffiti removal

Downtown Transportation Center deck sweeping/scrubbing

Downtown Transportation Center sanitary cleanup

Assistance with special events set-up/clean-up (contracted by event organizers)

<u>Community Service Patrol</u>. The CSP services shall include the following:

Foot patrol within the district's foot patrol boundary Call-out by van within district boundary Make transports to Detox, FMH, FCC or home, including Housing First Respond to requests from FPD and FFD

Cost of Administration and Services

The LID assessment will be a fixed amount **not to exceed \$200,000.00**, with the final amount of the assessment to be determined by the Mayor based upon the guidance of the advisory committee and the final terms of the letter of agreement with the managing organization.

Method of Payment for the LID

The LID will be funded by an assessment against the real property parcels located within the LID boundary based upon the assessed value of the <u>land</u> according to the following formula:

Assessed Land Value* (ALV) x .____ (rate) = \$ Total Assessment

The 2012 ALV for parcels within the LID boundary = \$15,057,059.00

Assuming the **maximum** LID assessment amount of \$200,000, the LID assessment rate would be 0.01328

(\$15,057,059 x. 0.01328 = \$199,957.74)

*ALV based upon the FNSB's assessment for the previous year




With a starting point of 1st Avenue and Wickersham Street, south on Wickersham to 4th Avenue, then east on 4th Avenue to Barnette Street, then south on Barnette to 8th Avenue, then east on 8th Avenue to Cushman Street, then north on Cushman to 7th Avenue, then east on 7th Avenue to Lacey Street, then north on Lacey to 4th Avenue, then east on 4th Avenue to Noble Street, then north on Noble to 1st Avenue, then east on 1st to the south bank of the Chena River, then west following the course of the Chena River to the Centennial Bridge, then across the Chena via the bridge to the north bank of the Chena, then east following the course of the Chena to Slough Street, then north on Slough Street to Church Street, then west on Church to Illinois Street, then south on Illinois to Terminal Street, then west on Terminal to River Street on a line that includes all of the parking area for the Borough Administrative building, then south on River Street to the north bank of the Chena, then east following the course of the Chena to the Barnette Street bridge, then across the Chena via the bridge to 1st Avenue, then west to the point of beginning at 1st and Wickersham.

ORDINANCE NO. 5899

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND FGC SECTION 58-34(a) REGARDING LIMITS ON FUNDING FOR LOCAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS FOR SERVICES

WHEREAS, in 2002, the City amended Article II of Chapter 58 to provide for local improvement districts for services; and

WHEREAS, FGC Sec. 58-34(a)(c) provides that the costs of administering and operating local improvement districts must be paid entirely from the district's assessment revenues, fees, grants or donations but not by either general fund or generally levied municipal tax revenues; and

WHEREAS, in 2010, the Council amended FGC Sec. 74-117(c)(4) to provide funding for the Community Service Patrol (CSP) in the amount of \$50,000 per year for the years 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014. This funding was appropriated from the City's 22.5% share of hotel/motel tax revenue, required a cash match of \$140,000, and required that the CSP engage in tactical coordination with the Fairbanks Police Department; and

WHEREAS, a limited improvement district for services, which would fund the Clean Team and the CSP, is being proposed for the downtown area of Fairbanks; and

WHEREAS, the funding limitation in FGC Sec. 58-34(a)(c) would curtail the funding for the CSP from hotel/motel tax funds if the limited improvement district for services is established; and

WHEREAS, one of the purposes of creating a local improvement district in the downtown area is to transition away from City government assisted funding for the CSP; and

WHEREAS, retaining the limited time funding of the CSP from the hotel/motel tax will aid in that transition,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Fairbanks,

<u>Section 1</u>. FGC Section 58-34(a)(c) is amended as follows [new language in <u>bold/underline</u> font; deleted language in <u>strikethrough</u> font]:

Sec. 58-34(a) Local improvement districts for services.

* * * * *

(c) Costs of administering and operating local improvement districts shall be paid entirely from the district's assessment revenues, fees, grants or donations <u>and may but</u> not <u>be paid</u> by either general fund or generally levied municipal tax revenues <u>unless</u> <u>such revenues are specifically appropriated by the Council for a service provided by the local improvement district.</u>

Ms. Stiver cautioned outside interest groups on lobbying committee members on their personal time and stated that it is not appreciated.

Ms. Lavery shared the email she received from Mr. van den Berg and stated that she felt the information should not be shared with only one Committee member. She stated that if she receives more information from outside sources, she will share that with the Committee also. She stated her belief that it is not the Committee's duty to lobby property owners or direct the district to a certain organization.

Mr. Ewers spoke to the draft ordinances in the packet. He stated that no changes had been made to the ordinance creating a LID since the last regular meeting. He spoke to the changes on the ordinance to amend FGC 58-34 and stated that Attachement "A" has not been modified since the last meeting.

Members discussed possible changes and additions to Attachment "A" of the ordiannce to amend FGC 58-34.

Mr. Ewers indicated that it may be a good idea to keep the ordinance to amend FGC 58-34 generalized so that it would apply to all future LID's. He stated that the second ordinance to create a LID could be specific to this particular district.

Members spoke to forming a Committee made up of property owners to advise the Mayor on the distribution of funds.

Mr. Ewers clarified the working mechanisms of the district. He explained that the tax dollars would come into the City and the Mayor would have the power to contract out the services. He stated that he envisions an advisory committee made up of property owners who would counsel the Mayor, but that the City administration would still hold the authority for the LID. He stressed the importance of allowing the Mayor the flexibility and discretion to administer the LID as he sees fit.

Ms. Stiver stated that she would like the ordinance to create a local improvement district to be more straightforward, allowing more consistency due to the inevitable changes in City administration. She agreed that an advisory committee made up of property owners would be a good thing to have in place.

Ms. Lavery spoke to advisory committees and their role in local government.

Mr. Miller, seconded by Ms. Mongold, moved to INTRODUCE the Ordinance to Amend FGC Section 58-34 at the Next Regular City Council Meeting.

Mr. Miller, seconded by Ms. Mongold, moved to APPROVE the Regular Meeting Minutes of September 14, 2012.

Ms. Stiver called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

Members discussed the revised letters of education drafted by Mr. Ewers and Mr. Miller.

Mr. Ewers spoke to the outline he drafted explaining the legal and procedural aspects of the LID. He stated that the information in the document is based on the current City Code pertaining to Local Improvement Districts and could be sent to property owners for reference purposes.

Mr. Miller stated that both letters are intended only to inform property owners of the possible creation of a LID. He added that this is the first step in the process to create the district.

Ms. Stiver called for objection as to the content of the letters of education to property owners and, seeing none, declared them APPROVED.

Members discussed the merger of the Downtown Association and Festival Fairbanks. Ms. Lavery stated that she does not feel comfortable moving forward until the merger has been completed and until the organization to perform the services has been specified. Mr. Miller and Mr. Rostad spoke in support of moving the ordinance to create a LID forward.

Ms. Stiver spoke to the flexibility of the ordinance to create a LID in that it allows for any non-governmental organization to contract with the City for LID services. She indicated that it is likely that a merged Festival Fairbanks and the Fairbanks Downtown Association (DTA) would be the best candidate to perform the clean and safe services because of their experience with the program and their ability to obtain funding from other sources. Ms. Stiver explained that since the merger has not yet taken place, it is important to leave the "qualified organization" unnamed in the ordinance. She stated that there needs to be an advisory committee in place to supervise the tax dollars, no matter what organization enters into a letter of agreement with the City. She asked Mr. van den Berg if the DTA has any intention of funding the Clean Team to keep it in operation until the end of the calendar year.

Mr. van den Berg stated that the DTA reviewed the opportunity to assume the Clean Team about six weeks ago, but the Board felt that it would be best to wait until the merger was complete in January, 2013.

Ms. Lavery expressed her support for the LID program, but expressed concern that the timing is off. She stated that there are too many unknowns and that she would feel more comfortable addressing the creation of the LID once the merger between Festival Fairbanks and DTA was complete.

Mr. Miller stated that if the LID were to be created right now, it would give local businesses and organizations fiscal certainty. He indicated that the details of the LID could be worked out by the Mayor and the LID Advisory Board at a later date.

Mr. Rostad stated that the mission of the LID Committee was to lay out a plan for the formation of the LID to perform the clean and safe services. He stated that the Committee has concluded that the LID is a good idea and that it should be the City Mayor's responsibility to enter into a letter of agreement with a qualified organization for the clean and safe services.

Ms. Stiver stated that the Committee has fulfilled its original purpose, which was to provide a recommendation to the Council on the viability of a LID. She indicated that it may be best to wait on entering into a letter of agreement until after the merger takes place.

Mr. Miller suggested that input from the property owners should be solicited sooner rather than later. He explained that there could still be a delay in the letter of agreement, but that the LID could not evolve without the support of the property owners. He stated that if the program is going to be shot down by property owners, it would be best to know as soon as possible.

Ms. Lavery spoke to the importance of having someone champion the idea of the LID and to educate the downtown property owners on the benefits of the district.

Ms. Mongold spoke to completing the ordinance to create a LID and getting it forwarded to the City Council for approval.

Mr. Miller suggested that the Committee focus on the ordinance and leave discussion on the letters of education till later.

Ms. Stiver called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

Mr. Miller asked Ms. Snider if a total assessment value had been determined by the Committee.

Ms. Snider replied that there had never been a formal motion made to determine the total assessment value or mill rate for the LID.

Members discussed the LID's total annual budget, including administrative costs to the City.

City CFO Jim Soileau stated that, based on the total assessment value in Attachment "A," the mill rate would have to be set at 23.73 mills in order to come up with \$200,000 annually.

Ms. Mongold stated that the land values appear to be inaccurate on the spreadsheet in Attachment "A."

Mr. Ewers explained that the assessment numbers in Attachment "A" were pulled directly from the Borough's GIS system using the district boundary that the Committee had agreed upon. He stated that he and Ms. Snider did not have time to compare the land assessment numbers to the property database for accuracy. He stated that each property would have to be checked individually against the actual land assessments before an accurate total LID assessment could be reached.

Ms. Stiver asked if local, state and federal properties could be taxed under the LID.

Mr. Ewers replied that state law says that state and federal properties are subject to special assessments for capital improvements, but does not speak to special assessments for services. He stated that he had spoken with the Municipal Attorney in Anchorage to see how they dealt with government properties in their downtown local improvement district. He stated that they exempted state and federal properties from their district tax. Mr. Ewers stated that government properties in the Fairbanks downtown area would have to be assessed by the City because the Borough does not assess or tax them.

Ms. Stiver asked Mr. Ewers if the Committee needs to set a fixed number or if they can just make a recommendation.

Mr. Ewers replied that the Committee needs to decide on either a mill rate or a fixed total assessment value for the district. He suggested that the Committee set a maximum assessment value instead of a minimum to prevent over-taxation.

Ms. Lavery asked where the \$200,000 in tax revenue would be spent.

Ms. Stiver stated that the revenue would be used to cover administrative costs to the City and to operate the Clean Team and CSP programs.

Ms. Engfer clarified that Festival Fairbanks has only sold one piece of the Clean Team's equipment.

Mr. Rostad asked what would happen to the surplus if the programs successfully operated with a budget of less than \$200,000.

Ms. Stiver stated that the Committee could recommend that if there was a substantial surplus, the money could be given back to the taxpayers. She indicated that the Advisory Board should be responsible for reviewing the program's financials regularly to keep collections in line with the projected budget.

Ms. Mongold pointed out that the total assessment value could be lower than the maximum of \$200,000.

Mr. Miller, seconded by Ms. Mongold, moved to SET the total cost of administration and services for the LID at a fixed maximum amount of \$200,000.

Ms. Stiver declared the MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Rostad, moved to AMEND Attachment "A" "Method of Payment for the LID" by striking "the real property parcels" and replacing with "the land property values as determined by the FNSB on the previous fiscal year's assessment for properties."

Ms. Stiver declared the MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Ewers clarified that the boundaries set forth in Attachment "A" directly correspond with the minimum district boundary decided by the Committee at a previous meeting. He explained that there was a questionable boundary line behind the Borough Administrative Building and that he set the boundary to include the Borough's parking area, which is what he believed was the Committee's intent. He added that the boundaries also include the new Barnette Street Bridge.

Mr. Miller agreed that Mr. Ewers had captured those boundaries correctly.

Mr. Miller asked what would happen at the end of the two-year period. He suggested that there be some automatic mechanism in place that would allow the district to continue without pause.

Mr. Ewers stated that at the end of the two-year period, two things could happen: 1. Notices could be sent to property owners giving them an opportunity to object to the district's continuance; or, 2. Fifty percent or more of property owners (by land value) could petition the City Council to kill the LID.

Ms. Lavery spoke in support of sending notices to property owners at the end of the two-year period and allowing for objections to be filed.

Ms. Lavery, seconded by Mr. Rostad, moved to REQUIRE that property owners be notified of their opportunity to object at the end of the two-year period; and, should the district continue, that its second term be for a period of three years.

Mr. Ewers informed the Committee that if the LID term is set at two years, it will require Council action to continue beyond that time period. He explained that if the Council approved its continuance, that action would trigger the objection period.

Ms. Lavery, with the concurrence of the second, WITHDREW her motion to require that property owners be notified of their opportunity to object at the end of the two-year period; and, should the district continue, that its second term be for a period of three years.

Ms. Lavery, seconded by Ms. Mongold, moved to INTRODUCE the ordinance to create a LID, as amended, at the next Regular City Council Meeting on October 8, 2012.

A ROLL CALL VOTE WAS TAKEN ON THE MOTION TO INTRODUCE THE ORDINANCE TO CREATE A LID, AS AMENDED, AT THE REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING ON OCTOBER 8, 2012 AS FOLLOWS:

Ms. Stiver declared the MOTION CARRIED.

Ms. Stiver thanked all those who participated in the LID meetings. She stated that she will draft a recommendation letter to the Council and send it to all Committee members for review.

Mr. Miller asked about the letters of education and who would be responsible for sending them to property owners.

Ms. Stiver indicated that the education should be performed by the Advisory Board.

Ms. Snider clarified that the content of the letters of education had been approved by the Committee, but that Members did not specify what to do with the letters.

Ms. Mongold, seconded by Mr. Rostad, moved to FORWARD the letters of education to the LID Advisory Board.

Ms. Stiver called for objection and, hearing none, so ORDERED.

Mr. Ewers informed the Committee that the City of Fairbanks would be prohibited from contributing to a Local Improvement District from its General Fund under the current City Code. He stated that it does not prohibit the City from giving money to a LID through the Bed Tax Discretionary Fund. Discussion was given to the City's current annual contribution of \$50,000 to the CSP program.

Mr. Soileau spoke to the \$50,000 contribution to CSP and stated that, technically, it is being withdrawn from the City's General Fund instead of being taken from the 22.5% the City receives in Bed Tax moneys. He stated that the Council approved the \$50,000 appropriation to come from the General Fund in the last budget cycle.

Ms. Stiver stated that she remembered there being something specified in the Code as to where the \$50,000 would come from.

Janey Hovenden, City Clerk, confirmed that the provision for the \$50,000 is in the Code.

Mr. Ewers quoted the Section 74-117(c)(4) of the FGC that states, "From the City's 22.5 percent under (1), \$50,000 annually shall be granted for the community service patrol for 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014 only."

Mr. Miller asked for the section of City Code that prohibits the City from contributing to a LID from the General Fund.

Ms. Mongold replied that page three and four of Ordinance No. 5481 speaks to LID contributions by the City.

Mr. Ewers explained that the Council is permitted by Code to appropriate moneys as they see fit. He stated that, unless the Council re-appropriates the money again in 2013, the \$50,000 will be taken from the 22.5% and there will not be a problem.

Mr. Ewers asked for the Committee's wishes on whether or not to tax government entities and non-profit organizations within the LID.

Mr. Miller stated that he believes it was the Committee's intent to tax only those properties assessed by the Fairbanks North Star Borough.

Mr. Ewers asked for clarification on what percentage of the total LID assessment should go toward the City's administrative costs.

Ms. Stiver replied that administrative costs are typically 5-10%.

Mr. Ewers indicated that the City Council could address the issue of administrative costs.
