Sec. 86-77. - Application for chauffeur's license.

All applications for issuance or renewal of a chauffeur's license shall be made upon forms provided for this purpose by the city clerk, and the applications shall be submitted to the city clerk for review. The applicant shall also submit a current criminal history report obtained from the state department of public safety if a state resident or, if not, a current record obtained from the state of residency, and a current driving record. The requirements to be fulfilled prior to issuance of a chauffeur's license shall be as follows:

- The applicant must be 21 years of age or older and furnish proof if requested.
- (2) The applicant must be able to read, write and speak the English language.
- (3) The applicant must be in possession of a current Alaska State Driver's License.
- (4) The applicant must not have had a conviction within 24 months of:
 - a. A moving traffic violation which results in suspension or revocation of the applicant's driver's license pursuant to AS 28.15.221 through 28.15.261;
 - b. Reckless or negligent driving;
 - c. Driving while license is limited, suspended or revoked;
- (5) The applicant must not have had his driver's license suspended or revoked within two years prior to the application date.
- (6) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the applicant must not have had a felony conviction within eight years or a misdemeanor conviction within four years of:
 - a. Prostitution or promotion of prostitution;
 - b. Any offense under AS Title 11, Chapter 71 Controlled Substances,
 - c. Any felony or misdemeanor which includes as an element the use or threat of force upon a person;
 - d. Burglary, felony larceny, fraud or embezzlement;
 - e. Any sexual offense;
 - f. Any homicide or assault involving operation of a motor vehicle;
 - g. Two separate felony convictions of any type;
 - h. Operation or driving a vehicle while intoxicated within five years or within eight years for a felony conviction;
 - i. Refusal to submit to a chemical test as defined in AS 28.35.032 within five years or within eight years for a felony conviction.
- (7) The applicant must not be addicted to the use of intoxicants or narcotics.
- (8) The applicant must be of good moral character and repute, to be evidenced by two affidavits of respectable citizens who personally know the applicant.
- (9) The applicant must not be a sex offender or kidnapper subject to the registration requirements of AS Title 12, Chapter 63.

The applicant is entitled to an informal conference with either the director or the board and, if not satisfied by the informal conference, is entitled to a formal hearing in accordance with AS 44.62.330-44.62-630. IF THE APPLICANT REQUESTS A HEARING, THE LOCAL GOVERNING BODY MUST ASSIST IN OR UNDERTAKE THE DEFENSE OF ITS PROTEST.

Under AS 04.11.420(a), the board may not issue a license or permit for premises in a municipality where a zoning regulation or ordinance prohibits the sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages, unless a variance of the regulation or ordinance has been approved. Under AS 04.11.420(b) municipalities must inform the board of zoning regulations or ordinances which prohibit the sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages. If a municipal zoning regulation or ordinance prohibits the sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages at the proposed premises and no variance of the regulation or ordinance has been approved, please notify us and provide a certified copy of the regulation or ordinance if you have not previously done so.




Licensed Premises Diagram





ORDINANCE NO. 5876

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTERS 14, 46, AND 78 TO REPEAL, AMEND, AND CLARIFY CERTAIN OFFENSES

WHEREAS, certain offenses under the Fairbanks Code that are currently misdemeanors could be handled more efficiently and without any detriment to public safety as violations; and

WHEREAS, certain offenses under the Code are duplicative of offenses found in State criminal and traffic statutes; and

WHEREAS, there are certain ordinances currently in the Fairbanks Code that have become outdated or have been held unconstitutional since the time they were first enacted,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

SECTION 1. That Fairbanks General Code Chapter 14, is amended as follows [new text is in **bold/underlined** font; deleted text is in **strike out** font]:

Sec. 14-171. Illegal Presence

- (a) A person may not knowingly enter or remain on premises:
 - (1) In which alcoholic beverages are manufactured, sold, offered for sale, possessed for sale or barter, trafficked in or bartered in violation of:
 - a. AS 04.11.010;
 - b. AS 04.16.090; or
 - c. A municipal ordinance adopted under AS 04.21.010(a) or (b); or
 - (2) Licensed under state law during hours in which the person's presence on the premises is a violation of a city ordinance adopted under authority of AS 04.16.010(d) providing for hours of closure that are outside the hours of closure prescribed by AS 04.16.010(c).
- (b) A person who violates this section is guilty of a <u>violation</u> misdemeanor, punishable <u>by a maximum fine of \$500</u> as provided in section 1-15. <u>This</u> offense is amenable to disposition without court appearance upon payment

and forfeiture of a bail amount of \$150, plus the surcharge imposed by the State of Alaska under AS 12.55.039.

Sec. 14-177. Indecent exposure in premises holding any alcohol license.

REPEALED.

SECTION 2. That Fairbanks General Code Chapter 46 is amended as follows [new text is in **bold/underlined** font; deleted text is in **strike out** font]:

Sec. 46-4. Penalties.

* * * * *

- (c) A person convicted of any of the following offenses shall be punished by a fine only of not more than \$450.00:
 - (1) Section 46-43 Soliciting business on residential premises Section 46-41(a) Disorderly Conduct.
 - (2) <u>Section 46-42(a) Disturbing the peace</u>

- (d) A person convicted of any of the following offenses shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500.00 or by imprisonment for not more than five days or both such fine and imprisonment:
 - (1) Section 46-41(b) Disorderly conduct
 - (2) Section 46-42(b) Disturbing the peace
 - (3) Section 46-80 Drinking in public
 - (3) Section 46-257 Urinating in public

Sec. 46-41. Disorderly Conduct.

- (a) A person commits the offense of disorderly conduct if he: No person may
 - (a) $\mathbf{R}_{\text{recklessly}}$ blocks the entry or exit of any public or private building \mathbf{or}

- (b) After being informed by a police officer that his conduct is in violation of subsection (a), refuses to clear the entry or exit of the public or private building.
- (b) No person may recklessly insult, taunt or challenge another person in a manner likely to offend or provoke a violent response.

Sec. 46-42. Disturbing the peace.

- (a) A person commits the offense of disturbing the peace if he:
 - (1) In a public place, repeatedly or continuously shouts, blows a horn, plays a musical or recording or amplifying instrument, or otherwise generates loud sound or noise with the intent to disturb or in reckless disregard of the peace and privacy of others.
 - (2) In a private place, engages in the conduct described in subsection (a)(1) of this section, with the same intent or reckless disregard, after having been informed by another that the conduct is disturbing the peace and privacy of others not in the same place.
 - (3) Between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., operates or uses a pile driver, pneumatic hammer, bulldozer, road grader, loader, power shovel, derrick, backhoe, power saw, manual hammer, motorcycle, snow machine or other instrument, appliance or vehicle which generates loud sounds or noise, after having been informed by another that such operation or use is disturbing the peace and privacy of others.
 - (4) Keeps any dog or other animal which is allowed to engage in frequent or prolonged barking or other loud noise-producing activity, after having been informed by another that such frequent or prolonged barking or noise-producing activity is disturbing the peace and privacy of others.
 - (5) Repeatedly or continuously sounds any horn or other soundproducing warning device on a motor vehicle when such repeated or continued sounding is not necessary to warn of any danger.

(b) After being informed by a police officer that his conduct is in violation of subsection (a), refuses to abate the prohibited activity.

(c) As used in subsections (a)(1) and (a)(2) of this section:

- (1) "Loud sound" in a public place means sound which is loud enough to inhibit the ability of a not unduly sensitive person in the same place to speak freely without leaving the same place.
- (2) "Loud sound" in a private place means sound which is loud enough to awaken a not unduly sensitive person in another private place.
- (3) The inside and outside of buildings and separate residences within an apartment house, and separate rooms within a hotel are different places.
- (d) As used in subsections (a)(3) and (a)(4) of this section, loud sound or loud noise is sound or noise which would awaken, or cause difficulty in sleeping for, the average, not unduly sensitive individual attempting to sleep in any house, apartment, hotel, motel or other residence in the vicinity of the sound or noise-producing activity.
- (e) The following sound or noise is not prohibited by this section:
 - (1) Noise of safety signals, warning devices and emergency pressure relief valves when used for their warning of emergency purposes.
 - (2) Noise produced by any authorized emergency vehicle when responding to an emergency call or when otherwise authorized by law or ordinance to activate its sirens or other warning devises.
 - (3) Noises necessarily produced in the course of work required to protect persons or property from an-imminent peril.
 - (4) Noise produced by any activity for which a permit has been issued pursuant to subsection (**ef**) of this section.
- (f) Applications for a permit for relief from the application of this section to any activity on the basis of undue hardship may be made to the mayor or his duly authorized representative. A non-refundable application fee and a permit fee₂ as set forth in the city's schedule of fees and charges for services, will be charged for the city's processing of an application. Any permit granted by the mayor under this subsection shall contain all conditions upon which such permit has been granted and shall specify a reasonable time that the permit shall be effective. The mayor or duly authorized representative may grant the relief as applied for if he finds that:
 - (1) Additional time is necessary for the applicant to alter or modify his activity or operation to comply with this section; or

- (2) The activity, operation or noise source will be of a temporary duration, and cannot be done in a manner that would comply with other paragraphs of this section; and
- (3) No other reasonable alternative is available to the applicant.

However, the mayor may prescribe any conditions or requirements he deems necessary to minimize adverse effects upon the community or the surrounding neighborhood.

- (a) No person operating or in control of a parked or moving motor vehicle shall operate or permit the operation of an electronically amplified sound system in or on the motor vehicle so as to produce sound that is clearly audible more than 50 feet from the motor vehicle.
- (b) Any person violating the provisions of this section shall pay a <u>fine</u> eivil penalty of \$50.00 for the first violation or date of violation, <u>and</u> \$300.00 for the second <u>and any subsequent</u> violation<u>s</u> within six months of the first violation, and \$1,000.00 for the third violation within one year of the first violation.

- (c) Any authorized police officer may issue a citation for any violation under this section, except they may arrest for instances when the alleged violator refuses to provide the officer with such person's name and address and any proof as may be reasonably available to the alleged violator.
- (d) The following sound or noise is not prohibited by this section:
 - (1) Noise of safety signals, warning devices and emergency pressure relief valves when used for their warning of emergency purposes.
 - (2) Noise produced by any authorized emergency vehicle when responding to an emergency call or when otherwise authorized by law or ordinance to activate its sirens or other warning devices.
 - (3) Noises produced by vehicles for the purpose of advertising commercial or political messages.

Sec. 46-257. Urinating in public.

- (a) A person commits the offense of urinating in public if he urinates on any portion of a public place not existing for the purpose of receiving urine.
- (b) A person convicted under this section shall be punished by a fine only if the person has not been previously convicted under this section or has only been convicted once. The fine for a first or second offense is \$150.00.
- (c) A person convicted more than two times under this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500, by imprisonment of not more than five days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

ORDINANCE NO. 5877

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A LAND EXCHANGE BETWEEN THE GREATER FAIRBANKS COMMUNITY HOSPITAL FOUNDATION AND THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS TO FACILITATE VACATION OF 11TH AVENUE AND TO PROVIDE PARKING ADJACENT TO FIRE STATION HEADQUARTERS

WHEREAS, the City owns the land underlying the streets within the original Townsite of Fairbanks by virtue of Deed from the Townsite Trustee; and

WHEREAS, The Greater Fairbanks Community Hospital Foundation, Inc. (GFCHF), seeks to vacate a portion of a City-owned right of way, comprising that portion of 11th Avenue lying east of the Noble Street, for the purpose of increased traffic safety and parking expansion as shown on "Exhibit A" (attached); and

WHEREAS, the City seeks to acquire additional land adjacent to the Fire Station Headquarters at 1101 Cushman to satisfy a parking shortfall; and

- **WHEREAS**, GFCHF owns vacant Lot 6A, Block 122, adjoining the Fire Station Headquarters; and
- **WHEREAS,** GFCHF and the City have agreed to a like-kind exchange of lands, in which the vacated portion of 11th Avenue will be exchange for a portion of Lot 6A, to be created by subdivision, as shown on "Exhibit B" (attached); and
- **WHEREAS**, the Administration has determined that the exchange parcels each has a value of approximately \$60,000; and
- **WHEREAS**, each party will bear its own costs of survey and administration as may be required to effect this exchange; and
- **WHEREAS**, real estate exchange is unique by nature and not subject to public offering; and
- **WHEREAS**, Fairbanks General Code Section 70-45 Property Exchanges authorizes the Council to approve such exchanges when in the judgment of the Council it is advantageous for the City to do so,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

SECTION 1. That a Real Estate Purchase and Sale Agreement approved by the City Attorney shall be used to set forth the particulars in this real estate exchange.


SECTION 2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute said Agreement and all such other legal documents as may be necessary to complete the transaction on behalf of the City.



ORDINANCE NO. 5878

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE III, DIVISION 8, LANDSCAPE REVIEW AND BEAUTIFICATION COMMISSION AND FGC SECTIONS 10-436, 438, 439, AND 441 OF THE FAIRBANKS LANDSCAPE ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, The Landscape Review and Beautification Commission was established by Ordinance No. 5566 in 2004; and

WHEREAS, that ordinance also created the Landscape Review Board from within the Commission's membership; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has fulfilled its role in preparing a Landscape Manual for use by the Building Department; and

WHEREAS, during Fairbanks' short construction season, review of landscaping plans by the Commission is often not practicable; and

WHEREAS, the functions of the Landscape Review Board are still valuable and are retained within this ordinance under the new name of the Fairbanks Landscape Review and Appeals Commission; and

WHEREAS, the proposed changes to Chapter 2, Art. III, Div. 8 will require amendments to related sections of the Fairbanks Landscape Ordinance (FGC Sections 10-435 – 441),

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

SECTION 1. That Fairbanks General Code Chapter 2, Article III, Division 8 Landscape Review and Beautification Commission is amended as follows [new text is in **bold/underlined** font; deleted text is in **strike out** font]:

ARTICLE III. Boards and Commissions

DIVISION 8. LANDSCAPE REVIEW AND <u>APPEALS</u> <u>BEAUTIFICATION</u> COMMISSION

Sec. 2-371. Created.

- (a) There is created a landscape review and <u>appeals</u> <u>beautification</u> commission consisting of <u>fivenine</u> members, serving without compensation, to be appointed by the mayor subject to confirmation by the city council.
- (b) At least **three**five members of the commission shall be residents of the city or own property or operate a business within the city limits. The membership of

the commission shall consist of a minimum of <u>onethree</u> architects or landscape architects and a maximum of <u>foursix</u> lay members interested in civic improvements. The chair shall be elected by and from the commission subject to approval by the city council and shall serve in this capacity for one year. Of the nine members first appointed, three shall be appointed for one year, three for two years, and three for three years; thereafter, <u>Aappointments</u> to the commission shall be for three years except where an interim appointment is necessary to complete the term of a commissioner who resigns or dies while in office.

- (c) The city building official shall be an ex officio members of the commission without vote. A secretary, who need not be a commission member, shall also be appointed by the members of the commission.
- -(d) Five members of the commission shall be appointed to serve as the landscape review board with no more than one architect or landscape architect. Two alternates shall be appointed. The landscape review board shall be nominated by the city mayor and confirmed by the city council. The landscape review board shall be available to meet in public upon five days public notice to any matter and render a decision.

Sec. 2-372. Meetings.

- (a) The landscape review and beautification commission shall establish rules of procedure. There shall be regular meetings of the commission not less than once each calendar quarter which shall be open to the public. The chair is authorized to call special meetings, or a majority of the members may require a special meeting to be called.
- $(\underline{a}\underline{b})$ A majority of the commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and \underline{three} five affirmative votes shall be necessary to carry any question.
- (<u>be</u>) The physical attendance of four members of the landscape review board constitutes a quorum and three affirmative votes shall be necessary to carry any question. An applicant's appeal to the landscape review <u>and appeals</u> commission board is deemed granted if the <u>commission</u> landscape review board does not deny the appeal within ten city working days of submission of the matter to the <u>commission</u> landscape review board by the building official.

Sec. 2-373. Records.

Permanent records, or minutes of meetings of the landscape review and <u>appeals</u> beautification commission ("LRBC"), as well as the landscape review board, ("LRB"), shall be kept. The minutes shall promptly be filed in the office of the city clerk and shall be open to inspection by any person.

Sec. 2-374. Powers and duties.

The landscape review and <u>appeals</u> beautification commission shall have the duties and be empowered to:

- (1) Act when requested in an advisory capacity to the city council on urban beautification matters. The landscape review board is granted powers and duties as provided at FGC <u>Sec.</u> 2-375, subject to the applicant's right of appeal to the city council.
- (2) Review the proposed plans of federal, state, borough and city governments concerning structures, appurtenances or other improvements in, upon or adjacent to city property, including city streets and sidewalks, in order to make recommendations which will make the proposed structures, appurtenances or improvements compatible with city beautification plans and aesthetics.
- (3) Advise owners of private property in relation to beautification of such property when anyone contemplating the erection of any building or the making of any improvement submits the plans and designs or sketches thereof to the commission for advice and suggestions for which no charge shall be made by the commission.
- (4) Investigate and make recommendations to the city administration and the city council concerning the abatement of public nuisances in the city.
- (5) Cooperate with other city boards and commissions and the borough planning commission to promote plans and programs aesthetically compatible with polices and programs of the commission.
- (6) Help unite citizens toward common goals of civic pride in urban beautification.
- (7) Submit quarterly reports to the city council concerning its activities.

Sec. 2-375. Review.

(a) Landscape review board. The landscape review <u>and appeals</u> <u>commission</u> shall, within ten city working days of submission, review any disputes arising from the building official's application of the prescriptive design method (FGC <u>Sec.</u> 10-438(C)(1)), an applicant's election to use the professional design method (FGC <u>Sec.</u> 10-438(C)(2)), <u>orand</u> an applicant's election to use the alternative compliance method (FGC <u>Sec.</u> 10-438(C)(3)). Applicants may appeal an adverse decision of the landscape review <u>and appeals commission</u> to the city council at the next regular meeting of the city council that occurs at least

seventhree calendar days after a denial by the commission landscape review board.

- (b) Full landscape review and beautification commission. The landscape review and beautification commission may review:
 - (1) Any proposed design and location of any structure, appurtenance or other improvements erected, or to be erected by the city upon property belonging to the city, including the city streets and sidewalks.
 - (2) Any proposed city plan or program which may have an effect on the aesthetics of the city. Any person proposing to extend or alter any structure, appurtenance, sign or other device over or upon any city street or sidewalk shall submit to the commission for review and approval design drawings and plans of the proposal.
- (c) The design of traffic signal or control device need not be submitted if the design is determined by state law and cannot be altered or varied consistent with such law.
- (d) The commission shall decide any matters submitted to it within 30 days after submission unless the commission shall by resolution declare the nature and complexity of the proposal submitted requires an additional period of time for decision and shall set forth in the resolution the additional period of time needed.
- (e) If the commission fails to decide within the required period of time, its recommendations shall be considered unnecessary.
- (f) The commission shall submit all proposed recommendations, plans and programs to the mayor for administrative action prior to any city council action recommended by the commission.
- -(g) The city mayor, with the concurrence of the city council, may remove any commission member who has three unexcused absences in any calendar year. An unexcused absence is an absence of which the chair is not notified in advance.

<u>Section 2</u>. Fairbanks General Code Sections 10-438, 439, and 441 are amended as follows [new text **bold and underlined** font; deleted text in strikeout font]:

ARTICLE XV. FAIRBANKS LANDSCAPE ORDINANCE

Sec. 10-436. Scope and applicability

A. [Minimum requirements.] The minimum requirements and standards set forth in this section shall apply to all public and private, commercial, industrial, religious, educational, institutional and multi family uses that are developed or expanded after

January 1, 2004. For the purpose of this section, a building which undergoes a change of use as defined by the building code, shall comply with this ordinance. If a building covered by this ordinance expands its floor area, compliance with this ordinance is required on a pro-rata percentage basis, with a 15% minimum compliance, under the alternative design method (FGC 10-438(C)(3)). The Fairbanks Landscape Ordinance shall apply to the construction of a new parking lot, expansion of an existing parking lot or a surface improvement to an existing parking lot. The intent of the landscape ordinance is to apply to provided parking, whether required by zoning ordinances, or provided for any other reason. Multiple residential buildings located on one lot shall also comply with all provisions of the Landscape Ordinance.

B. Exemptions

- (1) Property with one, two, and three family dwelling units located on individual lots are exempt from the provisions of the Fairbanks Landscape Ordinance.
- (2) Property of which the principle use is the sale of vehicles is not required to comply with the prescriptive method FGC I 0-438(C)(1).
- (3) Property located within the area specified by Borough Code section 18.50.060(C)(12) (presently described as: First Avenue to Fifth Avenue, Noble Street to Barnette Street, and First Avenue to Third Avenue, Barnette Street to Wickersham Street, and as may be subsequently expanded), provided that, if a new parking lot is constructed within said area, compliance shall be with the alternative design method or the professional design method (FGC 10-438(C)(2) and (C)(3). The City Landscape Manual will provide a map of this region of the City.
- C. Landscape Plan Where a landscape plan is required under this section, the plan shall include:
 - 1. The common name of each plant used;
 - 2. The number, height and diameter of each plant;
 - 3. The locations where different plant types will be used;
 - 4. The locations, size and type of vegetation to be preserved in their natural state:
 - 5. Location of any retaining walls and fences;
 - 6. Location of existing or proposed utilities and easements of record;
 - 7. Location of all property lines including all streets which border the lot;
 - 8. Location of any existing or proposed structures or parking areas;
 - 9. North arrow and scale;
 - 10. Site drainage and drainage patterns; unless shown on civil drawings
- D. Approved Plant Materials. The Landscape Review and Beatification Commission will adopt and publish a Landscape Manual, which shall include <u>Aa</u> list of approved plant and ground cover materials, a map of the area described in Section 10-436(B)(3), and general landscaping information, will be set out in a Landscape Manual. The Manual,

which will be revised as needed by the Landscape Review and Appeals Commission, will beand made available at the Building Department and on the Building Department web site.

Sec. 10-438. Landscape design standards.

* * * * * *

C. Technical design standards. One of the following three design methods shall be used to comply with the Fairbanks Landscape Ordinance.

* * * * * *

- 2. Professional Design Method. A landscape plan, prepared and sealed by a licensed landscape architect registered in the State of Alaska, which is equivalent to the criteria set forth in section 10-438(C)(1), shall be considered as meeting the intent of the landscape ordinance. All Landscape plans which utilize the Professional Design Method shall be reviewed and approved by the City of Fairbanks Landscape Review and Appeals CommissionBoard, as needed.
- 3. Alternative Compliance Method. Project conditions associated with individual sites may justify approval of alternative methods of compliance with the landscape design requirements. Conditions may arise where normal compliance is impractical or impossible, such as facilities that sell vehicles, or where maximum achievement of the City's objectives and goals can only be obtained through alternative compliance. Such Landscape Plans shall be reviewed and approved by the Landscape Review and Appeals CommissionBoard on a case-by-case basis.

Sec. 10-439. Plan submittal and inspection requirements.

A preliminary landscape plan shall be submitted to the building department in conjunction with the required building permit application and related construction documents. A final and complete landscape plan shall be submitted to the building department for review and approval before the final inspection is conducted. A certificate of occupancy shall not be issued until all landscaping has been completed by the contractor or developer and inspected and approved by the building department or Landscape Review and Appeals CommissionBoard. In the event landscaping is not completed due to planting season restrictions, a temporary certificate may be issued but shall expire within one year of such certificate. If a temporary certificate of occupancy is issued, a performance bond or suitable guaranty shall be posted with the City of Fairbanks until such time as the landscaping is completed and approved. The amount of the bond or guaranty shall be equivalent to one percent of the total cost of the construction project up to one million dollars or shall be equal to one half of one percent of the total construction cost if the total construction costs exceed one million dollars.

Sec. 10-441. Enforcement, appeals and penalties

- 1. The City of Fairbanks Building Department in conjunction with the Landscape Review **and Appeals Commission**Board shall enforce the requirements of this section and shall be responsible for performing the necessary inspections to determine if the required landscaping has been installed according to the approved landscape design.
- 2. A Certificate of Occupancy shall not be issued until the landscape requirements are met as shown on the approved landscape design plans and given final approval by either the building department or Landscape Review **and Appeals Commission**Board unless a performance bond is secured in the amount of the estimated cost of the landscaping as approved by the Landscape Review **and Appeals Commission**Board or in accordance with section 10-439. Occupancy of any building prior to the issuance of a temporary or final Certificate of Occupancy shall be unlawful.
- 3. Any applicant denied a building permit or issued a stop work order due to non compliance of the landscape ordinance or who wishes to appeal a decision of the building official may appeal to the Landscape Review **and Appeals Commission**Board. The appeal shall be made in writing and submitted within one week upon rejection from the building official. If an applicant, owner or developer wishes to appeal a decision of the Landscape Review **and Appeals Commission**Board, they shall appeal to the City Council acting as a Board of Adjustment. The appeal shall be in writing and fully state the reason or reasons for the appeal. The appeal shall be accompanied by a copy of the landscape design submitted to the Landscape Review **and Appeals Commission**Board.

The Board of Adjustment Appeal in the Sandstrom matter was heard at the February 27 Council meeting. The appeal was denied.

Attached for your review is the "Decision" document which includes "Findings and Conclusions." The FNSB Code Sec. 18.54.070(J)(2) requires that every decision of the Board of Adjustment be based upon "findings and conclusions adopted by the board." The Decision document will be on the March 5 meeting agenda under communications to council. A motion to approve the "findings and conclusions" will be needed.

DECISION

Wayne Sandstrom, as trustee of the Bud Sandstrom Family Trust and the Vi Sandstrom

Family Trust (hereinafter referred to as "Sandstrom"), filed an appeal to the Fairbanks City

Council, sitting as the Board of Adjustment pursuant to FNSB Code Sec. 18.52.030, appealing a

zoning decision by the Director of the Borough Department of Community Planning. [See

Hearing Packet at page 1-4; references to the record will hereinafter be cited as "HP at _____"].

The Borough determined that Sandstrom's use of the property at 341 Antoinette Avenue violated

the provisions of the Two-Family Residential zoning district [HP at 2-4]. Sandstrom appeals

from this determination.

Summary of Facts

Sandstrom is the owner of real property located at 341 Antoinette Avenue in the City of

Fairbanks. Sandstrom built and located at least nine structures¹ on the property. The record is

not clear as to when this activity on the property began, but the record shows that a complaint

was filed with the Borough on July 9, 2010 [HP at 109]. A "stop work order" was issued by the

City of Fairbanks Building Official on August 20, 2010. According to the Building Official, in

his letter to Sandstrom dated May 26, 2011, the stop work order was issued because:

1) required plans for the cabins had not been submitted for review and approval;

2) required permits had not been secured;

¹ While these structures look like small cabins [HP at 10-13], Sandstrom objects to that characterization. He refers to them as "sleeping-only rooms" [HP at 131] or as "accessory buildings for sleeping rooms" [HP at 178].

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- 3) required inspections had not been conducted;
- 4) required water and sewer facilities had not been provided for each of the residential cabins; and
- 5) the multiple cabins are in violation of current zoning regulations" [HP at 109].

The Building Official also noted subsequent to the original posting of the stop work order, "construction has continued" [HP at 109].²

In a letter to the Borough dated November 22, 2010, Sandstrom described the structures on his lot as follows:

I have two bona fide dwellings on my lot. One is a small one bedroom dwelling that I and my companion live in and the other is a bed and breakfast compendium that is comprised of a log dwelling with one (1) bedroom, a kitchen, a general purpose room, and an expanded bath area; supplemented with seven (7) sleeping-only rooms (no cooking or toilet facilities). [HP at 131].

Summary of Argument

Sandstrom's position is that he established a bed and breakfast operation on the property, which is allowed in the Two-Family Residential zone. He argues that the nine structures are accessory buildings for sleeping rooms. The Borough Department of Community Planning held that while a "bed & breakfast residence" was a permitted use in the Two-Family Residential zone, the guestrooms must be located within a single structure for the following reasons:

- 1. The property locate at 341 Antoinette is located within Two-Family Residential zoning district.
- 2. Residential use and bed and breakfast uses are permitted uses in the Two-Family zone.
- 3. Only one principle [sic] building is permitted in the Two-Family zone.

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² The violation of the stop work order was also reported in a letter to Mayor Hopkins from Sandstrom's neighbor Terry Cochrane ("Thirty minutes after the order was served, work continued on the laundry building. At the time of the complaint, there were six (6) dry cabins. There are now nine (9) cabins. The cabins are fabricated in the large shop then rolled out and placed on gravel pads around the property") [HP at 107].

4. Residential use or a bed and breakfast residence use makes the building a principal building;

5. More than one principal building on a lot within the Two-Family zone is not

permitted:

6. Residential sleeping quarters either for residential or bed and breakfast uses in individual buildings are not accessory buildings because they are principal

buildings [HP at 3-4].

Findings and Conclusions

The Two-Family Residential zoning district provides for "medium density residential

development and other uses which maintain the medium density residential nature of the district

in areas where community sewer and water systems are available" [FNSB Code Sec. 18.24.010;

HP at 42]. In this zoning district, not more than one principal building may be located on one lot

[FNSB Code Sec. 18.50.020A; HP at 44].

Located on the property at 341 Antoinette Avenue Street were: a one bedroom dwelling

(Sandstrom's residence), a one bedroom dwelling (that included a kitchen, a general purpose

room, and an expanded bath area), nine³ cabins, and a garage (where the cabins were

constructed). The Borough correctly determined that these cabin/buildings were not "rooms."

The Borough was also correct in rejecting Sandstrom's attempt to label these structures

"accessory buildings" in order to avoid the building limit of the FNSB Code Sec. 18.50.020A.

After consideration of the record on appeal and for the reasons stated above, the Council,

acting as the Board of Adjustment, finds that Sandstrom's use of the property located at 341

Antoinette Avenue violated the restrictions of the Two-Family Residential zone, and therefore,

his appeal is denied.

³ Sandstrom's brief [HP at 181] indicates that he moved all but four of these structures from the property.
