SECTION 107 LEGAL RELATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITY TO PUBLIC

Add the following subsection:

107-1.22 NOISE ABATEMENT. The Contractor will not disturb the peace in contravention of any applicable local Ordinance. Within the City of Fairbanks, the applicable ordinance is FGC Section 46-42. Any noise within the City of Fairbanks as described in FGC Section 46-42(A)(3) will be limited to the hours of 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. unless exempted by FGC Section 46-42(E).

PART III - CITY SUPPLEMENTAL CONDITIONS

Also, <u>DELETE all references to</u> "Contracting Officer" <u>and REPLACE with:</u> "City Engineer."

SECTION 101-1.03 DEFINITIONS. *ADD the following:*

SUBMITTAL. A bound document prepared by the contractor consisting of a compilation of product data, shop drawings calculations, certifications and reports to be submitted to the Engineer.

SECTION 102 BIDDING REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS

102-1.07 BID GUARANTY. <u>DELETE the second sentence and SUBSTITUTE the following</u>: The guaranty shall be unconditionally payable to the City of Fairbanks and shall be in the form of an acceptable Bid Bond, or a certified check, cashier's check, or money order.

102-1.09 WITHDRAWAL OR REVISION OF BIDS. <u>Add the following to the first paragraph:</u> Modifications to bids shall be submitted on forms furnished by the City or reasonable facsimiles thereof. DELETE 4th paragraph and SUBSTITUTE the following:

The City of Fairbanks shall be named as an additional insured on policies required by paragraphs 2 through 4 above. All of the above insurance coverages shall be considered to be primary and noncontributory to any other insurance carried by the City of Fairbanks, whether through self-insurance or otherwise.

ADD the following [new] subsections:

Certificate of Insurance

Contractor must furnish a certificate of insurance within the (10) days of receipt of the Notice-of-Intent to Award and must endorse polices to provide for a thirty (30) day prior notice of cancellation, non-renewal or material change of the policies. Failure to furnish satisfactory evidence of insurance or lapse of policy is a material breach of the contract and grounds for termination of this agreement. Each policy shall be endorsed with a waiver of subrogation in favor of the Owner. All other insurance policies required of the Contractor by this agreement shall be endorsed to provide that such insurance shall apply as primary insurance and that any insurance or self-insured carried by the Owner will be excess only and will not contribute with the insurance required by this agreement. All other insurance policies required of the Contractor and subcontractors by this Agreement shall be endorsed to name the Owner as additional insured. All insurance shall be on an occurrence from acceptable to the Owner and having an A.M. Best rating of "A" or better.

- 1. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance as required by any applicable law or regulation. Employers' liability insurance shall be in the amount no less than \$500,000 each accident for bodily injury, \$500,000 policy limit for bodily injury by disease and \$500,000 each employee for bodily injury by disease. The Contractor shall be responsible for Workers' Compensation Insurance for any subcontractor who directly or indirectly provides services under this contract. This coverage must include statutory coverage for states in which employees are engaging work. If there is an exposure of injury to Contractor's employees under the U.S. Longshoremen's Harbor Workers' Compensation Act, the Jones Act, or under laws, regulations or statutes applicable to maritime employee, coverage shall be included for such injuries or claims. The coverage shall include waiver of subrogation against the City.
- 2. Commercial General Liability Insurance: The Contractor is required to provide Commercial General Liability (CGL) insurance with limits not less than \$5,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence and \$5,000,000 in the aggregate not excluding premises operations, independent contractors, products, and completed operations, broad form property damage, blanket contractual, explosion, collapse and underground hazards. Limits may be a combination of primary and excess (umbrella) policy forms.
- 3. Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance: Covering all owned, hired and non-owned vehicles with coverage limits not less than \$1,000,000 single limit per occurrence bodily injury and property damage.
- 4. Property Insurance: The Contractor shall submit to the Owner evidence of All Risk Builder's Risk Insurance for all physical loss, including earthquake and flood (100% completed value basis) upon the entire work naming the Owner, the Contractor and the subcontractors as additional insured parties and as their interests may appear to the full contract sum thereof, until the project is completed by the Contractor and accepted by the Owner. The policy, by endorsement, shall specifically permit partial or beneficial occupancy at or prior to substantial completion or final acceptance of the entire work. (Only if applicable)
- A. PROOF OF INSURANCE: The Contractor shall furnish the Owner with a Certificate of Insurance or where requested by the Owner, the policy declaration page with required endorsements attached thereto showing the type, amount, effective dates and dates of expiration of all policies. All endorsements shall reference policy number and the project name and project number. The Owner is the City of Fairbanks and is to be identified on all certificates and endorsements.

- B. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Fairbanks its officers, and employees from and against any and all loss, expense, damage, claim, demand, judgment, fine, charge, lien, liability, action, cause of action, or proceedings of any kind whatsoever (whether arising on account of damage to or loss of property, or personal injury, emotional distress or death) arising directly or indirectly in connection with the performance or activities of the Contractor hereunder, whether the same arises before or after completion of the contractor's operations or expiration of this Agreement, except for damage, loss or injury resulting from the Owner's gross negligence or willful misconduct.
- C. Without limiting its indemnification, the Contractor shall maintain, until acceptance of the project by the Owner, occurrence type coverage of the kinds and minimum amounts set forth above. All insurance limits are minimum. If the Contractor's policy contains higher limits, the Owner shall be entitled to coverage to the extent of such higher limits. The Owner, at its sole discretion, may rise or lower the limit.

SECTION 104 SCOPE OF WORK

ADD the following [new] subsections:

104-1.08 RECORD DRAWINGS. The Contractor shall maintain a "mark-up" set of plans which shall be revised by the Contractor as the work progresses to reflect current conditions. The revisions are to be indicated in a neat, well organized manner and are to include the elevation and plan location of any utilities, structures, etc. encountered or installed.

The mark-up plans shall become the property of the City prior to final acceptance and payment of demobilization.

The Contractor shall remedy any defects in the Work resulting therefrom which shall appear within a period of one (1) year from the date of the substantial completion of Work unless a longer period is specified. The Owner or Engineer will give notice of observed defects with reasonable promptness.

SECTION 106 CONTROL OF MATERIAL

106-1.03 TESTING AND ACCEPTANCE. <u>DELETE item 2. entirety and SUBSTITUTE the following:</u>

2. **ACCEPTANCE TESTING.** The City has the exclusive right and responsibility for determining the acceptability of the construction and incorporated materials.

The City will sample materials and perform acceptance tests at its expense except as otherwise stated. The cost of tests that fail to meet specification requirements will be deducted from the Contract price. Samples will be taken by a qualified testing firm or representative of the Owner. Copies of tests will be furnished to the Contractor upon request.

The Contractor shall not rely on the City's acceptance testing for its quality control. The City's acceptance testing is not a substitute for the Contractor's quality control. The Engineer may retest materials that have failed the City's acceptance test but is not required to do so.

SECTION 107 LEGAL RELATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITY TO PUBLIC

107-1.01 LAWS TO BE OBSERVED. Add to the end of the first paragraph the following: The Fairbanks General Code is available electronically from the City of Fairbanks web site: http://www.fairbanksalaska.us/. Select the tab links from left side of the homepage indicating "Code of Ordinances" and notice in particular Chapter 54 - Procurement.

107-1.11 PROTECTION AND RESTORATION OF PROPERTY AND LANDSCAPE.

- 1. Hazardous Materials. Add the following:
 - g. Fuel storage facilities shall not be placed within 100 feet of water bodies and must be within an impermeable diked area having a holding capacity at least ten percent greater than that of the largest independent fuel container. Manifolded tanks and bladders are considered as a container. Vehicle refueling shall not occur within the annual floodplain.

107-1.13 RESPONSIBILITY FOR DAMAGE CLAIMS. Add the following:

- (E) Exemptions. The following sound or noise is not prohibited by this Section:
 - (3) Noise necessarily produced in the course of work required to protect persons or property from an imminent peril;
 - (4) Noise produced by any activity for which a permit has been issued pursuant to paragraph (E) of this Section.
- (F) Applications for a permit for relief from the application of this Section to any activity on the basis of undue hardship may be made to the City Mayor or his duly authorized representative. Any permit granted by the City Mayor hereunder shall contain all conditions upon which such permit has been granted and shall specify a reasonable time that the permit shall be effective. The City Mayor, or his duly authorized representative, may grant the relief as applied for if he finds:
 - (1) Additional time is necessary for the applicant to alter or modify his/her activity or operation to comply with this Section; or
 - (2) The activity, operation or noise source will be of temporary duration, and cannot be done in a manner that would comply with other paragraphs of this Section; and

(3) No other reasonable alternative is available to the applicant; and

However, the Mayor may prescribe any conditions or requirements he deems necessary to minimize adverse effects upon the community or the surrounding neighborhood.

SECTION 109 MEASUREMENT & PAYMENT

109-1.01 GENERAL. <u>Add the following</u>: All payments requested by the Contractor shall be developed by the Contractor in a form acceptable to the Engineer. Pay estimates shall be submitted by the Contractor and approved by the Engineer.

SECTION 108 PROSECUTION AND PROGRESS

108-1.03 PROSECUTION AND PROGRESS. <u>Delete the last sentence of the first paragraph in its entirety</u> <u>and substitute the following:</u> The Contractor shall submit the following documents to the Engineer at least fifteen (15) working days before the preconstruction conference:

108-1.06 CONTRACT TIME, EXTENSION OF CONTRACT TIME, AND SUPENSION OF WORK. <u>DELETE in entirety and SUBSTITUTE the following:</u> Time is of the essence of the Contract. The Work to be done under the Contract shall be completed in its entirety within the time specified in the Contract Documents.

The date of commencement will be the date established in the Notice to Proceed. If there is no Notice to Proceed, it shall be the date of the agreement signed by the Owner and the Contractor.

The Engineer may at his/her discretion recommend that the Owner extend the time for completion of the Work without invalidating any of the provisions of the Contract and without releasing the surety. Extensions of time, when recommended by Engineer, will be based upon the effect of delays to the Project as a whole and will not be recommended for non-controlling delays to minor included portions of the work unless it can be shown that such delays did, in fact, delay the progress of the Project as a whole.

Acts of God, inclement weather, governmental regulations, labor disputes, strikes, fires, required extra work or any delay totally beyond the control of the Contractor may justify an extension of time.

No extension of time for completion will be allowed for delays or suspensions caused by or contributed to by the fault or negligence of Contractor or his/her subcontractors.

All time extensions requested by Contractor shall be made to Engineer in writing on or before the tenth day following the day in which the alleged delay is said to have occurred and any claim for extension of time shall state explicitly the reasons therefore or and the number of days claimed. Should Contractor fail to file such written claim for extension of time within the period provided he/she shall have abandoned any claim therefore.

Unless otherwise provided herein, Contractor's sole remedy for any justified delay in the Work will be an extension of time and he/she will be entitled to no delay damages, wage escalation, material escalation, extended overhead, or additional compensation of any kind except for such delays as maybe caused solely by any fault of Owner of this agreement.

The Engineer by written order may suspend Work on the Project, in whole or in part, for such periods as he/she may judge necessary due to inclement weather, unforeseen emergency conditions, or to

expedite public traffic. When the Work is suspended for one or more calendar days by order of the Engineer, the time for completion will be increased, except as hereinafter stated.

In those instances where the Engineer orders suspension of the Work for failure by the Contractor to carry out contractual provisions, or for failure to carry out orders given by the Engineer within the limits of the Contract, the Contractor will not be entitled to an increase in the time for completion.

SECTION 109 MEASUREMENT AND PAYMENT

109-1.02 MEASUREMENT OF QUANTITIES. <u>Under subtitle Electronic Computerized Weighing System item (1) add the following to the end of the first sentence:</u> ", CD, or a USB device."

Progress payments under the Contract shall be made at the request of the Contractor based upon pay estimates to be furnished by the Contractor and approved by the Engineer. The Engineer reserves the right to alter quantities claimed in the partial estimate to reflect what are, in Engineer's opinion, the true quantities for the payment time period.

109-1.08 FINAL PAYMENT. <u>DELETE the first sentence of the first paragraph and substitute the following:</u> When the project has been completed as provided in Subsection 105-1.15, the Contractor will prepare for approval by the Engineer the final estimate of the quantities of the various classes of work performed.

Any missing or damaged bronze name plates to be replaced at the contractor's expense. The contractor shall secure removed bronze name plates as described on the plans for transport. The contractor shall coordinate with Julie Jones with Festival Fairbanks at 907-322-4112 for pick up by an outside contractor. Once the contractor has coordinated with Julie Jones, Festival Fairbanks will take ownership and responsibility of the bronze name plates.

604-5.01 BASIS OF PAYMENT. <u>Delete the first paragraph and substitute the following</u>: Excavation, shoring, bedding, and backfill are subsidiary.

SECTION 608 SIDEWALKS

608-1.01 DESCRIPTION. ADD the following after "concrete sidewalks": ..., colored concrete,...

608-3.01 CONCRETE SIDEWALKS. <u>Add the following:</u> Provide joints in the patterns shown on the drawings or at the direction of the Engineer in the field.

<u>Add the following:</u> Provide a human guard to protect work from vandalism or surface defects for the first 24 hours during concrete cure.

All sidewalk shall have a minimum of 12 inches of Selected Material Type A beneath.

608-5.01 BASIS OF PAYMENT. Add the following: Providing a human guard during concrete cure will not be paid for separately but will be subsidiary to 608 pay items. 12-inches of Selected Material Type A under concrete sidewalk will not be paid for separately but will be subsidiary to 608 pay items.

All work, equipment, and materials required to match existing pattern on red concrete will not be paid for separately but is subsidiary.

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609-5.01 BASIS OF PAYMENT. Add the following: Providing a human guard during concrete cure will not be paid for separately but will be subsidiary to 609 pay items. 12-inches of Selected Material Type A under curbing will not be paid for separately but will be subsidiary to 609 pay items.

Delete Section 618 in its entirety and substitute the following:

SECTION 618 SEEDING

618-1.01 DESCRIPTION. It is the intent of this work that a uniform living vegetative cover be established according to the Plans and Specifications. This work consists of soil preparation, seeding, fertilizing, mulching, and establishing, and maintaining vegetated areas.

618-2.01 MATERIALS. Use materials that conform to the following:

Seed Section 724 Fertilizer Section 725

Mulch Subsection 727-2.01 Water Subsection 712-2.01

CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS

618-3.01 SOIL PREPARATION. Clear all areas to be seeded of stones 4" and larger in diameter and of all weeds, plant growth, sticks, stumps and other debris or irregularities which may interfere with the seeding, establishment, and maintenance of the vegetated areas.

Prior to the application of seed, prepare slopes using one or more of the following methods, or as approved by the Engineer:

- 1. Manual Raking Requires manual labor with landscaping rakes to produce a uniform pattern of grooves perpendicular to the fall of the slope.
- 2. Mechanical Raking Requires the use of a scarifying slope board to produce grooves with an approximate width and depth of 1", and no more than 6" apart. The resultant indentations shall leave a uniform pattern of grooves perpendicular to the fall of the slope.
- 3. Mechanical Track Walking Requires operating tracked equipment in such a manner as to leave a uniform pattern of grooves perpendicular to the fall of the slope.

618-3.02 SEEDING SEASON. Perform seeding after the ground is free of snow and no sooner than May 15 and no later than August 15. Perform seeding when wind conditions, climatic conditions, and soil conditions will not hinder seeding and establishment.

618-3.03 APPLICATION METHOD. Use the Hydraulic Method. You must obtain the Engineer's permission to use the Mechanical Method.

Hydraulic Method:

- 1. Seeding by the hydraulic method consists of furnishing and placing a slurry of dye, seed, fertilizer, trace mulch, water, and a second application of mulch.
- 2. Do not place seed in the slurry prior to 30 minutes before application.
- 3. Add the proportionate amount of seed to the water slurry in the hydraulic seeder after the proportionate amounts of trace mulch and fertilizer have been added.
- 4. Apply the slurry mixture in a manner that results in an even distribution of all materials. Apply seed, fertilizer, and trace mulch together in one application.
- 5. Hydraulic seeding equipment must maintain continuous slurry agitation so that a homogeneous, uniform mixture is applied through a spray nozzle, for the complete tank load. The pump must be capable of producing sufficient pressure to maintain a continuous, nonfluctuating spray capable of reaching the

- extremities of the seeding area with the pump & nozzle unit located on the roadbed. Provide sufficient hose to reach areas not practical to seed from the pump & nozzle unit situated on the road bed.
- 6. A second application of mulch shall be applied within 24-hours after seeding. Mulch shall be furnished and evenly applied at the rates required for temporary stabilization per the manufacturer's recommendations and according to Subsection 727-2.01. Mulch sprayed on signs or sign structures shall be removed the same day.

Mechanical Method:

- 1. Use mechanical spreaders, seed drills or other approved mechanical seeding equipment when seed and fertilizer are to be applied in dry form.
- 2. Water seeding area both prior to and after the application of fertilizer.
- 3. Spread fertilizer separately from seed.
- 4. An application of mulch shall be applied within 24-hours after seeding. Mulch shall be furnished and evenly applied at the rates required for temporary stabilization per the manufacturer's recommendations and according to Subsection 727-2.01. Mulch sprayed on signs or sign structures shall be removed the same day.

618-3.04 APPLICATION RATE. Apply seed, fertilizer, and trace mulch at the rates specified in the table below:

618-3.05 MAINTENANCE. Protect seeded areas against erosion and sedimentation. Protect seeded areas against traffic by approved warning signs or barricades. Water seeded areas, in a non-erosive manner, as required to establish a uniform living perennial vegetative cover. Be responsible for identifying, retracking, reseeding, refertilizing and remulching gullied or otherwise damaged areas. The second application of mulch shall be maintained so it properly performs its temporary stabilization function until final stabilization is achieved. Rescarify, reseed, refertilize and remulch unproductive areas as directed by the Engineer.

618-3.06 PERIOD OF ESTABLISHMENT. The establishment period extends until a uniform (e.g. evenly distributed, without large bare areas) perennial living vegetative cover with a density of 70 percent of the native background vegetative cover is established.

618-3.07 ACCEPTANCE. The Engineer will accept seeding when a uniform (e.g. evenly distributed, without large bare areas) perennial living vegetative cover with a density of 70 percent of the native background vegetative cover is established.

618-4.01 METHOD OF MEASUREMENT. Section 109 and as follows:

Watering seeded areas per Subsection 618-3.05 will not be measured directly for payment and is subsidiary.

^{**} Trace mulch application rate may be adjusted according to the manufacturer's recommendations when approved by the Engineer. Trace mulch is not required for mechanical seeding.

Identifying, retracking, reseeding, refertilizing and remulching gullied or otherwise damaged areas will not be measured directly for payment and is subsidiary.

<u>Seeding by the Square Yard</u>. By the square yard of ground surface acceptably seeded and maintained. Soil preparation, seed, fertilizer, all mulch, dye, and water required for seed and fertilizer application will not be measured directly for payment and is subsidiary.

618-5.01 BASIS OF PAYMENT. The accepted quantity will be paid for at the contract price, per unit of measurement, for the pay items listed below that appear on the bid schedule.

SECTION 626 SANITARY SEWER SYSTEMS

Delete Section 626 in its entirety and substitute the following:

626-1.01 DESCRIPTION. Furnish and install all sanitary sewer pipe, fittings, and appurtenances for the sanitary sewer service.

The sanitary sewer system shall be constructed in accordance with the GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES STANDARDS OF DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION (most recent revision) and GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES SERVICE LINE STANDARDS (most recent version).

626-2.01 MATERIALS. Use materials that conform to GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES STANDARDS OF DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION (most recent revision) and GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES SERVICE LINE STANDARDS (most recent version). Utility Services of Alaska will furnish the saddle connection to the main. The Contractor shall supply all other materials to complete the work.

Materials must comply with Buy America requirements outlined in Subsection 106-1.01.

CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS

626-3.01 GENERAL. All work will conform to GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES STANDARDS OF DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION (most recent revision) and GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES SERVICE LINE STANDARDS (most recent version).

Furnish and install all incidental parts not shown on the plans or specified in this section that are necessary to complete the sewer service.

Verify locations of all existing utilities prior to excavation. The contractor is responsible to obtain, from all utility organizations, a locate of buried utilities within the project limits and give notice of proposed excavation in accordance with AS 42.30.

626-3.02 INSTALLATION. Sanitary sewer service shall be installed according to GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES STANDARDS OF DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION (most recent revision) and GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES SERVICE LINE STANDARDS (most recent version). Utility Services of Alaska will furnish and install the saddle connection to the main. All other work, labor, and materials shall be provided by the contractor.

626-3.03 BYPASS PUMPING. Provide a bypass for flow of sewage around the section of sewer lines designated for reconstruction, or replacement, as required. Plug the existing system at an upstream manhole and pump collected sewage to downstream manhole or adjacent sanitary sewer system. The pump(s) and bypass system shall be routed to a sanitary sewer system that has sufficient capacity to handle the peak flow and bypass flow combined.

The contractor shall submit any bypass pumping plan, for sanitary sewer mains or services, to the engineer for approval, prior to implementation.

626-3.04 WARRANTY. Contractor shall furnish all warranties provided by any vendors and/or manufacturers of materials and equipment used to complete the Work.

626-4.01 METHOD OF MEASUREMENT.

1. 4 Inch Sewer Service to Future Bathroom. Measured by the number of units installed and accepted.

626-5.01 BASIS OF PAYMENT. At the contract unit price for each of the particular pay items shown in the bid schedule, completed in place and accepted.

Structural excavation, trench excavation, shoring, bedding, backfill, trench backfill is subsidiary.

Contractor shall provide all materials.

Sewer service connection payment shall include all service piping, fittings (22.5, 45 or 90 degree bends), mission couplings, tapping, insulation, and any other materials, labor and supervision required to complete the service connection as described in the plans and specifications.

Any costs involving shoring and sewage by-pass are subsidiary.

Permit coverage for dewatering is required by ADEC for excavations located within 1,500 ft of a permit defined 'DEC-identified contaminated site' or 'contaminated groundwater plume' identified by Contaminated Sites. Localized sumps for trench water and washed rock required for installation of pipe and structures will be utilized with the approval of the Engineer. Payment for this work or any other extra work associated with dewatering shall be subsidiary to respective 626 pay items.

SECTION 627 WATER SYSTEMS

DELETE Section 627 in its entirety and substitute the following:

627-1.01 DESCRIPTION. Furnish and install all water conduit, fittings, and incidental parts to complete water service installation and foundation piping improvements as shown on the Plans or specified in this section.

627-1.02 SUBMITTALS. Submit, in writing, plans outlining all procedures for temporary cap installations, service disruptions, temporary bypass, and tie-ins, for approval by the Engineer.

627-2.01 MATERIALS. The Contractor shall supply all materials to complete the work. Use materials that conform to GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES STANDARDS OF DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION (most recent revision) and GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES SERVICE LINE STANDARDS (most recent revision).

Materials must comply with Buy America requirements outlined in Subsection 106-1.01.

Submit manufacturer's literature and affidavit of compliance with specified standards, for review by the Engineer. Procurement of materials shall not take place until approved.

Piping material shall bear label, stamp, or other markings of specified testing agency. All pipe and fittings, shall be UL/FM listed for fire service.

All water conduit, water service piping, and incidental water system parts shall comply with NSF 61.

Insulation

Subsection 712-2.23

CONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS

627-3.01 GENERAL. All work will conform to GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES STANDARDS OF DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION (most recent revision) and GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES SERVICE LINE STANDARDS (most recent revision).

Furnish and install all incidental parts not shown on the plans or specified in this section that are necessary to complete the water service.

Verify locations of all existing utilities prior to excavation. The contractor is responsible to give notice of proposed excavation in accordance with AS 42.30 to all utility companies and to obtain utility locates of buried utilities within the project limits.

627-3.02 INSTALLATION. Water systems shall be installed according to GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES STANDARDS OF DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION (most recent revision) and GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES SERVICE LINE STANDARDS (most recent revision).

Provide additional insulation to pipe or conduit where insufficient cover exists.

Any system or applicator shall be able to demonstrate prior experience of at least two years and the Engineer shall be the sole judge of the qualifications of a system, material, application method and applicator.

627-3.03 TESTING WATER SYSTEM. Testing shall be according to GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES STANDARDS OF DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION (most recent revision) and GOLDEN HEART UTILITIES SERVICE LINE STANDARDS (most recent version).

627-3.04 VIDEO INSPECTION. The Contractor shall conduct video inspection of existing 6 inch and 8 inch fountain piping and submit the video inspection report to the Engineer. The Contractor shall provide a swivel head camera with sufficient lighting to clearly see fountain piping. The camera shall have the ability to maneuver between multiple 90 degree turns, as shown in the plans; a camera used for sewer video inspection is not sufficient.

627-3.05 WARRANTY. Contractor shall furnish all warranties provided by any vendors and/or manufacturers of materials and equipment used to complete the Work.

627-4.01 METHOD OF MEASUREMENT.

- A. <u>Water Service Connection.</u> Water service connection measurement shall be each by the number of dual water services connected at the water main.
- B. <u>Clean and TV Inspection of Fountain Piping.</u> Clean and tv inspection measurement shall be measured by the linear foot, along the overall horizontal length of pipe installed.

627-5.01 BASIS OF PAYMENT. At the contract unit price for each of the particular pay items shown in the bid schedule, completed in place, disinfected, tested, functional, and accepted. Payment for water service and video inspection will not be paid for partial, unaccepted work. Contractor shall provide all materials.

Structural excavation, trench excavation, shoring, bedding, backfill, trench backfill is subsidiary.

Pressure tests, flushing, disinfection, biological purity test, labor, materials and supervision required to complete the task as described in the plans and specifications are subsidiary. Remedy of any defects is subsidiary.

Acceptance testing including cleaning, pressure testing, and test for damaged and defective pipe with a video camera inspection is subsidiary. Use a swivel head camera with sufficient lighting to clearly see each pipe joint and provide a DVD and log to Engineer of the sewer main inspection. Remedy of any defects is subsidiary.

Any costs involving shoring, repair of damaged services, and providing temporary water caps are subsidiary.

- A. Payment for water service shall include all supervision, labor and materials to install thaw wires, flare type couplings, dual copper service tubes, normal 3 inch insulation, tapping, materials, service changeover, labor and supervision required to complete the connections as described in the plans and specifications.
- B. Payment for clean and tv inspection of fountain piping shall include all supervision, labor and materials to clean existing fountain piping, provide a DVD and log to Engineer of the inspection to complete the task as described in the plans and specifications.

SECTION 643 TRAFFIC MAINTENANCE

Add the following subsection:

643-3.12 PUBLIC INFORMATION. Provide a Public Information (PI) professional to accomplish the work outlined in this subsection. The PI professional shall be familiar with construction schedule, progress and traffic control; be able to provide information to the general public and affected residents / businesses in the project area, closure duration and detour routes; and act as liaison between residents / businesses and construction superintendents to schedule required access to residences / businesses through areas of construction, etc. The PI professional shall participate at the Preconstruction Conference. The PI Professional shall be responsible for public interaction; preparing graphics; developing and maintaining mailing lists; supplying updated information; and all labor, equipment, postage, and materials to provide this service. The PI professional's office shall be equipped with a facsimile machine and e-mail. The PI professional shall be responsible for the following tasks for the PI Program:

1. <u>Contact Info</u>. Identify property owners of record and businesses with business hours for inclusion in the PI program notification.

- 2. <u>Initial Notice</u>. Prepare and with the Engineer's review and approval post a notice to the public in a local daily newspaper advising the public of the project boundaries including a scale map showing the project area and suggested detour routes, the project time limits, the General Contractor's name, and the need to be alert for construction signs and traffic notice, dimensioned 3" x 5" minimum, shall appear once fourteen (14) days prior to the start of work and continuously for seven (7) days beginning five (5) days before the start of work.
- 3. Mail Outs. Submit to the Engineer, for review and approval, an information mail out to be distributed, by the Contractor, to all addresses within one (1) city block on either side of the project corridor. Address the mail out to both the owner of record and current tenant. The mail outs shall also be sent to Alaska Carriers Association, Alaska Trucking Association, Alaska State Troopers, Fairbanks Police Department, Fairbanks Fire Department, Fairbanks School District, Fairbanks North Star Borough Transit, Local Emergency Medical Services, US Postal Service, Major Tour Operators. Send mail outs to all pertinent utility companies as well. Mail outs shall contain information as listed above in Weekly Information and the following:
 - a. A description of impacts to abutting property accessing the project.
 - b. The Contractor's anticipated construction schedule for the following construction phase / work segment.
 - c. Email addresses for the Contractor and Engineer.

Distribute mail outs with current/updated information two weeks before construction begins and seven (7) days prior to starting work in a new phase / work segment.

- 4. <u>Flyers.</u> Submit to the Engineer, for review and approval, informational flyers, to be distributed by the Contractor to property owner, businesses, and residents along the project corridor prior to key activities impacting their abutting properties. General project information will be similar to mail outs. Include the following specific information:
 - a. A minimum of two (2) days prior to any road closures or of driveway reconstruction affecting them, describe impacts, schedule, and specify alternate access.
- 5. <u>Public Notices</u>. Write and submit Public Information Notices as described above. The notices shall be approved by the Engineer. The PI professional shall provide information to those local media who do non-paid public service road reports or announcements prior to the start of each work segment.
- 6. <u>Public Liaison</u>. Meet with individual(s) or groups who have questions, or complaints about the project. The PI professional will write down the specific problem or question, name(s) of the individual and their telephone number. The PI will meet with the Contractor's superintendent and the Engineer to work out a solution. The PI professional will then contact the individual immediately and report the solution to them.
- 7. <u>Utility Outages</u>. Provide written notice to property owners and tenants a minimum of 24 hours prior to any utility outage.
- 8. <u>Agency Notification</u>. Notify the following Agencies at least 24 hours prior to starting any work which might inconvenience or endanger vehicular traffic. Information on project area duration and detour routes should be provided.
 - a. City Police Department
 - b. City Fire Department
 - c. State Troopers
 - d. Borough Transit
 - e. School District (if during school season)
 - f. US Postal Service

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643-4.01 METHOD OF MEASUREMENT.

1. <u>Traffic Maintenance</u>. <u>Delete and Substitute the following</u>: No measurement of quantities shall be made. Traffic Maintenance shall be Lump Sum.

Add the following:

<u>17. Public Information.</u> No measurement of quantities shall be made. Public Information shall be subsidiary.

643-5.01 BASIS OF PAYMENT. ADD the following to 1. Traffic Maintenance: Payment at the contract lump sum price shall be full compensation for furnishing all supervision, labor, materials, equipment, devices, public information, and subsidiary items necessary to implement each approved TCPs (including any or all component parts that comprise the setup), insure the safety of the traveling public, and maintain access to all businesses during construction for the project setup shown on the Plans. Traffic Maintenance Setups shall include payment for maintenance of side streets and any temporary sidewalk, pedestrian paths, and fencing to maintain access to residences, facilities and businesses and to keep pedestrians out of the work zone and to insure the safety of the pedestrians within the project setup area. Any adjustments to the approved TCPs are subsidiary. Watering for dust control directed by Engineer is also subsidiary.

All work and incidentals for publishing notices and information; all work, materials, and associated costs for preparation and distribution of mail outs or flyers; public liaison and other project related communication is subsidiary.

All work, materials, and associated costs with Public Information efforts will be subsidiary to Pay Item 643(2) Traffic Maintenance.
