WHEREAS, the proposed plan update represents public input collected and documented by the Chena Riverfront Commission members in five community meetings; and

WHEREAS, the Chena Riverfront Commission has reviewed and recommended adoption of the proposed amendments to the goals, policies, and objectives of the Chena Riverfront Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Fairbanks North Star Borough Parks and Recreation Commission reviewed and recommended approval of the proposed amendments on September 21, 2015; and

WHEREAS, on November 10, 2015, the Planning Commission held a public hearing and voted to recommend approval of the proposed amendments;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

An ordinance amending Section II, Goals, Policies and Objectives of the

Chena Riverfront Plan.

The Fairbanks North Star Borough (FNSB) Code Title 2, Section 2.37.080(B), requires that the Chena Riverfront Plan be revised "from time to time". After the Parks and Recreation Commission and Planning Commission reviews and makes recommendations for the Plan, then the proposed revisions are to be adopted by the Fairbanks City Council and the FNSB Assembly. Currently, the Plan itself calls for updates every five (5) years. However, one proposed revision to the Plan is to change the time frame to "at least every ten (10) years".

The Chena Riverfront Commission (CRFC) held several presentations to introduce the Plan updates to the public. The CRFC was the Keynote Speaker at the Chena Riverfront Summit, sponsored by the Tanana Valley Watershed Association. The proposed revisions to the Plan were presented to various community service groups. These groups include the Fairbanks Downtown Rotary, College Rotary and North Pole Rotary. An open house was held at the Noel Wien Library's Auditorium on July 9, 2014. In addition, the Plan was presented in a work session to the Fairbanks City Council on August 25, 2014.

The CRFC voted to approve all revisions to the Plan on October 8, 2014.

The Plan was presented to the Parks and Recreation Commission on September 21, 2015 for review. The Parks and Recreation Commission had no revisions and approved the Plan update. Their approved meeting minutes are attached as **Exhibit 1**.

The final draft of the Chena Riverfront Plan Update was reviewed by the Planning Commission on November 10, 2015. The Planning Commission made a recommendation of approval with no revisions (Exhibits 2 & 3).

After the Fairbanks City Council's public hearing to review and adopt the Plan, a public hearing will be scheduled before the FNSB Assembly for adoption. The proposed ordinance for the FNSB Assembly is attached as **Exhibit 4**.

Each goal statement is followed by general policy statements and specific objectives intended to carry out that goal. VALUE: Recognize and Rrestore the river as the crown jewel of the community.

OPPORTUNITIES: Develop & and integrate the river's multiple orientations to create an

integrated whole.

PARTICIPATION: Create an environment and framework that enables people to contribute to

the -riverfrontEncourage full -participation -- by the -entire -- community

participation in implementing the Chena Riverfront Plan.

ACCESS: Create and enhance physical and visual access to the river for all people.

STEWARDSHIP: Ensure that appropriate elements of public safety, protection of private

property values and river planning efforts are maintained.

VALUE

Intent

The Fairbanks community has both treated and mistreated the Chena River in several ways over the years. It is time now for Fairbanks to recognize the river as its crown jewel and to make sure it takes its rightful place as the central focus of the community.

The time has come for all area residents and visitors to do what they can to promote the health and sustainability of the Chena River the second, most productive young King Salmon (Chinook) stream in the Alaskan portion of the Yukon River.

GOAL I: RECOGNIZE AND RESTORE THE RIVER AS THE CROWN JEWEL OF THE COMMUNITY.

- 1. POLICY: Encourage the creation and maintenance of areas of natural and man-made beauty along the river corridor.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Develop voluntary riverbank management guidelines to assist property owners with erosion control and landscaping concerns.
 - B. OBJECTIVE: Implement annual litter control and river cleanup projects.
- 2. POLICY: Conserve as much as feasible the integrity of the river's natural system.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Identify and inventory important critical habitats within the river corridor.
 - B. OBJECTIVE: Create and maintain greenbelts in the watershed and river corridor.
 - C. OBJECTIVE: Consider Hhydrologic and sediment transport impacts of new bridge construction must-also-be considered.
- 3. POLICY: Evaluate and review public and private development projects in the context of how well the project meets the adopted goals and objectives of the Chena Riverfront Planincorporates the river into the project's design.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Create voluntary architectural and landscaping design guidelines for use along the river corridor.

- B. OBJECTIVE: Landscaping will be rRequired landscaping of all borough funded projects, request landscaping for all other publicly funded projects along the corridor and strongly recommended landscaping for all private commercial and industrial projects.
- 4. POLICY: Maintain riverfront residential property land use through use of consistent zoning.

5. POLICY:	Reduce pollution of the river.	
A.	OBJECTIVE:	Apply economically achievable, best available technology to mitigate the effects of invasive aquatic species such as Elodea and possible pollutants, including those borne in storm-water runoff, on the river, as well as those potentially-born in storm-water runoff and invasive aquatic species, such as Elodea.
. B.	OBJECTIVE:	Encourage riverfront property owners (public and private) to use shoreline practices that provide for
		healthy fish and wildlife habitat, such as: retaining some natural stream bank vegetation to filter
		upland run-off and reduce erosion; properly disposing yard waste by avoiding the river or riverbank;
		and minimizing upland pollutants that could wash into the river.

- 6. POLICY: Support Chena River recreational fishery and habitat improvement efforts, such as supporting river cleanup efforts; improving filtration methods for storm-water runoff and educating riverfront property owners about pollution sources.
- 7. POLICY: Enhance recreation value by encouraging incorporation of the river into the various other uses_ such as community events, recreation and fisheries.
- 8. POLICY: Update the Chena Riverfront Plan at least every ten (10) five (5) years.

OPPORTUNITIES

Intent

The intent of this goal is to take advantage of present and future opportunities as they relate to new economic investments, expanded historical/cultural awareness and recreational uses.

The Chena River presents numerous opportunities to the Fairbanks community. The Main Street Fairbanks (now called the Downtown Association) Chena Riverfront Design Workshop of 1990 representing a broad cross section of the community, identified the following three:

- 1) Economic linkages between existing developments can be strengthened. Tourism expansion can be enhanced by how we treat the river.
- 2) Historical and cultural ties to the river have been lost over the years. A sense of place developed through the river will promote Fairbanks' identity and image as a desirable place to live, visit and do business.
- 3) Opportunities to improve recreational uses exist up and down the river in both the urban and rural contexts.

GOAL II: DEVELOP AND INTEGRATE THE RIVER'S MULTIPLE ORIENTATIONS TO CREATE AN INTEGRATED WHOLE.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

- 1. **POLICY:** Encourage strategies to stimulate new private sector riverfront development.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Develop methods by which use of property tax codes can provide incentives and encouragement for riverfront property enhancements improvements.
 - B. OBJECTIVE: Use public land resources and facilities to enhance river-oriented business opportunities.
 - C. OBJECTIVE: Develop a marketing plan that centers on the river to be used in attracting new private sector investment.
 - **D. OBJECTIVE**: Expand river_related winter tourism.

- 2. POLICY: Establish The Chena Riverfront should beas a major focus of downtown core area revitalization.
- 3. POLICY: Borough funding of economic development groups may g Give strong consideration for Borough funding of economic development to those who further the economic development elements of the Chena Riverfront Plan.

HISTORICAL / CULTURAL OPPORTUNITIES

- 4. POLICY: Celebrate the river's contribution to Fairbanks history.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Develop appropriate signage for historic buildings and districts, natural features and associated points of interest within the riverfront corridor.
 - B. OBJECTIVE: Support and promote the designation and restoration of historic districts, and historic site-restorations sites, and historic buildings within the riverfront corridor.
- 5. POLICY: Support the creation and development of a native cultural center at an appropriate location.

RECREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

- 6. POLICY: Build upon and increase the recreational opportunities of the river for individual, public, and commercial purposes.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Expand winter tourism through use of a variety of creative concepts.
 - B. OBJECTIVE: Provide linkages between parks through use of greenbelts, <u>designated pathways</u> conservation easements or consistent landscaping.
- 7. POLICY: Focus existing riverfront properties such as Pioneer Park and Griffin Park toward the river.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Maintain and enhance year-round public access to the river at Griffin Park, the parkgreenspace at the FNSB administrative center, Golden Heart Plaza and additional access points in order to enhance their contributions to the Yukon Quest, the Open North American, cross country ski races, Golden Days and other river-related activities.
- 8. POLICY: Plan for both passive and active year_round recreation on the riverfront and the river.

PARTICIPATION

----Intent

The success of any plan is measured by the degree to which the plan is implemented. All aspects of the Chena Riverfront Plan must, therefore, involve people from the community. Theis goal is to-promotes and encourages formal participation by community groups and individuals in the riverfront planning process by community groups and individuals now and in the future.

GOAL III: ENCOURAGE FULL PARTICIPATION BY THE ENTIRE COMMUNITY IN IMPLEMENTING THE CHENA RIVERFRONT PLAN.

- 1. POLICY: Provide for community_wide involvement of volunteers and civic organizations in the development, improvement and implementation of existing and future riverfront projects.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Establish a volunteer database.
 - B. OBJECTIVE: Develop educational programs about the river's cultural and natural history.
 - C. OBJECTIVE: Develop a task list to implement the Plan's goals, policies and objectives.
- 2. POLICY: Encourage marketing assistance for businesses that cooperate with design and riverbank management.
- 3. POLICY: Inspire a riverfront—promotions campaign that involves some aspects of the river into various celebrations or events of all seasons.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Support ongoing growth and development of riverfront events such as ice/snow sculpting, dog mushing, canoe races, ski races and other races.
- **4. POLICY:** Develop a review procedure for the Chena Riverfront Commission to review development in the river corridor in order to determine consistency with this Pelan.
- **5. POLICY:** Provide the FNSB Planning Commission and the Fairbanks City Council with annual updates on progress and challenges in implementing the Chena Riverfront Plan.

ACCESS

Intent

Making physical connections between town and river is fundamental to any riverfront planning effort. Parks, greenways, trails, boating access points and other public lands can guarantee that people can reach the water. Landowners also can make useful connections by 1) orienting uses to the water in ways that result in a heightened awareness of river qualities, and 2) encouraging public access to and along the river through private property—to establish continuous connections for public trail systems. The reliverfront pelan does not advocate the use of eminent domain or inverse condemnation on property to achieve its goals, policies or projects and instead the Plan advocates the use of incentives, negotiated agreements and other positive inducements to implement the pelan.

GOAL IV: CREATE AND ENHANCE PHYSICAL AND VISUAL ACCESS TO THE RIVER FOR ALL PEOPLE.

- 1. POLICY: Incorporate the river into the community's daily life by increasing visual and physical access to and along the river when it is compatible with riverfront habitat sustainability.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Improve existing access points with landscaping, parking, signage, maps and seating where practical.
 - B. OBJECTIVE: Create a safe environment for public riverfront use through additional lighting, appropriate landscaping and maintenance.
 - C. OBJECTIVE: Add new <u>public</u> access points <u>to the river</u> designed to accommodate <u>public</u> use for <u>year-round</u> summer fishing and wintertime sports and recreation activities.
 - D. OBJECTIVE: Construct new paths along, above, and as close as possible to the riverbank in order to take full advantage of river views.

- E. OBJECTIVE: Enhance boat accessibility to and along the Chena River downtown and elsewhere.
- F. OBJECTIVE: Enhance trails along the riverfront.

- 5. POLICY: Refer to comprehensive road plan policies for all new transportation projects planned within the river corridor.

STEWARDSHIP

Intent

Coordinating with agencies, groups and organizations that have interest in the river is a fundamental responsibility of the Commission. Many functions are well-established and others are continually evolving. This Plan advocates for actions that will improve and sustain the riverine health of the river, without adding additional regulatory oversight. Working within existing legal and policy structures, the Plan will continue to promote the well-being of the river and its riverfront for all Borough residents.

GOAL V: ENSURE THAT APPROPRIATE ELEMENTS OF PUBLIC SAFETY, PROTECTION OF PRIVATE PROPERTY VALUES AND RIVER PLANNING EFFORTS ARE MAINTAINED.

FLOOD-PLAIN MANAGEMENT

- 1. POLICY: Support and encourage local flood-plain management efforts related to land use planning for the areas affected by the flood control project—which—should includeing riparian zone management, channel capacity, impacts to fisheries, and public awareness programs related to flood hazards.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Work proactively to pursue a plan to educate the public on harm-caused to the river by sedimentation dynamics.
 - B. OBJECTIVE: Work proactively to pursue a plan to avoid sedimentation buildup within the Chena River.
 - C. OBJECTIVE: Support pertinent local, state and federal agencies in gathering new information on the basic physical and habitat characteristics of the Chena River through cost-shared studies, such as the 1997 USGS Chena River Watershed Study for future planning purposes.

REGULATORY

2. POLICY: Support appropriate comprehensive planning and zoning to achieve development that is consistent with this plan.

- **OBJECTIVE:** Create a rational and variable river setback distance based on consideration of river erosion rates, bank stability, aesthetics and habitat.
- C. OBJECTIVE: Promote provision of a comprehensive, public source of all waterway regulations by all agencies affecting development and use within the riverfront corridor.

COORDINATEION PROACTIVELY WITH OTHER AGENCIES ON PROACTIVE EDUCATION

- 3. POLICY: Coordinate with other river-interested parties to minimize duplication of regulatory and educational effort.
 - A. OBJECTIVE: Support further development of collaborative programs to assist property owners with bank erosion control guidelines.
 - B. OBJECTIVE: In cooperation with the US Coast Guard and other enforcement agencies (including ADF&G and USFWS), create and implement a series of short courses and a signage program that address boat safety, multi-use courtesy and navigational hazards of the river.
 - C. OBJECTIVE: Work with appropriate local, state and federal agencies, and the private sector to plan for the implementation of NPDES Storm Water regulations in both urban and rural areas along the Chena River corridor.
 - D. OBJECTIVE: Support the continuation of studies on the basic physical and biological habitat of the Chena River Watershed.
 - E. OBJECTIVE: Support corrective action to increase the water flow through the Chena River Watershed, including Badger (Chena) Slough and Noves Slough.
 - F. OBJECTIVE: Coordinate closely with the Tanana Valley Watershed Association (TVWA) to enhance the progress of both the Chena Riverfront Commission and the TVWA.

61	out that goal. [SEC	TION II]This section [REPRESENTS]presents the

76	The Fairbanks commun	ity has both treated and mistreated the Chena River in
77	several ways over the ye	ears. It is time now for Fairbanks to recognize the river as
78	its crown jewel and to m	ake sure it takes its rightful place as the central focus of
79	the community. The time	e has come for all area residents and visitors to do what
80	they can to promote the	health and sustainability of the Chena River, the second-
81	most productive young	King Salmon (Chinook) stream in the Alaskan portion of
82	the Yukon River.

84	Section 4. Goal I	, 1 Policy, Objective B, is hereby amended as follows:

86	B. OBJECTIVE: Imple	ement [ANNUAL]litter control and river cleanup
87	projects.

89	Section 5. Goal I, 2 Policy, Objective A, is hereby amended as follows:
90	
91	A. OBJECTIVE: Identify and inventory [CRITICAL]important_habitats
92	within the river corridor.
93	
94	Section 6. Goal I, 2 Policy, Objective C, is hereby amended as follows:
95	
96	C. OBJECTIVE: <u>Consider</u> [HYDROLOGIC] <u>hydrologic</u> and sediment
97	transport impacts of new bridge construction[MUST ALSO BE
98	CONSIDERED].
99	
100	Section 7. Goal I, 3 Policy, is hereby amended as follows:
101	
102	3. POLICY: Evaluate and review public and private development projects
103	in the context of how well the project [INCORPORATES THE RIVER
104	INTO THE PROJECT'S DESIGN]meets the adopted goals and
105	objectives of the Chena Riverfront Plan.
106	
107	Section 8. Goal I, 3 Policy, Objective B, is hereby amended as follows:
108	
109	B. OBJECTIVE: [LANDSCAPING WILL BE REQUIRED]Require
110	landscaping of all borough funded projects, request landscaping for all
111	other publicly funded projects along the corridor and strongly
112	[RECOMMENDED] <u>recommend landscaping</u> [OF] <u>for</u> all private
113	commercial and industrial projects.
114	
115	Section 9. Goal I, 5 Policy, Objective A, is hereby amended as follows:

116	
117	A. OBJECTIVE: Apply economically achievable, best available
118	technology to mitigate the effects of invasive aquatic species, such as
119	Elodea, and possible pollutants, including those borne in storm-water
120	runoff, on the river.
121	
122	Section 10. Goal I, 5 Policy, Objective B, is hereby added as follows:
123	
124	B. OBJECTIVE: Encourage riverfront property owners (public and
125	private) to use shoreline practices that provide for healthy fish and
126	wildlife habitat, such as: retaining some natural stream bank vegetation
127	to filter upland run-off and reduce erosion; properly disposing yard
128	waste by avoiding the river or riverbank; and minimizing upland
129	pollutants that could wash into the river.
130	
131	Section 11. Goal I, 6 Policy, is hereby added as follows:
132	
133	6. POLICY: Support Chena River recreational fishery and habitat
134	improvement efforts, such as supporting river cleanup efforts;
135	improving filtration methods for storm-water runoff and educating
136	riverfront property owners about pollution sources.
137	
138	Section 12. Goal I, 8 Policy, is hereby amended as follows:
139	
140	8. POLICY: Update the Chena Riverfront Plan at least every [FIVE
141	(5)] <u>ten (10)</u> years.
142	
143	Section 13. OPPORTUNITIES Intent is hereby amended as follows:

144	
145	Intent
146	The intent of this goal is to take advantage of present and future opportunities as
147	they relate to new economic investments, expanded historical/cultural awareness
148	and recreational uses.
149	
150	The Chena River presents numerous opportunities to the Fairbanks community.
151	The Main Street Fairbanks (now called the Downtown Association) Chena
152	Riverfront Design Workshop of 1990 representing a broad cross section of the
153	community, identified the following three:
154	
155	2) Historical and cultural ties to the river have been lost over the years. A sense
156	of place developed through the river will promote Fairbanks' identity and
157	image as a desirable place to live, visit and do business.
158	
159	Section 14. Goal II, 1 Policy, Objective A, is hereby amended as follows:
160	
161	A. OBJECTIVE: Develop methods by which use of property tax codes
162	can provide incentives and encouragement for riverfront property
163	[IMPROVEMENTS]enhancements.
164	
165	Section 15. Goal II, 1 Policy, Objective B, is hereby amended as follows:
166	
167	B. OBJECTIVE: Use public land resources and facilities to enhance
168	river_oriented business opportunities.
169	
170	Section 16. Goal II, 1 Policy, Objective D, is hereby amended as follows:
171	

172	D.	OBJECTIVE: Expand river_related winter tourism.
173		
174		Section 17. Goal II, 2 Policy, is hereby amended as follows:
175		
176	2.	POLICY: Establish [THE]the Chena Riverfront [SHOULD BE]as a
177		major focus of downtown core area revitalization.
178		
179		Section 18. Goal II, 3 Policy, is hereby amended as follows:
180		
181	3.	POLICY: [BOROUGH FUNDING OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
182		GROUPS MAY GIVE]Give strong consideration for Borough funding to
183		those who further the economic development elements of the Chena
184		Riverfront Plan.
185		
186		Section 19. Goal II, 4 Policy, Objective B, is hereby amended as follows:
187		
188	B.	OBJECTIVE: Support and promote the designation and restoration of
189		historic districts, [AND]historic [SITE RESTORATIONS]sites and
190		historic buildings within the riverfront corridor.
191		
192		Section 20. Goal II, Recreation Subtitle, is hereby amended as follows:
193		
194	RE	CREATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES
195		
196		Section 21. Goal II, 6 Policy, Objective B, is hereby amended as follows:
197		

198	B. OBJECTIVE: Provide linkages between parks through use of
199	greenbelts, designated pathways, conservation easements or
200	consistent landscaping.
201	
202	Section 22. Goal II, 7 Policy, Objective A, is hereby amended as follows:
203	
204	A. OBJECTIVE: Maintain and enhance year-round public access to the
205	river at Griffin Park, the [PARK]greenspace at the FNSB administrative
206	center, Golden Heart Plaza and additional access points in order to
207	enhance their contributions to the Yukon Quest, the Open North
208	American, cross country ski races, Golden Days and other river-related
209	activities.
210	
211	Section 23. Goal II, 8 Policy, is hereby amended as follows:
212	
213	8. POLICY: Plan for both passive and active year-round recreation on
214	the riverfront and the river.
215	
216	Section 24. PARTICIPATION Intent is hereby amended as follows:
217	
218	<u>Intent</u>
219	The success of any plan is measured by the degree to which the plan is
220	implemented. All aspects of the Chena Riverfront Plan must, therefore, involve
221	people from the community. [THE]This goal [IS TO PROMOTE]promotes and
222	[ENCOURAGE]encourages formal participation by community groups and
223	individuals in the riverfront planning process [BY COMMUNITY GROUPS AND
224	INDIVIDUALS]now and in the future.
225	

226	Section 25. Goal III, 1 Policy, is hereby amended as follows:
227	
228	1. POLICY: Provide for community_wide involvement of volunteers and
229	civic organizations in the development, improvement and
230	implementation of existing and future riverfront projects.
231	
232	Section 26. Goal III, 3 Policy, is hereby amended as follows:
233	
234	3. POLICY: Inspire a riverfront-promotions campaign that involves some
235	aspects of the river into various celebrations or events of all seasons.
236	
237	Section 27. Goal III, 4 Policy, is hereby amended as follows:
238	
239	4. POLICY: Develop a review procedure for the Chena Riverfront
240	Commission to review development in the river corridor in order to
241	determine consistency with this [PLAN]Plan.
242	
243	Section 28. ACCESS Intent is hereby amended as follows:
244	
245	<u>Intent</u>
246	Making physical connections between town and river is fundamental to any
247	riverfront planning effort. Parks, greenways, trails, boating access points and
248	other public lands can guarantee that people can reach the water. Landowners
249	also can make useful connections by 1) orienting uses to the water in ways tha
250	result in a heightened awareness of river qualities, and 2) encouraging public
251	access to and along the river [THROUGH PRIVATE PROPERTY]to establish
252	continuous connections for public trail systems. The [RIVERFRONT]Riverfron
253	[PLAN]Plan does not advocate the use of eminent domain or inverse

234	condennation on property to achieve its goals, policies or projects and, instead,
255	the Plan advocates the use of incentives, negotiated agreements and other
256	positive inducements to implement the [PLAN]Plan.
257	
258	Section 29. Goal IV, 1 Policy, Objective C, is hereby amended as follows:
259	
260	C. OBJECTIVE: Add new public access points to the river designed to
261	accommodate [SUMMER FISHING AND WINTERTIME SPORTS AND
262	RECREATION]public use for year-round activities.
263	
264	Section 30. Goal IV, 2 Policy, Objective A, is hereby amended as follows:
265	
266	A. OBJECTIVE: Provide for and encourage multi-modal transportation
267	options, such as boat launches, canoe/kayak launch sites and river
268	marina.
269	
270	Section 31. Goal IV, 2 Policy, Objective B, is hereby amended as follows:
271	
272	B. OBJECTIVE: Develop year_round transportation and design linkages
273	that will serve and connect riverfront attractions to other nearby
274	attractions with emphasis on the downtown core area.
275	
276	Section 32. Goal IV, 2 Policy, Objective E, is hereby amended as follows:
277	
278	E. OBJECTIVE: Support beneficial projects that [WILL]utilize waste heat
279	from the [CHENA RIVER]Aurora power plant.
280	
281	Section 33. Goal IV, 2 Policy, Objective G, is hereby amended as follows:

282	
283	G. OBJECTIVE: Work to enhance the connection between [RIVER
284	CORRIDOR FROM]Pioneer Park [TO]and_downtown_along the river
285	<u>corridor</u> .
286	
287	Section 34. Goal IV, 3 Policy, Objective C, is hereby amended as follows:
288	
289	C. OBJECTIVE: Support public events scheduled along roadways
290	adjacent to the river, including events that involve pedestrian-only
291	roadway use.
292	
293	Section 35. Goal V, STEWARDSHIP is hereby amended as follows:
294	
295	<u>Intent</u>
296	Coordinating with agencies, groups and organizations that have interest in the
297	river is a fundamental responsibility of the Commission. Many functions are well-
298	established and others are continually evolving. This Plan advocates for actions
299	that will improve and sustain the riverine health of the river, without adding
300	additional regulatory oversight. Working within existing legal and policy
301	structures, the Plan will continue to promote the well-being of the river and its
302	riverfront for all Borough residents.
303	
304	Section 36. Goal V, 1 Policy, is hereby amended as follows:
305	
306	1. POLICY: Support and encourage local flood-plain management efforts
307	related to land use planning for the areas affected by the flood control

project, [WHICH SHOULD INCLUDE]including riparian

zone

309	management, channel capacity, impacts to fisheries, and public		
310	awareness programs related to flood hazards.		
311			
312	Section 37. Goal V, 1 Policy, Objective A, is hereby amended as follows:		
313			
314	A. OBJECTIVE: Work proactively to pursue a plan to educate the public		
315	on [HARM CAUSED TO THE]river [BY]sedimentation dynamics.		
316			
317	Section 38. Goal V, COORDINATION WITH OTHER AGENCIES ON		
318	EDUCATION Subtitle, is hereby amended as follows:		
319			
320	[COORDINATION]COORDINATE PROACTIVELY WITH OTHER AGENCIES		
321	ON [PROACTIVE]EDUCATION		
322			
323	Section 39. Goal V, 3 Policy, Objective E, is hereby amended as follows:		
324			
325	E. OBJECTIVE: Support corrective action to increase the water flow		
326	through the Chena River Watershed, including Badger (Chena) Slough		
327	and Noyes Slough.		
328			
329	Section 40. Effective date. This ordinance shall be effective at 5:00 p.m.		
330	on the first borough business day following its adoption.
